Fostering & Serving Unity and Missionary Spirit – Pastoral Letter of His Beatitude Sviatoslav

O Lord Jesus Christ, our Good Shepherd, as you once gathered lost sheep that they might hear Your voice and be your flock, so also today graciously look down from heaven upon our parish community, and send down on it your Holy Spirit, that it might be a place to receive the joy of Your Good News.

Strengthen us with your presence, and always gather us together in prayer. Grant us the spirit of serving others, so that in our parish all might encounter You, the merciful God. Bless our spiritual leaders with Your wisdom, and inspire us to generously give of our time, talents and treasure for the building up of Your Kingdom. Unite us in peace and harmony, as befits Your community of love. Instill in us a missionary spirit, and let our parish community shine with the light of the Gospel, with prayer and good works, inviting all to share in the divine life, so that Your Name, O Saviour, may be praised, together with Your eternal Father, and your most-holy, good and life-giving Spirit. Amen.

On September 8th, we celebrated a very special day in the life of our church, the Birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Theotokos/ Mother of God. Mary is called Blessed because she was specially chosen from all the women who ever lived to fulfil a very special plan that God was about to make known. "His incarnation," God living in the World as Flesh. Now the incarnation required an earthly mother. But who was worthy of such a calling?

God went to prepare "the perfect earthly dwelling" for His Only Begotten Son's entry into this earthly world. But in the end it was Mary's YES, a reply that was given freely and of her own accord that allowed God's salvific plan to be realised.

Liturgical Propers:

Troparion (Tone 5): Let us the faithful acclaim and worship the Word, co-eternal with the Father and the Spirit, and born of the Virgin for our salvation. For He willed to be lifted up on the cross in the flesh, to suffer death and to raise the dead by His glorious resurrection.

Troparion (Tone 4): Your nativity, O Virgin Mother of God, has made joy known to all the world, for from you dawned the Sun of Righteousness, Christ our God. He abolished the curse and gave the blessing; and by making death of no effect He bestowed on us eternal life.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.

Kontakion (Tone 8): When You rose from the tomb, You also raised the dead and resurrected Adam. Eve exults in Your resurrection, and the ends of the world celebrate Your rising from the dead, O most merciful One.

Now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Theotokion (Tone 4): By your birth, O immaculate one, Joachim and Anna were freed from the reproach of childlessness, and Adam and Eve from the corruption of death. And your people, redeemed from the guilt of their sins, celebrate as they cry out to you: “The barren one gives birth to the Mother of God and nourisher of our life.”



Prokimenon (Tone 6): Save Your people, O Lord, and bless Your inheritance (Ps 27:9).

Verse: Unto You I will cry, O Lord my God, lest You turn from me in silence (Ps 27:1).

Prokimenon (Tone 3): My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit has rejoiced in God my Saviour (Lk 1:46-47).

Epistle: *A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Galatians:* (Gal. 6:11-18)

Brethren, see, I write to you in my own large handwriting! Those who are trying to force you to be circumcised are making a play for human approval – with an eye to escaping persecution for the cross of Christ. The very ones who accept circumcision do not follow the law of Christ. The very ones who accept circumcision do not follow the law themselves. They want to be circumcised only that they may boast about your bodily observance.

May I never boast of anything but the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ! Through it, the world has been crucified to me and I to the world. It means nothing whether one is circumcised or not. All that matters is that one is created anew. Peace and mercy on all who follow this rule of life, and on the Israel of God. Henceforth, let no man trouble me, for I bear the brand marks of Jesus in my body. Brethren, may the favor of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit. Amen.

Alleluia (Tone 1): I have exalted one chosen from among My people; with My holy oil I have anointed him (Ps 88:20-21). Indeed, My hand shall sustain him, and my arm shall make him strong (Ps 88:22). Hear, O daughter, and see, and incline your ear (Ps 44:11).

Gospel: (John 3:13-17)

The Lord said: “No one has gone up to heaven except the One who came down from there – the Son of Man (who is in heaven). Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that all who believe may have eternal life in him. Yes, God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him may not die but may have eternal life. God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him.

Instead of “Dostoino/It is truly”: O my soul, magnify the Virgin Mary, born from a barren womb. Virginitly is alien to mothers and childbearing is foreign to virgins; yet in you, O Mother of God, both of them came together. Therefore we and all the nations of the earth without ceasing magnify you.

Communion Verse: Praise the Lord from the heavens; praise Him in the highest (Ps 148:1). **Alleluia!** (3x)

Our Eparch, Bishop Ken is requesting that at the conclusion of every Divine Liturgy we say an additional prayer for Peace in Ukraine until the end of the war. For peace in Ukraine, let us pray: Our Father ... Hail Mary ... Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Прокімен (глас 6): Спаси, Господи, людей Твоїх* і благослови спадкоємство Твоє (Пс. 27,9).

Стих: До Тебе, Господи, взиватиму; Боже мій, не відвертайсь мовчки від мене (Пс. 27,1).

Прокімен (глас 3): Величає душа моя Господа* і возрадувався дух мій у Бозі, Спасі моїм. (Лк 1, 46-47).

Бог бо так полюбив світ, що Сина свого Єдинородного дав, щоб кожен, хто вірує в нього, не загинув, а жив життям вічним. Бо не послав Бог у світ Сина світ засудити, лише ним – світ спасти”.

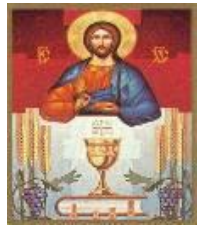

WHY CATHOLICS ARE LEAVING THE FAITH BY AGE 10 – AND WHAT PARENTS CAN DO ABOUT IT?



Young Catholics are leaving the faith at an early age – sometimes before the age of 10 – and their reasons are deeper than being “bored at Mass,” the author of a new report claims.

“Those that are leaving for no religion – and a pretty big component of them saying they are atheist or agnostic – it turns out that when you probe a bit more deeply and you allow them to talk in their own words, that they are bringing up things that are related to science and a need for evidence and a need for proof,” said Dr. Mark Gray, a senior research associate at the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate at Georgetown University.

“It’s almost a crisis in faith,” he told CNA. “In the whole concept of faith, this is a generation that is struggling with faith in ways that we haven’t seen in previous generations.”

Gray recently published the results of two national studies by CARA – which conducts social science research about the Church -- in the publication *Our Sunday Visitor*. One of the surveys was of those who were raised Catholic but no longer identified as Catholic, ages 15 to 25. The second survey was of self-identified Catholics age 18 and over.

In exploring why young Catholics were choosing to leave the faith, he noted “an emerging profile” of youth who say they find the faith “incompatible with what they are learning in high school or at the university level.” In a perceived battle between the Catholic Church and science, the Church is losing.

And it is losing Catholics at a young age. “The interviews with youth and young adults who had left the Catholic Faith revealed that the typical age for this decision to leave was made at 13,” Gray wrote. “Nearly two-thirds of those surveyed, 63 percent, said they stopped being Catholic between the ages of 10 and 17. Another 23 percent say they left the Faith before the age of 10.”

Of those who had left the faith, “only 13 percent said they were ever likely to return to the Catholic Church,” Gray wrote. And “absent any big changes in their life,” he said to CNA, they “are probably not coming back.”

The most common reason given for leaving the Catholic faith, by one in five respondents, was they stopped believing in God or religion. This was evidence of a “desire among some of them for proof, for evidence of what they’re learning about their religion and about God,” Gray said.

It’s a trend in the popular culture to see atheism as “smart” and the faith as “a fairy tale,” he said.

“And I think the Church needs to come to terms with this as an issue of popular culture,” he continued. “I think the Church perhaps needs to better address its history and its relationship to science.”

One reason for this might be the compartmentalization of faith and education, where youth may go to Mass once a week but spend the rest of their week learning how the faith is “dumb,” he noted.

In contrast, if students are taught evolution and the Big Bang theory at the same school where they learn religion, and they are taught by people with religious convictions, then “you’re kind of shown that there’s not conflicts between those, and you understand the Church and Church history and its relationship to science,” he said.

With previous generations who learned about both faith and science as part of a curriculum, that education “helped them a lot in dealing with these bigger questions,” he explained, “and not seeing conflict between religion and science.”

Fr. Matthew Schneider, LC, who worked in youth ministry for four years, emphasized that faith and science must be presented to young people in harmony with each other.

A challenge, he explained, is teaching how “faith and science relate” through philosophy and theology. While science deals only with “what is observable and measurable,” he said, “the world needs something non-physical as its origin, and that’s how to understand God along with science.”

“It was the Christian faith that was the birthplace of science,” he continued. “There’s not a contradiction” between faith and science, “but it’s understanding each one in their own realms.”

How can parents raise their children to stay in the faith? Fr. Schneider cited research by Christian Smith, a professor of sociology at the University of Notre Dame, who concluded that a combination of three factors produces an 80 percent retention rate among young Catholics.

If they have a “weekly activity” like catechesis, Bible study or youth group; if they have adults at the parish who are not their parents and who they can talk to about the faith; and if they have “deep spiritual experiences,” they have a much higher likelihood of remaining Catholic, Fr. Schneider said.

More parents need to be aware of their children’s’ beliefs, Dr. Gray noted, as many parents don’t even know that their children may not profess to be Catholic.

The Church is “very open” to science, he emphasized, noting the affiliation of non-Catholic scientists with the Pontifical Academy of Science, including physicist Stephen Hawking.

There is “no real conflict” between faith and science, Gray said.

“The Church has been steadily balancing matters of faith and reason since St. Augustine’s work in the fifth century,” he wrote.

“Yet, the Church has a chance to keep more of the young Catholics being baptized now if it can do more to correct the historical myths about the Church in regards to science,” he added, “and continue to highlight its support for the sciences, which were, for the most part, an initial product of the work done in Catholic universities hundreds of years ago.”

25 Years of the Ukrainian Catholic University in Ukraine: Opening of the Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky Center

The new academic year at the Ukrainian Catholic University will start with the culmination of the university’s seven-year Comprehensive Campaign. From 9 to 14 September, events will take place at UCU which residents and guests of the city will be able to attend. The Celebration Week program includes a concert at the Opera Theater, a pilgrimage to spiritual centers of Halychyna, a series of lectures and discussions, the conference TEDxUCU, and a meeting with graduates of the Lviv Theological Academy, UCU, and the UCU Lviv Business School. The week begins with the consecration and opening of the Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky Center.



“Our September celebration days are days of gratitude to God, the Church, the entire Ukrainian community and non-Ukrainian friends of UCU for the great blessings which have poured forth onto the university over the last seven years. With the systematic support of tens of thousands of benefactors, the university has doubled the number of programs and students, tripled the number of buildings, and played a role in the processes of transforming Ukrainian society, in particular, during the Revolution of Dignity and for higher education. On the facade of UCU in Rome, Patriarch Josyf Slipyj decided to write: ‘Love of learning will gather in those scattered.’ We are ‘a gathering of the scattered’ and will experience this during the celebrations. We’re pleased that representatives of the wide Friends of UCU network (20 cities of the world have Friends of UCU committees) will come to our celebrations from various parts of Ukraine and many countries and continents,” explains UCU President Bishop Borys Gudziak.

As part of the ceremonies, there will be a festive banquet of gratitude with the participation of UGCC Patriarch Sviatoslav Shevchuk and members of the Synod of Bishops, and benefactors and friends of UCU from the whole world. The honored speaker will be the Mayor of Wrocław, Poland, Rafał Dutkiewicz.

10 September begins with a Pontifical Liturgy. This will be followed by the order of consecration and the opening of the Metropolitan Sheptytsky Center. The main benefactors of this center, James Temerty and his wife, Louise, will be special guests. Also, on the premises guests will be able to visit an interactive exhibit dedicated to Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky.

“The legacy of Metropolitan Andrey is very important for the university, and so the central place of meeting and forum for discussion, not only for the university but for the city, as they often say today ‘the hub,’ will bear the name of Metropolitan Andrey, In this way, we are trying to keep the memory of the Metropolitan alive,” notes the President of UCU.

The ceremonial event “Here God’s Blessings Flow,” a production of noted director Serhii Proskurnia, will be held at the Opera Theater the evening of 10 September. Taking part in the staged event will be noted groups like the Pikardiiska Tertsia, Komu Vnyz, the Telniuk Sisters, Lviv’s Dudaryk State Academic Men’s Choir, and others. The author of the texts is Mariana Savka. During the event, the entire history of the Kyivan Church will be presented to the viewer: from the Baptism of Kyivan Rus to today, and each person present will be able to feel a part of the 1000-year history of our Church.

On 11 and 12 September, the organizers will allow guests to feel like students of the university, spending time in classrooms with professors. “We are preparing a series of public events: lectures, discussions, master-classes. We invite guests to choose interesting topics from the list, the best way to feel the university ‘from inside,’” says UCU’s Vice-Rector for Communication and Development, Natalia Klymovska.

On 13 September, UCU’s celebrations coincide with the start of the academic year, which at UCU happens on the first day of the church’s liturgical year, the Indict. One of the important elements of the celebrations is the ceremony of awarding scholarships to students from various faculties.

During these days we will also symbolically celebrate 25 years of UCU in Ukraine. For in September 1992, with the blessing of His Beatitude Myroslav Ivan Lubachivsky, the first session of the group involved with the revival of the Theological Academy in Lviv and the transfer of UCU from Rome to Ukraine was held. And this is the symbolic start of UCU, which only after 10 years was finally inaugurated as a university. We are very grateful to Cardinal Lubachivsky of blessed memory for his initiative and constant and clear support.

“These celebrations are also a time for deeper reflection. Completing the first quarter of a century of development in Ukraine, after the university’s fast trajectory of recent years, it is important to secure the beginnings of the initiative, to preserve its Christian undertakings and the quality of all its programs. An understanding of our history is necessary for new teachers and students, who during the time of the celebration will have an opportunity to better understand the path we’ve taken, our pilgrimage together. This path was winding but, at the same time, sacramental and full of miracles. It shows that in Ukraine good deeds are possible and that civil society, people of good will who trust in the Lord, even without the particular support of the government, can do very much,” Bishop Borys is convinced.
