THE VIBRANT PARISH - A PLACE TO ENCOUNTER THE LIVING CHRIST: Through the Word, the Holy Mysteries & Prayer, Serving One's Neighbour, Leadership, Fostering & Serving Unity and Missionary Spirit – Pastoral Letter

of His Beatitude Sviatoslav

In today's Gospel reading Our Lord Jesus Christ commands His disciples to become fishers of men – to do the work of evangelisation, - to proclaim the Gospel to all.

Saint John Chrysostom notes on this particular Gospel passage, "The fish, when they are caught, are transported from life to death, but men from death to life." Christian evangelization is not done to devour the catch, nor to make a profit from the catch, nor to feed the fishermen. We are to catch people to give them all the benefits of God's grace and to bring them into the Kingdom of Heaven. We are to catch them to benefit them as we have been benefitted. In this context, two sayings of Jesus Christ come to mind: "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you" (John 5:12) and "You received without paying, give without pay" (Matthew 10:8).


In the writings of the Holy Fathers we find this advice for those considering undertaking evangelism: "If you would talk to others concerning eternal life, be ready to show you are willing to suffer for the word, speak humbly with repentance, weeping for your own sins, and choosing carefully with whom you speak: a person who is willing not just to listen but to do the word. If you do not do these things, then it is better not to speak at all, lest you die and depart without profit from the words with which you hoped

to vivify others. Remember, God is going to ask any sinners who quote Him, "who are you to speak the words of my covenant which are written in the Scriptures?" (a lesson from THE PARADISE OF THE FATHERS)

Today's gospel reading tells us story about the calling of the first disciples. We can close our eyes and imagine Peter, Andrew, James and John in a "comfort zone", a zone which connotes a sense of satisfaction, of *being at home*. We sense that they are content to be fishermen, enjoying the peace and regularity of their daily routine. Yet when Jesus comes along proclaiming the Good News that the kingdom of God is at hand, they leave their comfort zones as well as their nets and all possesions just to follow Him.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ, perhaps, today's Gospel is proclaimed to stretch us from our comfort zones. Through these words of Matthew, God may be asking us to leave the routines we're used to – in some way analogous to leaving our nets. The move may be as simple as volunteering for some charitable cause we may never have thought of before – or it might be as dramatic as a radical change in our life style. As Christians we believe that we are each called by name to conversion whether it is simple or whether it is earth-shattering.

However, we are called – and to whatever we are called – as we continue this celebration of our Eucharist - Thanksgiving, we pray for the faith and courage to follow that unique, personal and communal call today in 2018 to believe in the Good News/the Gospel as these fishermen so obviously did two thousand years ago.

Text from "The Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom: An Anthology for Worship"; Pg. 329

Troparion (tone 1): Though the stone was sealed by the Jews and soldiers guarded Your most pure body, You arose, O Savior, on the third day, and gave life to the world. And so the heavenly powers cried out to You, O Giver of life: Glory to Your resurrection, O Christ! Glory to Your kingdom! Glory to Your saving plan, O only Lover of Mankind. *Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.*

Kontakion (tone 1): You arose in glory from the tomb and with Yourself You raised the world. All humanity acclaims You as God, and death has vanished. Adam exults, O Master, and Eve, redeemed from bondage now, cries out for joy: "You are the One, O Christ, Who offer resurrection to all."

Now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Theotokion (tone 1): When Gabriel uttered to you, O Virgin, his 'Rejoice!' – at that sound the Master of all became flesh in you, the Holy Ark. As the just David said, you have become wider than the heavens carrying your Creator. Glory to Him Who dwelt in you! Glory to Him Who came forth from you! Glory to Him Who freed us through birth from you!

Epistle: A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Romans (Rm. 2:10-16)

Brethren: there will be glory, honour, and peace for everyone who has done good, likewise the Jew first, then the Greek. With God there is no favouritism.

Sinners who do not have the law will perish without reference to it; sinners bound by the law will be judged in accordance with it. For it is not those who hear the law who are just in sight of God; it is those who keep it who will be declared just. When Gentiles who do not have the law keep it as by instinct, these men although without the law serve as a law for themselves. They show that the demands of the law are written in their hearts. Their conscience bears witness together with that law, and their thoughts will accuse or defend them on the day when, in accordance with the gospel I preach, God will pass judgment on the secrets of men through Christ Jesus.

Alleluia: God gives me vindication, and has subdued peoples under me (*Ps. 17:48*). Making great the salvation of the king, and showing mercy to His anointed, to David, and to His posterity for ever (*Ps. 17:51*).


Gospel: (Matthew 4:18-23)

At that time, as Jesus was walking along the Sea of Galilee he watched two brothers, Simon now known as Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea. They were fishermen. He said to them, "Come after me and I will make you fishers of men." They immediately abandoned their nets and became his followers.

He walked along farther and caught sight of two other brothers, James, Zabedee's son, and his brother John. They too were in their boat, getting their nets in order with their father, Zabedee. He called them, and immediately they abandoned boat and father to follow him. Jesus toured all of Galilee. He taught in their synagogues, proclaimed the good news of the kingdom, and cured the people of every disease and illness.

Communion Verse: Praise the Lord from the heavens; praise Him in the highest (Ps. 148:1). Alleluia! (x3)

Our Eparch, Bishop Ken is requesting that at the conclusion of every Divine Liturgy we say an additional prayer for Peace in Ukraine until the end of the war. For peace in Ukraine, let us pray: Our Father ... Hail Mary ... Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.

• **Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion**: You are a member of the Catholic Church (faithful of the Orthodox churches are very welcome to receive Holy Communion); 2) You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; 3) You attend Divine Services regularly; 4) Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; 5) You have kept the Liturgical fast – no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). 6) You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel. 7) To the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace. If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.



Pope summons oil execs to Vatican to talk climate change

Pope Francis will meet with some of the world's oil executives next week, likely to give them another moral nudge to clean up their act on global warming.

Climate change policy and science experts are cautiously hopeful, but aren't expecting any miracles or even noticeable changes.

The conference will be a follow-up to the pope's encyclical three years ago calling on people to save the planet from climate change and other environmental ills, Vatican spokesman Greg Burke confirmed Friday.

Cardinal Peter Turkson, who spearheaded the encyclical, set up the June 8-9 conference with the executives. The pope himself will speak to the leaders on the second day of the summit, organized with the University of Notre Dame, Burke said.

Officials at the Vatican and Notre Dame would not disclose who is coming. BP, however, confirmed that its CEO Robert Dudley plans to attend, and Exxon Mobil said CEO Darren Woods would be there. Woods said this week that his company is trying to balance the risks of climate change with growing demand for energy to raise living standards in the developing world.

Michael Oppenheimer, a professor of geosciences and international affairs at Princeton University, said he doubts anything "measurable" will come out of the conference, but he was nevertheless hopeful.

Oil companies have talked about fighting climate change, but they haven't done much beyond talk, said MIT management professor John Sterman.

The pope offers "moral persuasion," but if it is just a photo opportunity for oil executives to show off "it doesn't mean anything and in fact it's just PR to help oil companies burnish up their image while they continue to delay actions," Sterman said.

Jerry Taylor, president of the Washington libertarian-oriented think-tank Niskanen Center, said he figures the oil executives will tell the pope they're willing to accept action, such as a tax on heat-trapping carbon dioxide emissions.

"But what is needed is for these oil majors to tell Republican lawmakers of their concern and support for action, not the pope. And this they have not done in any focused, sustained, or meaningful way," Taylor said in an email. That's where, he said, the pontiff needs to push them farther on the morality of what they're doing, he said.

Dana Fisher, a sociologist who studies environmentalism at the University of Maryland, said the pope is cementing his leadership on climate.

"He certainly is trying to lead for the planet, and lord knows we need it," she said.

Gary Yohe, an economics and environment professor at Wesleyan University in Connecticut, said the executives might feel compelled to listen to the spiritual leader of nearly 1.3 billion Catholics.

"This is not somebody you can ignore," Yohe said. "It might be a come-to-Jesus moment for them."

His Beatitude Sviatoslav, the Father and Head of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church, on Sunday, February 17, during the live broadcast of the Open Church program on Live TV, shared a moving story about a little Ukrainian and his communication with the Pope Francis.

"I will tell you a story of a little Danylko. This boy first visited an audience with the Holy Father several years ago. He was holding a children's painting depicting the Cathedral of St. Sophia in his hands. There is even a photo showing how the Holy Father is embracing him. Then the Bishop of Rome asked him what he had painted and the boy answered: "This is our church in Rome. Please come to visit us!" And the Holy Father gave him to know that he accepts the invitation. So the boy was convinced that the Pope had arrived at our Cathedral because of his invitation," said the Primate of the UGCC with a smile.

According to him, this boy has been living in Italy for several years, fighting a serious illness. However, he does not lose hope. "And when I was listening to them talking," said the His Beatitude Sviatoslav, "the boy said to the Pope the following words: 'Thank you that you have come. Please pray for Ukraine. You know how a mother suffers when her son has been killed?"

The Primate of the UGCC said that the Pope was deeply touched with the boy's words. He promised to the boy that he would definitely pray for the mothers of Ukraine. Without hesitation, the boy said to the Holy Father: "Please visit Ukraine, will you? I am inviting you."

Next day, when our priests asked the boy about this meeting, he told everyone that he is sure the Pope will come to Ukraine because he knows how to keep his promises.

"We, too, hope this will happen soon. Children are saying that such a visit will for sure take place. We are looking forward to it!" emphasized the Primate of the UGCC.
