Epistle: A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Ephesians: (Eph. 5:9-19)

Brothers and Sisters, live as children of light. Light produces every kind of goodness and justice and truth. Be correct in your judgment of what pleases the Lord. Take no part in vain deeds done in darkness; rather, condemn them. It is shameful even to mention the things these people do in secret; but when such deeds are condemned, they are seen in the light of day, and all that then appears is light. That is why we read: "Awake, o sleeper, arise from the dead, and Christ will give you light."



Keep careful watch over your conduct. Do not act like fools, but like thoughtful men. Make the most of the present opportunity, for these are evil days. Do not continue in ignorance but try to discern the will of the Lord. Avoid getting drunk of wine; that leads to debauchery. Be filled with the Spirit, addressing one another in psalms and hymns and inspired songs. Sing praise to the Lord with all your hearts.

Gospel: (Luke 12:16-21)

The Lord told the people a parable in these words: "There was a rich man who had a good harvest. 'What shall I do?' he asked himself. 'I have no place to store my harvest. I know!' he said. 'I will pull down my grain bins and build larger ones. All my grain and my goods will go there. Then I will say to myself: You have blessings in reserve for years to come. Relax! Eat heartily, drink well. Enjoy yourself.' But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life shall be required of you. To whom will all this piled-up wealth of yours go?' That is the way it works with the man who grows rich for himself instead of growing rich in the sight of God."

Our Eparch, Bishop Ken is requesting that at the conclusion of every Divine Liturgy we say an additional prayer for Peace in Ukraine until the end of the war. **For peace in Ukraine, let us pray: Our Father ... Hail Mary ... Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.**

❖ **Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion:** 1) You are a member of the Catholic Church (faithful of the Orthodox churches are very welcome to receive Holy Communion); 2) You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; 3) You attend Divine Services regularly; 4) Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; 5) You have kept the Liturgical fast – no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). 6) You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel. 7) To the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace. *If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.*

“The rich man [in today’s parable] is stricken with avarice [an unreasonably strong desire to obtain and keep money], which originates in the love of one’s own body, and the love of possessions. When we become greedy, the wisdom of God flees from us and we’re overcome by [true] folly. The objective of the avaricious man is not to satisfy his needs. In fact, what he does is simply foolish. He considers how to acquire more things in order to be completely dominated by them and to lose his very self, both as the image of God and as a human being. ... He becomes a slave to the immoderation in which he exhausts himself and creates a multitude of so-called ‘needs’ that are nevertheless very far indeed from the limits of what is needful according to the Gospel. [In other words, he considers himself to need much more than a person actually needs - he confuses his irrational desires with need.] Although [the rich man in today’s parable] disclosed the profit brought by material goods [he didn’t try to hide his money or deceive others or God], he did not show himself to be a wise and prudent steward, since he was not interested in the necessary assets of being a fruitful husbandman and a profitable merchant, but was concerned only with building greater barns. This man is called a fool. He has denied God by his very actions, by his disposition to the things God has given him. And in denying God, we in fact deny our own selves. Once we exist outside of a constant reference to God, we really cease to exist. We become images that have rejected our subject.” – *Passions and Virtues According to Saint Gregory Palamas*

There are many people, living even among us in our families and our communities, who became slaves to their selfishness, madness and greediness lose themselves by selling their earthly temporal and eternal lives to Satan and his devil servants. Unfortunately, those people in their spiritual blindness and immaturity wish to worship themselves and their temporal idols such as: power, money, possessions, technology, food and pleasure, celebrities, cultural and sport activities, and many other visible creatures instead of worshiping God the Divine Architect – Creator! Look around, learn that the wheel of history repeats itself throughout the centuries. Christians, do not be fooled, stay aware and be strong united together in our daily battle against Satan and all his evil agents attacking us.

Unfortunately, in our present secular and atheistic society many government officials, medical workers and even family members choose to disrespect God’s 10 commandments and human dignity of other person by simply deciding to ‘destroy or eliminate an economically problematic person-burden’ and euthanize elderly seniors or kill unborn children! National Holodomor Awareness Week November 19-25, 2018 – to commemorate the 85th anniversary of the Holodomor – Famine/Genocide by Starvation of 1932-1933. International Holodomor Memorial Day is on Saturday, Nov. 24. at 7:32 p.m. (19:32) your local time we are invited to pause for a moment of silence and honour the memory of the victims by lighting a candle of remembrance in our homes. At our parish we will celebrate the Panakhya service on Sunday, Nov. 25th after the Divine Liturgy for those millions of people who died just because they had nothing to eat!

UGCC HEAD TO LAITY: SET MILLIONS UKRAINIAN HEARTS AFLAME, AS YOU KNOW WHAT TO DO AND HOW TO DO IT.

Speaking at the Third Congress of the Laity of the UGCC, Patriarch Sviatoslav called the participants to lightening the hearts of millions of Ukrainians and invoked them to be active in all aspects of life of the callings of the faithful.

“We see that the political and economic realms of society are most infected with sin. Therefore, it is necessary for our laity to participate in the political and economic life of their state and bring the Spirit of God there, releasing from the chains of slavery before evil. During these days, when I listened to you and communicated with you, I had a feeling that I was listening to the very heartbeat of the Church, and this is not only a beautiful word or metaphor. You came here as representatives of a very broad network of secular communities of our Church. I was thankful to the Lord for giving me such a wonderful Church and such people, as well as for bestowing so many of his gifts on our people,” the Head of the UGCC stressed. “I have recently returned from the Pontifical Synod and listened to the heart of the Ecumenical Catholic Church for a month. And I would like to tell you that we are the best,” said the head of the UGCC. He expressed his deep gratitude to all the organizers, delegates for their presence, work and activity, as well as for the warm (cozy) ambience. “The warmth of your hearts is really incredible. Therefore, there is a great mission for you: to warm with your heart and set aflame millions of other hearts in Ukraine,” said the head of the UGCC. In his view, it is now incredibly important that every Greek-Catholic Ukrainian be an active lay(wo)man and inspire others with enthusiasm. “Let the proclaimed resolutions turn into a road map of the secular movement, an active laity apostolate in our Church. Do you know what impressions I got from the resolutions?! You know not only what needs to be done, but how to do it, as the content of the proposed resolutions testifies to this,” said the Greek Catholic leader and called on the participants to take active action. “If every one of you in your place does all that you have expressed as your wishes in the form of these resolutions, be sure, our Church will become a catalyst for colossal transformations not only of the Ukrainian society, but also of the Universal Catholic Church on a global scale,” emphasized His Beatitude Svyatoslav and blessed the participants of the event.
