**Tone 6**, text from book *“The Divine Liturgy of Saint John Chrysostom”*; pages 101-103



**Epistle:** *A reading from the Second Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians: (2 Cor. 4:6-15)*

*Brethers and Sisters, God, who said, “Let light shine out of darkness,” has shone in our hearts, that we in turn might make known the glory of God shining on the face of Christ. This treasure we possess in earthen vessels to make it clear that its surpassing power comes from God and not from us. We are afflicted in every way possible, but we are not crushed; full of doubts, we never despair. We are persecuted but never abandoned; we are struck down but never destroyed. Continually we carry about in our bodies the dying of Jesus, so that in our bodies the life of Jesus may also be revealed. While we live we are constantly being delivered to death for Jesus’ sake, so that the life of Jesus may be revealed in our mortal flesh. Death is at work in us, but life in you. We have that spirit of faith of which the Scripture says, “Because I believed, I spoke out.” We believe and so we speak, knowing that he who raised up the Lord Jesus will raise us up along with Jesus and place both us and you in his presence. Indeed, everything is ordered to your benefit, so that the grace bestowed in abundance may bring greater glory to God because they who give thanks are many.*



**Gospel:** *(Matthew 22:35-46)*

At that time a certain lawyer asked Jesus, “Teacher, which commandment of the law is the greatest?” Jesus said to him, “You shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart, with your whole soul, and with all your mind.’ This is the greatest and first commandment. The second is like it: ‘You shall love your neighbor as yourself.’ On these two commandments the whole law is based, and the prophets as well.” In turn Jesus put a question to the assembled Pharisees, “What is your opinion about the Messiah? Whose son is he?” “David’s,” they answered. He said to them, “Then how is it that David under the Spirit’s influence calls him ‘Lord,’ as he does: ‘The Lord said to my Lord, sit at my right hand, until I humble your enemies beneath your feet’? If David calls him ‘Lord,’ how can he be his son?” No one could give him an answer; therefore no one dared, from that day on, to ask him any questions.

***Our Eparch, Bishop Ken is requesting that at the conclusion of every Divine Liturgy we say an additional prayer for Peace in Ukraine until the end of the war. For peace in Ukraine, let us pray: Our Father ... Hail Mary ... Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.***

❖ **Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion:** You are a member of the Catholic Church (faithful of the Orthodox churches are very welcome to receive Holy Communion); 2) You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; 3) You attend Divine Services regularly; 4) Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; 5) You have kept the Liturgical fast – no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). 6) You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel. 7) To the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace. *If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.*

**TODAY'S GOSPEL REFLECTION**

**Today's Gospel summarises our whole Christian faith: 'Love God and love your neighbour as yourself'. Unfortunately, we are so accustomed to hearing these words that we sometimes forget what they really mean. In fact, in order to love God, only two things are necessary:**

**First of all, we must believe in God, Who is the Creator of all things visible and invisible. It is no use believing in a god who is just a convenient idea, on whom we can peg responsibilities or blame, as it pleases us. It is very common nowadays to hear: 'We all have the same god'. These words are quite untrue. There are some people for whom god is an alcohol, drugs, cigars, cars and homes, pleaseres, money and fancy life; for others their idol is a pop star, a football team, gambling, TV or internet. Thus, it approves that people have different gods - idols.**

**Secondly, we have to believe in God, Who is Love. The Christian God is God in Three Persons, Who love each other, a perfect unity in diversity. The Christian God is He, Who sent His Only-Begotten Son Jesus Christ into our Earthly World. In an act of self-giving/self-sacrificial love Messiah gave up His life out of compassion for all humankind.**

**When a lawyer asked Jesus what the greatest commandment was. He answered by saying, "Love the Lord God with all your heart, with all your mind and with all your soul." He continued, "And the 2<sup>nd</sup> greatest commandment is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself." All the Bible's teachings depend on all this.**

**What does it mean to love yourself? Does your body love your soul? Does your foot or hand love your mind? The Church Fathers inherited from the Apostles the understanding that loving your neighbor as yourself is technically loving your neighbor as being yourself or being like yourself. We are all made by God and standing before God and sharing the same human life. The standard is loving God's image and likeness, which we, people, are all created in.**

**It always starts with God, so that you love yourself by loving others, even to the point of self-sacrifice and self-denial. Instead of worshiping yourself, we should be sharing ourselves with the others which is the heavenly, dignifying standard of loving your neighbor as yourself!**

## Ukrainian Jerusalem blessed in Zarvanytsia

On August 27<sup>th</sup>, Patriarch of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church Svyatoslav (Shevchuk) blessed the unique complex dubbed Ukrainian Jerusalem at the Marian Spiritual Center of Zarvanytsia. The worship was attended by the Custos of the Holy Land, Frt Francesco Patton, OMF, who brought a stone from the Holy Sepulcher. The holy relics will be built into a copy of the building in Zarvanytsia.

According to the Department of Information of the UGCC, His Beatitude Svyatoslav greeted the assembly

of archbishops of the UGCC, led by Archbishop and Metropolitan Vasyl (Semenyuk) of Ternopil and Zboriv, about a hundred priests and a large number of faithful.

At first, everyone attended the Cathedral of the Mother of God of Zarvanytsia where the prayer service to the Holy Theotokos was performed before the wonderworking icon. Then the procession under the majestic sound of the bells took to the top of the hill past the station of the Cross Road, to the place of blessing.

Construction of a unique complex of religious buildings of the Holy Land began in the summer of 2014. During this time, the professionals were able to reproduce a copy of the Holy Sepulcher, the Calvary, the mountain on which Jesus Christ was crucified, the olive garden where Jesus prayed before His arrest, the Stairs of Repentance (Holy Stairs) which Jesus Christ ascended on His way to Pilate's trial; the pool of Bethesda where He healed the sick, the Lion (Lions) Gate, and the Tower of David.

### **Cardinal shares message of ‘Laudato Si’ at Ghana World Youth Day event**

ACCRA, Ghana - A top Vatican official urged young people at a local World Youth Day gathering to protect the planet and actively live the teachings of Pope Francis's encyclical on the environment.

Expressing concern for the accelerating degradation of Earth, Cardinal Peter Turkson, prefect of the Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development, told 3,000 Ghanaians Aug. 5 to learn, know and spread the message of the 2015 papal teaching.

Turkson returned to his native Ghana for the country's fourth local observance of World Youth Day. The event allowed young people unable to travel to the Catholic Church's global World Youth Day in January in Panama to gather in their homeland for a celebration.

Emphasizing that Earth is like a mother to humans, Turkson called for deeper respect and more concrete steps to protect the planet during the event's closing ceremony. He also appealed for greater attention to the needs of poor and disadvantaged people.

The cardinal also addressed the importance of the need to change lifestyles to reduce environmental abuse. He noted that Francis acknowledges that environmental awareness is growing as the world better understands the impact of the damage being done to Earth and all life on the planet.

The pope, he said, remains hopeful about the possibility of reversing the trend of environmental abuse as people adopt the encyclical's teachings.

The cardinal explained to the young Ghanaians that the full title of the encyclical, *Laudato Si', On Care for Our Common Home*, was inspired by the invocation of St. Francis of Assisi, "Praise be to you my Lord," in his Canticum of the Creatures.

Climate change, he said, is a growing concern because it affects everyone and that the well-being of future generations is at stake.

He noted that scientific consensus holds that human activities have led to global warming, which has caused climates to change as shown through now unpredictable rainfall patterns, the extinction of some plant and animal species and the disappearance of islands and atolls under rising seas.

To save the earth and environment from destruction, he called for an end to the felling of trees at current rates. He also advocated for the reintroduction of the Arbor Day celebration in Ghana and elsewhere to encourage the planting of trees.

### **Use internet to promote tourism that respects environment, Vatican says**

ROME - With more and more people planning their vacations online and sharing their experiences digitally, the tourism industry and tourists themselves should pay more attention to using online forums to encourage respect for the locales visited and for the communities that live there, the Vatican said.

In a message for the Sept. 27 celebration of World Tourism Day, Cardinal Peter Turkson, prefect of the Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development, said the "digital transformation" of tourism has the potential for promoting happier and healthier vacations that do more to protect the natural environment and promote authentic encounters between people.

The cardinal's message was released by the Vatican Aug. 4. For the 2018 celebration of the day, the World Tourism Organization is focusing on the industry's digital transformation. The cardinal's message

noted how digital technology is “dramatically changing the way we live periods of rest, vacation, mobility and tourism in all its forms.”

Digital innovation, Turkson wrote, should have the aim of “promoting inclusiveness, increasing the engagement of people and local communities and achieving an intelligent and equitable management of resources.”

The growing use of online resources and comments can increase the quality of services, but also can “educate people on the shared responsibility toward our ‘common home’ in which we live, generating forms of innovation for the functional recovery of waste, recycling and creative reuse that helps protect the environment,” the cardinal said.

The Vatican’s hope, he said, is that “tourism will contribute to glorifying God, and to increasingly validating human dignity, mutual knowledge, spiritual brotherhood, refreshment of body and soul.”

If anyone wishes to make such a bequest in their will, the following clause may be included or added to a will: "I give, devise, and bequeath to Dormition of the Mother of God Ukrainian Catholic Church at 1091 Coronation Avenue, Kelowna, BC V1Y 7A8 or to Resurrection of Jesus Christ Ukrainian Catholic Parish in Penticton, BC, the sum of \$\_\_\_\_\_ (or \_\_\_\_% of my estate), to be used for the benefit of the church/parish and it's needs and pastoral ministry*
