Epistle: A reading from the First Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians: (1 Cor. 3:9-17)

Brethren, we are God's co-workers, while you are his cultivation, his building. Thanks to the favor God showed me I laid a foundation as a wise master-builder might do, and now someone else is building upon it. Everyone, however, must be careful how he builds. No one can lay a foundation other that the one that has been laid, namely Jesus Christ. If different ones build on this foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay or straw, the work of each will be made clear. The Day will disclose it. That day will make its appearance with fire, and fire will test the quality of each man's work. If the building a man has raised on this foundation still stands, he will receive his recompense; if a man's building burns, he will suffer loss. He himself will be saved, but only as one fleeing through fire. Are you not aware that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy him. For the temple of God is holy, and you are that temple.

Gospel: (Mt. 14:22-34)

At that time while dismissing the crowds, Jesus insisted that his disciples get into the boat and precede him to the other side. When he had sent them away, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray, remaining there alone as evening drew on. Meanwhile the boat, already several hundred yards out from shore, was being tossed about in the waves raised by strong headwinds. At about three in the morning, he came walking toward them on the lake. When the disciples saw him walking on the water, they were terrified. "It is a ghost!" they said, and in their fear they began to cry out. Jesus hastened to reassure them: "Get hold of yourselves! It is I. Do not be afraid!" Peter spoke up and said, "Lord, if it is really you, tell me to come to you across the water." "Come!" he said. So Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water, moving toward Jesus. But when he perceived how strong the wind was, becoming frightened, he began to sink and cried out, "Lord, save me!" Jesus at one stretched out his hand and caught him. "How little faith you have!" he exclaimed. "Why did you falter?" Once they had climbed into the boat, the wind died down. Those who were in the boat showed him reverence, declaring, "Beyond doubt you are the Son of God!" After making the crossing they reached the shore at Gennesaret.

Our Eparch, Bishop Ken is requesting that at the conclusion of every Divine Liturgy we say an additional prayer for Peace in Ukraine until the end of the war. For peace in Ukraine, let us pray: Our Father ... Hail Mary ... Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Учні, побачивши, що він іде морем, жахнулись. "То привид!" – заговорили й закричали з переляку. Та Ісус тієї ж миті мовив до них: "Заспокойтесь, – це я, не страхайтеся!" Аж тут Петро озвавсь до нього й каже: "Господи, коли це ти, повели мені підійти водою до тебе!" "Підійди!" – сказав Ісус. І вийшов Петро з човна, почав іти по воді і підійшов до Ісуса; але, побачивши, що вітер сильний, злякався, почав потопати й крикнув: "Господи, рятуй мене!" Ісус же притьмом простягнув руку, вхопив його і мовив до нього: "Маловіре; чого засумнівався?" І як увійшли до човна, вітер ущух. А тоді ті, що були в човні, вклонилися йому до ніг, кажучи: "Ти істинно – Син Божий!" І перепливши, прибули в землю генезаретську.

Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion: You are a member of the Catholic Church (faithful of the Orthodox churches are very welcome to receive Holy Communion); 2) You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; 3) You attend Divine Services regularly; 4) Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; 5) You have kept the Liturgical fast - no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). 6) You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard

the Gospel. 7) To the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace. If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.

Pastoral and Sacramental Ministry:

Baptisms: by appointment. Marriages: six months' notice should be given to the parish priest, and he should be contacted before any other arrangements are made. Reconciliation: on Sundays and Holy Days: before Liturgies and other days, by appointment. Holy Communion: for the sick, by appointment, any time, Holy Unction (Anointing of the Sick): Those anticipating surgery, hospitalization or treatments and who would like to receive anointing (by appointment, any time)

Funerals and Memorials: by appointment.

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

The Church helps to build social justice by preaching and applying four principles of its social doctrine: dignity of the human person, solidarity, subsidiarity and common good. For free people, a state is a common good.

For Ukrainians, a state is the only guarantee of being free on their land. Previously, we lived in our land as citizens of the second class.

This was stated by His Beatitude Sviatoslav in an exclusive interview for the Italian edition of ACI Stampa, telling about the meeting of the UGCC bishops with the Pope Francis and representatives of the Vatican Curia.

According to the Head of the UGCC, the central theme of their conversation was the war in Ukraine and humanitarian crisis caused by the war.

"We are a post-genocidal people: we still cure the wounds of the great tragedy of Holodomor in the history of our people. Two World Wars and extermination of Ukrainians by Stalin's famine turned Ukraine into the land wet with blood of millions of people. Now our state is experiencing a period of self-worth awakening. And it's important to understand what we mean when we use the word "Ukraine," said the Primate.

And later he added: "By the word 'Ukraine' we mean primarily the nation with its own history, its wounds and, at the same time, its hopes. We think of the state as a subject of international law with well-defined boundaries recognized by the international community. This is a state which is the common good of our nation in its multinational and multireligious dimensions; of the nation which is undergoing decolonization, that is, trying to get out of the periphery to become a partner in dialogue with the countries of Central and Eastern Europe."

"Instead, our aggressor, that is, the Russian Federation," said His Beatitude Sviatoslav, "by the term 'Ukraine' means the territory that is an object of negotiations and geopolitical interests. The Russians deny the existence of such a nation and consider Ukraine as a temporary state. They want to demonstrate that, rather, it is a state that "failed". These are two completely different concepts."

According to the spiritual leader of the Greek Catholics, the Ukrainian people are now going through decolonization. Moreover, Ukrainians now have to cherish their dignity and freedom.

"The war in Ukraine is a colonial war in the very heart of Europe with the intent to restore a system like the Soviet Union - to restore the empire. Therefore, we told the Holy Father about the desire of Ukrainians to protect the country. If the aggressor succeeds in destroying the Ukrainian state, they will "redraw" the borders of Eastern Europe, and this will be a tragedy for the whole Europe. This topic was one of the main themes of communication with the Holy Father," said the Head of the UGCC.

He noted that the bishops of the UGCC tried to adequately represent our country, because "unfortunately we are often represented as people who do not know who to go with, with Europe or with Russia." "To characterize the current situation in our country, I use this comparison. Ukraine is a prisoner who has spent many years in prison and has just been released and therefore feels, on the one hand, free, but on the other - having faced with the need to reintegrate into a free society, remains a prisoner of prison mentality," explained His Beatitude Sviatoslav.



Metropolitan Borys Gudziak of UGCC becomes member of

Congregation for Oriental Churches

On August 6, 2019, the Apostolic See announced that the Holy Father Pope Francis appointed new members of the Congregation for the Oriental Churches, including the Archbishop and Metropolitan of Philadelphia, His Eminence Borys Gudziak. It is reported by the information Department of the Ukrainian Greek Cathoolic Church.

A message posted on the official website of the Vatican, in particular, says as follows:

"His Holiness Francis named members of the Congregation for the Oriental Churches: His Eminence Gualtiero Bassetti,
Archbishop of Perugia and Città della Pieve, His Eminence Carlos Osoro Sierra, Archbishop of Madrid, His Eminence Cardinal Anders
Arborelius, Bishop of Stockholm, His Eminence Cardinal Luis Francisco Ladaria Ferrer, Prefect of the Congregation for the Doctrine of
the Faith; monsignors Archbishop Anthony Colin Fisher of Sydney, Archbishop Georges Bacouni of Beirut and Jbeil of the Greek
Melkites; Archbishop Borys Gudziak of Philadelphia of the Ukrainians; Archbishop Michel Petit of Paris, and Bishop Miguel Ángel
Ayuso Guixot, president of the Pontifical Council for Interreligious Dialogue.
