Tone 1, text from book "The Divine Liturgy of Saint John Chrysostom"; pages 89-91

Epistle: A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Ephesians: (Eph. 5:9-19)

Brothers and Sisters live as children of light. Light produces every kind of goodness and justice and truth. Be correct in your judgment of what pleases the Lord. Take no part in vain deeds done in darkness; rather, condemn them. It is shameful even to mention the things these people do in secret; but when such deeds are condemned, they are seen in the light of day, and all that then appears is light. That is why we read: "Awake, o sleeper, arise from the dead, and Christ will give you light."

Keep careful watch over your conduct. Do not act like fools, but like thoughtful men. Make the most of the present opportunity, for these are evil days. Do not continue in ignorance but try to discern the will of the Lord. Avoid getting drunk of wine; that leads to debauchery. Be filled with the Spirit, addressing one another in psalms and hymns and inspired songs. Sing praise to the Lord with all your hearts.

Gospel: (Luke 12: 16-21)

The Lord told the people a parable in these words: "There was a rich man who had a good harvest. 'What shall I do?' he asked himself. 'I have no place to store my harvest. I know!' he said. 'I will pull down my grain bins and build larger ones. All my grain and my goods will go there. Then I will say to myself: You have blessings in reserve for years to come. Relax! Eat heartily, drink well. Enjoy yourself.' But God said to him, "You fool! This very night your life shall be required of you. To whom will all this piled-up wealth of yours go?' That is the way it works with the man who grows rich for himself instead of growing rich in the sight of God."

Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion: You are a member of the Catholic Church (faithful of the Orthodox churches are very welcome to receive Holy Communion); 2) You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; 3) You attend Divine Services regularly; 4) Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; 5) You have kept the Liturgical fast – no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). 6) You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel. 7) To the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace. If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.

Pastoral and Sacramental Ministry:

Baptisms: by appointment. Marriages: six months' notice should be given to the parish priest, and he should be contacted before any other arrangements are made. Reconciliation: on Sundays and Holy Days: before Liturgies and other days, by appointment. Holy Communion: for the sick, by appointment, any time, Holy Unction (Anointing of the Sick): Those anticipating surgery, hospitalization or treatments and who would like to receive anointing (by appointment, any time), Funerals and Memorials: by appointment.

Pope Francis explains the most dangerous attitude in Christian life

Pope Francis warned that pride is the most dangerous attitude in the Christian life, pointing out that even the holiest of people have received everything from God. "None of us loves God as He loved us. It is enough to put oneself before a crucifix to grasp the disproportion," Pope Francis said.

"Before God we are all sinners," Francis said. "If we say we are without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us," he said quoting the first epistle of John.

The pope said that pride is "the most dangerous attitude of every Christian life," warning that arrogance can "also infect people who live an intense religious life." "There are glaring sins that make noise, and there are also devious sins, which lurk in the heart without us even realizing it. The worst of these is pride," Francis said. The sin of pride divides people and makes us presume to be better than others, he explained. "We always remain children who owe everything to the Father."

Pope Francis said that when we go through difficult days, we must always remember that life is a miracle that God has created from nothing. "In this life we have received so much: existence, a father and a mother, friendship, the wonders of creation," he said



"If you love, it is because someone next to you has awakened you to love, making you understand how in it lies the meaning of existence," he explained.

Pope Francis called this principle the "mystery of the moon," which has no light of its own, but reflects the light of the sun. "We love because we have been loved, we forgive because we have been forgiven," he said. "None of us shines with our own light." The pope said that understanding this can give us a greater empathy for others.

"Let's try to listen to the story of some person who made a mistake: a prisoner, a convict, a drug addict," Francis said. Without neglecting to consider personal responsibility, he said, you can ask yourself whether these mistakes are the result of a "story of hatred and abandonment that someone carries with him."
