

Liturgical Propers in English language:

First Antiphon

Verse 1: When Israel came forth from Egypt, the house of Jacob from an alien people Judah became His sanctuary, Israel His dominion (Ps 113:1-2).

Refrain: Through the prayers of the Mother of God, O Saviour, save us.

Verse 2: The sea beheld this and fled, the Jordan turned back on its course (Ps 113:3).

Refrain: Through the prayers of the Mother of God O Saviour, save us.

Verse 3: Why was it, O sea, that you fled, that you, O Jordan, turned back on your course? (Ps 113:5)

Refrain: Through the prayers of the Mother of God O Saviour, save us.

Third Antiphon: We sing the usual Third Antiphon, but with the festal refrain: Son of God, baptized by John in the Jordan, save us who sing to You: Alleluia.

Troparion (Tone 6): Angelic powers were upon Your tomb and the guards became like dead men; Mary stood before Your tomb seeking Your most pure body. You captured Hades without being overcome by it. You met the Virgin and granted life. O Lord, risen from the dead, glory be to You!

Troparion (Tone 1): When You, O Lord, were baptized in the Jordan, worship of the Trinity was revealed; the voice of the Father bore witness to You, naming You the "beloved Son," and the Spirit in the form of a dove confirmed the Word's certainty. Glory to You, O Christ God, who appeared and enlightened the world.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.

Kontakion (Tone 6): With His life-giving hand Christ our God, the Giver of life, raised all the dead from the murky abyss and bestowed resurrection upon humanity. He is for all the Saviour, the resurrection and the life, and the God of all.

Now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Kontakion (Tone 4): Today You have appeared to the world and Your light, O Lord, has been signed on us, who with knowledge sing Your praises. You have come, You have appeared, O unapproachable Light.

Prokimenon (Tone 1): Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us as we have hoped in You (Ps 32:22).

Verse: Rejoice in the Lord, O you just; praise befits the righteous (Ps 32:1).

Prokimenon (Tone 1): Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us as we have hoped in You (Ps 32:22).

Epistle: A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Ephesians: (Eph. 4:7-13)

Brothers and Sisters, each of us has received God's favor in the measure in which Christ bestows it. Thus, you find Scripture saying: "When He ascended on high, He took a host of captives and gave gifts to people." "He ascended" – what does this mean but that He first descended into the lower regions of the earth? He who descended is the very one who ascended high above the heavens, that He might fill all people with His gifts. It is He who gave apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers in roles of service for the faithful to build up the body of Christ, till we become one in faith and in the knowledge of God's Son, and form that perfect man who is Christ come to full stature.

Alleluia (Tone 5): Your mercies, O Lord, I will sing forever; from generation to generation I will announce Your truth with my mouth (Ps 88:2). For You have said: Mercy shall be built up for ever; in the heavens Your truth shall be prepared (Ps 88:3).

Gospel: (Matthew 4:12-17)

At that time, when Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and went down to live in Capernaum by the sea near the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, to fulfill what had been said through Isaiah the prophet: "Land of Zebulun, Land of Naphtali along the sea beyond the Jordan, heathen Galilee: a people living in darkness has seen a great light. On those who inhabit a land overshadowed by death, light has arisen." From that time on Jesus began to proclaim this theme: "Reform your lives! The kingdom of heaven is at hand."

Instead of "It is truly...": O my soul, magnify Christ the King, baptized in the Jordan. Irmos (Tone 2): Every tongue is at a loss to praise you as is your due, O Mother of God. Even a spirit from above is filled with dizziness when seeking to sing your praises. But since you are good, accept out faith, for you know well our love inspired by God. For it is you who protect all Christians; therefore, we magnify you.

Communion Verses: The Grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all (Tim. 2:11). Praise the Lord from the heavens; praise Him in the highest (Ps 148:1). Alleluia! (*3x*).

According to Galician usage, we sing: All creation is filled with rejoicing today, for Christ is baptized in the Jordan.

А те "вийшов" що означає, як не те, що він був зійшов і в найнижчі частини землі? Той же, хто був зійшов на низ, це той самий, що вийшов найвище всіх небес, щоб усе наповнити. Народ, який сидів у темноті побачив велике світло; тим, що сиділи в країні й тіні смерти, – зійшло їм світло." З того часу Ісус почав проповідувати й говорити: "Покайтесь, бо Небесне Царство близько."

<u>Замість Достойно: Величай, душе моя, Царя Христа, що хрестився в Йордані.</u>

Ірмос (глас 2): Не зуміє ніякий язик достойно благохвалити, тривожиться й ум, і то надсвітній, коли оспівує тебе, Богородице; одначе ти, благая, прийми віру, бо любов нашу божественну знаєш, бо ти є християн заступниця, тебе величаємо.

Причасний: Явилася благодать Божа спасительна всім людям (Тит. 2, 11). Хваліте Господа з небес, хваліте Його на висотах (Пс. 148, 1). Алилуя (х3).

Згідно Галицької традиції, ми співаємо: Всесвіт днесь радістю сповняється, Христос хрестився в Йордані. Замість "Ми бачили світло істинне…"(x1) "Нехай сповняться уста…"(x3) і "Нехай буде ім'я…" (x3).

Your pastor may have no other way of knowing that you are in hospital, as privacy legislation. *SPIRIT OF CHRISTIAN AWARENESS: Dear parishioners, if our brother or sister in Christ, who usually sits next to you, is not in the Church today, please phone him / her and ask how he / she is doing. Let him or her know that our parish community misses his or her at the church very much and prays for them daily! We also pray for the people of Ukraine, that with the help of the Holy Spirit, they may obtain social peace, political harmony and economic stability: Lord, hear us and have mercy.*

Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion: You are a member of the Catholic Church (faithful of the Orthodox churches are very welcome to receive Holy Communion); 2) You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; 3) You attend Divine Services regularly; 4) Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; 5) You have kept the Liturgical fast – no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). 6) You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel. 7) To the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace. If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.

Pastoral and Sacramental Ministry:

Baptisms: by appointment. Marriages: six months' notice should be given to the parish priest, and he should be contacted before any other arrangements are made. Reconciliation: on Sundays and Holy Days: before Liturgies and other days, by appointment. Holy Communion: for the sick, by appointment, any time, Holy Unction (Anointing of the Sick): Those anticipating surgery, hospitalization or treatments and who would like to receive anointing (by appointment, any time), Funerals and Memorials: by appointment.

Why Do We Bless Homes?

The blessing of homes constitutes an invocative blessing, meaning that by his prayer and by the sprinkling of Holy Water the priest invokes God's blessings and protection upon the home and those living in it. We bless homes for many reasons:

- to reveal the home as what God had created it to be, a way to Heaven
- to rid the home of every evil † to show that the family is a small Church unit in Christ
- to consecrate the home and all activity in it to God †to fill the home and all who live in it with the fullness of God

Traditionally, the priest personally visits all his parishioners each year to pray with them in the place where they live, and to bless their surroundings with the newly sanctified water of Theophany. By sanctifying our homes we extend the grace of God to our individual dwellings.

Just as our souls, so also our homes become tainted by the sins of those living in them and consequently lose God's protective power. We cleanse our souls of sins at least once a year and the church is blessed with the newly blessed water every year, so should our homes be sanctified with Holy Water to invoke God's blessings and protection on it and its inhabitants. As we renew the insurance on our home every year, so we should renew our insurance of God's protection and His blessing which is of greater importance and more effective.


What should we do during a home blessing? As we welcome our priest during the holy season of Theophany to bless our home, let us be mindful that he is bringing to us the "blessing of the Jordan," and that unless God protects and blesses our home, we "labour in vain." (Ps. 127:1)

Each family is considered a small church and the family table is the home altar. When the priest comes, have as many family members there as possible. If you do not have an icon corner, ensure that you set up a place for prayer either at the kitchen or dining table. On the table include an icon and a lit candle. You may also include anything that you may want to have blessed (i.e. icon, cross, personal item, etc.) Make sure that the lights are on in every room. The priest will begin the blessing at the icon corner or table. If you have children, they may lead the priest, while holding a candle, to each room in the house.

Pope warns US/Iran tensions could trigger 'vaster conflict'

ROME - Pope Francis called recent tensions between the U.S. and Iran following the killing of General Qassem Soleimani in Baghdad "particularly troubling" Thursday, warning that they risk triggering a "vaster conflict."

Escalation between the two nations, the pope said, risks "compromising the gradual process of rebuilding in Iraq, as well as setting the groundwork for a vaster conflict that all of us would want to avert."



Francis renewed his appeal for both sides to "keep alive the flame of dialogue and self-restraint, in full respect of international law."

His comments came as part of an annual address to the diplomatic corps accredited to the Vatican, which is generally interpreted as providing a blueprint of papal priorities and offering a sense of what is foremost on his mind.

In this year's Jan. 9 address, Francis lamented the fact that "our human family is scarred and wounded by a succession of increasingly destructive wars that especially affect the poor and those most vulnerable."

"Sadly, the new year does not seem to be marked by encouraging signs, as much as by heightened tensions and acts of violence," he said, saying heightened tensions between Iran and the United States is "particularly troubling."

The pope's speech came shortly after U.S. President Donald Trump said Wednesday that the United States is ready to "embrace peace," and less

than 34 hours after Iran took credit for firing more than 20 ballistic missiles at U.S. bases in Iraq in response to the assassination of Suleimani by U.S. forces last week.

In light of this and many other raging global conflicts, "we cannot give up hope," Francis said, adding that to maintain hope "requires courage. It means acknowledging that evil, suffering and death will not have the last word, and that even the most complex questions can and must be faced and resolved."

In his lengthy 7-page speech, the pope, rather than looking forward to the year to come, looked back at the year that has passed and highlighted a number of key issues he insisted are still worthy of attention in 2020, including the global clerical sexual abuse crisis.

While young people are a sign of hope, "not a few adults, including different members of the clergy, have been responsible for grave crimes against the dignity of young people, children and teenagers, violating their innocence and privacy," Francis said.

"These are crimes that offend God, cause physical, psychological and spiritual damage to their victims, and damage the life of whole communities," he said and pointing to various steps in child protection the Vatican has taken since his February 2019 summit on the topic, which was attended by the heads of all bishops' conferences worldwide, announced a new initiative for 2020.

Francis also called for greater education for young people and for stronger intergenerational relations and condemned abortion.

Noting that many people today have become indifferent and "self-absorbed," he said there is a tendency to defend "acquired rights and privileges, and to view the world within a narrow horizon that treats the elderly with indifference and no longer welcomes the newborn."

As he has in the past, Francis lauded youthful efforts in fighting climate change, the most notable of which is the "Fridays for Future" protests launched by Swedish teen activist Greta Thunberg. The pope called for a stronger "ecological conversion."

"Sadly, the urgency of this ecological conversion seems not to have been grasped by international politics, where the response to the problems raised by global issues such as climate change remains very weak and a source of grave concern," he said, and urged collective international efforts.

Recalling his October 2019 Synod of Bishops on the Amazon, Francis insisted that the gathering was "an essentially ecclesial event, prompted by the desire to listen to the hopes and challenges of the Church in Amazonia and to open new paths for the proclamation of the Gospel to the People of God, especially to the indigenous peoples."

Francis also voiced concern over conflicts raging throughout Latin America, the Middle East and Africa, saying that specifically on his home continent, polarization is making the situation worse, making special mention of Venezuela.

Insisting the conflicts are mostly rooted in inequality, injustice and corruption, the pope pushed political leaders "to work diligently to reestablish a culture of dialogue for the sake of the common good, to reinforce democratic institutions and promote respect for the rule of law, as a means of countering anti-democratic, populist and extremist tendencies."

He also recalled his trips to the United Arab Emirates and Morocco, highlighting the importance of interreligious dialogue, calling it "the main road to greater knowledge, understanding and reciprocal support between the members of different religions."

Pointing to the Middle East, he urged the international community to engage more actively in putting a halt to the conflicts, particularly in Syria, criticizing what he said is a "culture of silence" over the war that has been raging there for nearly a decade.

"It is imperative to devise suitable and far-sighted solutions capable of enabling the beloved Syrian people, exhausted by war, to regain peace and to begin the reconstruction of the country," he said, and voiced concern about increased tensions in Jordan and Lebanon, which have taken in millions of Syrian refugees.

Turning to Africa, he spoke of his September visit to Madagascar, Mozambique and Mauritius in September, and drew attention to other African nations struggling to overcome violence and conflict, particularly Nigeria and South Sudan.

He condemned "continuing episodes of violence against innocent people, including many Christians persecuted and killed for their fidelity to the Gospel," and urged the international community to work harder to end terrorism and implement strategies promoting security, poverty reduction and better healthcare.

Francis repeated his desire to visit South Sudan alongside Justin Welby, the Archbishop of Canterbury, and Reverend John Chalmers, former Moderator of the Presbyterian Church of Scotland, should the country's leaders implement a long-delayed peace agreement.

On his home turf, Francis voiced a veiled support for European unity, recalling the foundations of European integration in 1949 with the creation of the Council of Europe.

The European project, he said, "continues to be a fundamental guarantee of development for those who have long shared in it, and an opportunity for peace in the aftermath of turbulent conflicts and injuries for those countries that aspire to take part in it."

Pointing to the tragic fire that destroyed much of France's famed Notre Dame Cathedral, Francis lauded the solidarity shown by people throughout the world, saying the incident has revived questions about Europe's identity.

He also repeated his call for nuclear disarmament while in Japan and Thailand in November, saying 2020 "offers an important opportunity in this regard," with the Tenth Review Conference of the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons, which will be held in New York April 27-May 22.

"It is my lively hope that the international community will then manage to achieve a conclusive and proactive consensus on ways to implement this international legal instrument, which has shown itself to be all the more important in times like our own," he said.

Francis also voiced his support for Australia, assuring victims and all those impacted by the many bushfires ravaging the country of his prayers.

In closing remarks, Francis noted that 2020 marks 25 years since the 1995 U.N. World Conference on Women in Beijing.

"It is my hope that the invaluable role of women in society may be increasingly acknowledged worldwide and that all forms of injustice, discrimination and violence against women come to an end," he said, adding that every act of violence and exploitation against women are "not merely wrong; they are crimes that destroy the harmony, the poetry and beauty that God wished to bestow on the world."




