

Epistle: A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Hebrews (Hebrews 1:10-2:3)

Brothers and Sisters, Scripture says: "Lord, of old you established the earth, and the heavens are the work of your hands. They will perish, but you remain; all of them will grow old like a garment. You will roll them up like a cloak, like a garment they will be changed. But you are the same, and your years will have no end." To which of the angels has God ever said, "Sit at my right hand till I make your enemies your footstool?" Are they not all ministering spirits, sent to serve those who are to inherit salvation? In view of this, we



must attend all the more to what we have heard, lest we drift away. For if the word spoken through angels stood unchanged, and all transgression and disobedience received its due punishment, how shall we escape if we ignore a salvation as great as ours? Announced first by the Lord, it was confirmed to us by those who had heard him.

Gospel: (Mark 2:1-12)

At that time, Jesus came back to Capernaum after a lapse of several days and word got around that he was at home. At that they began to gather in great numbers. There was no longer any room for them, even around the door.

While he was delivering God's word to them, some people arrived bringing a paralyzed man to him. The four who carried him were unable to bring him to Jesus because of the crowd, so they began to open up the roof over the spot where Jesus was. When they had made a hole, they let down the mat on which the paralytic was lying. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralyzed man, "My son, your sins are forgiven." Now some of the scribes were sitting there asking themselves: "Why does the man talk in that way? He commits blasphemy! Who can forgive sins except God alone?

Jesus was immediately aware of their reasoning, though they kept it to themselves, and he said to them: "Why do you harbour these thoughts? Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Stand up, pick up your mat, and walk again?' That you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins" (he said to the paralyzed man), "I command you: Stand up!

Pick up your mat and go home." The man stood and picked up his mat and went outside in the sight of everyone. They were awestruck; all gave praise to God, saying, "We have never seen anything like this!"

Instead of "It is truly...": In you, O Full of Grace, all creation rejoices: the angelic ranks and all the human race. Sanctified temple and spiritual paradise, virgins' pride and boast, from whom God is made flesh and became a little Child; and He who is our God before the ages, He made your womb a throne, and He made it wider than all the heavens. In you, O Full of Grace, all creation rejoices. Glory be to you.

At the conclusion of every Divine Liturgy we say an additional prayer for Peace in the World:

Our Father ... Hail Mary ... Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Апостол: До Євреїв Послання Святого Апостола Павла читання: (Євр. 1, 10-2, 3)

А що із-за народу не могли донести до нього, розкрили стелю над місцем, де він був, й отвором спустили ліжко, на якому лежав розслаблений. Ісус, уздрівши їхню віру, до розслабленого й каже: "Сину, відпускаються тобі твої гріхи." А були й деякі книжники, що сиділи там та міркували собі: "І як може цей так говорити? Він богохульствує! Хто може прощати гріхи, крім одного лише Бога?" Ісус же, вмить збагнувши духом, що вони таке собі думають, до них і каже: "Чого таке ось намислюєте у ваших серцях? Що легше – сказати розслабленому: Відпускаються тобі гріхи, а чи сказати: Встань, візьми твоє ліжко й ходи?

We also pray for the people of Ukraine, that with the help of the Holy Spirit, they may obtain social peace, political harmony and economic stability: Lord, hear us and have mercy.

Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion: You are a member of the Catholic Church (faithful of the Orthodox churches are very welcome to receive Holy Communion); 2) You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; 3) You attend Divine Services regularly; 4) Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; 5) You have kept the Liturgical fast – no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). 6) You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel. 7) To the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace. *If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.*

Pastoral and Sacramental Ministry:

Baptisms: by appointment. Marriages: six months' notice should be given to the parish priest, and he should be contacted before any other arrangements are made. Reconciliation: on Sundays and Holy Days: before Liturgies and other days, by appointment. Holy Communion: for the sick, by appointment, any time, Holy Unction (Anointing of the Sick): Those anticipating surgery, hospitalization or treatments and who would like to receive anointing (by appointment, any time), Funerals and Memorials: by appointment.

SPECIAL REQUEST: After each Divine Liturgy and every church service, please, keep silence in the House of the Lord as some of the faithful are still praying at the church as well. In consideration of other Christians, please, do not forget close all Liturgy and/or hymnbooks and return them to their proper places. Also, please do not leave any church bulletins or any other material in the pews. Let each of us do our part to be true stewards of our parish church by helping to keep the church building clean and neat. Thank you very much!

Brothers and Sisters in Christ, we are inviting and encouraging parishioners (especially all our wise and experienced seniorparishioners) to volunteer and help Mr. Rolli Cacchioni to form the Nominating Committee and suggest candidates for replacement council. Until nomination committee finalized suggestions for candidates may be placed in the Suggestion Box located in our church vestebule or personally passed to Council Chairperson Mrs. Yvonne Crawford or pastor Rev. Fr. Pavlo Myts.

Position of our Parish Council Officer is a blessing and wonderful opportunity to show your talents, knowledge, experience and care serving the best to the Almighty God in our spiritual, Christian family of the Dormition of the Mother of God Ukrainian Catholic Church in Kelowna, BC!

Parish Constitution states saying: 'The Parish Council must be representative of the faithful of the parish and of the various parish-related ogranizations that exist within its boundaries. Potential members of the Parish Council should have certain basic qualifications such as a keen desire to help, as well the ability to listen, reflect, and express themselves with care.' (Chapter III, Article 1, Sections 1 and 2)

Descriptions of responsabilities and ministry (cf. Chapter III, Articles 2, 3, 4, 5,) of each officer-member of the parish council are:

Chairperson of the Parish Council is elected at the Annual General Meeting. He/She is responsible for drawing up the agenda; calling for, directing and charing parish council meetings; seeing that the program of activities decided upon and ratified by the pastor are implemented; is a signing officer, an ex-officio member of all parish committees. He/She prepares the chairperson's report for presentation at the AGM.

Vice-Chairperson is elected at the Annual General Meeting. He/She is presiding at the all Parish Council Meetings in the absence of the Chairperson; carrying out such duties as are assigned by the Parish Council, the Chairperson or Pastor.

Recording Secretary is elected at the Annual General Meeting. He/She is keeping the minutes of all Parish Council Meetings; together with the Pastor and the Chairperson signs the adopted minutes of the Council.

Financial Secretary is elected at the Annual General Meeting. He/She is monitoring all funds received by the parish and ensure that all such funds are doposited in the parish bank account; keeping accurate records of all income and expenditures; keeps in in order and preserves documents, records and books of parish finances. He/She is a signing officer, together with the pastor, for property approved financial transactions. He/She presents at the AGM the statements of income and expences, as well as the balance sheet, for the calendar year as prepared by him or her or, where necessary, by an independent accounting firm.

Treasurer is elected at the Annual General Meeting. He/She is greatly helping the financial secretary to monitore all funds received by the parish and ensure that all such funds are doposited in the parish bank account; keeping accurate records of all income and expenditures (paying all invoices-bills and reimbursments); keeps in in order and preserves documents, records and books of parish finances. He/She is a signing officer, together with the pastor, for property approved financial transactions.

It is also very important to have active and carrying representatives (a leader and helpers) at different Parish Comeettees such as: Liturgical, Pastoral, Educational, Youth Ministry, Maintance, Kitchen, Social, Public Relations.





Слава Ісусу Христу!

Возлюблені у Христі брати і сестри,

З моменту мого призначення до Єпархії Пресвятої родини у Лондоні 15 січня 2020 р., я готуюся, щоб стати вашим єпископом та пастирем. Моя інтронізація призначена на 7 квітня, свято Благовіщення Пресвятої Богородиці. А в Лондоні багато людей мені допомагають з плануванням і підготовкою, як це буває з такими подіями. Стільки справ треба координувати, бо ж очікуємо гостей із різних куточків світу. Я впевнений, що всі ми готувались до чогось важливого у нашому житті, пакували валізи у далеку подорож, готувались до здачі екзаменів, планували якесь святкування. Однак, я також був у ситуаціях, коли мені не вистачало часу на підготовку. Та коли справи не пішли так як хотілось, я зрозумів, що треба було знайти час.

Мої дорогі друзі, ми вступаємо у час Великого Посту, святої чотиридесятниці, впродовж якої Церква запрошує нас належним чином приготуватися до Пасхи, торжества всіх торжеств, Воскресіння Господа нашого Ісуса Христа! Спитаймо себе: у цьому заклопотаному світі, що ми можемо зробити, щоб підготуватись до святої Пасхи?

Перш за все, ми можемо поглибити наше молитовне життя, значить, якщо маємо можливість відвідувати різні богослуження, які будуть служитися в наших парафіях у час Великого посту, ми повинні користати з цього. Якщо з якихось причин ми не в змозі бути на великопосних богослуженнях, кожного дня постараймося знайти час для молитви, чи це на одинці, чи це з членами нашої сім'ї, або навіть з друзями.

Традиційно чотиридесятниця – це нагода постити і бути поміркованими, іншими словами, це час з власної волі позбавити себе якогось задоволення чи діяльності, якими ми насолоджуємось, а навіть час відчути голод. Ми здійснюємо самозречення, щоб практикувати контроль над собою та своєю гріховною гордістю. Звичайно ми не постимо, щоб виглядати побожно перед іншими. Перш за все, ми постимо на знак духовного голоду за Господом. Ми визнаємо, що Христос не може наповнити наші серця, якщо вони вже наповнені нами самими. Безумовно, ми повинні намагатися поглянути глибоко у власні серця, щоб усе наладнати з Богом та з нашим ближнім, і приступити до Таїнства Покаяння (Святої Сповіді). Нас запросили на весільний бенкет. Ми повинні впевнитись, що наш весільний одяг готовий (див. Мт. 22: 1-14)!

Великий піст - це також час бути більш чутливим до тих, хто, можливо, є більше в потребі, ніж ми. Можемо це зробити, підтримуючи благодійні ініціативи на парафії, будучи волонтером в одній із соціальних благодійних організацій у нашому районі, або склавши пожертву на якусь благодійну ціль або допомагаючи якійсь потребуючій особі, відповідно до наших можливостей. Ми також можемо відвідати когось, хто є самотнім, у лікарні чи у будинку для людей похилого віку. Готуючись до Пасхи Господньої, застановімося над Блаженствами, які Ісус нам подає як путівник для життя (див. Мт.5: 3-12; Лк 6: 20-23), над благословеннями, які приходять із жертвою, над радістю, яка нас чекає.

Зробімо цю великопосну подорож разом, молячись одні за одних та заохочуючи один одного. Протягом цих днів, поки я ще перебуваю в Канаді, складаю свої речі та полагоджую всі еміграційні питання, я постійно молюся за всіх вас. З натерпінням чекаю, поки зможу святкувати Пасху Господню з вами, чекаю радісної зустрічі з вами, моїм духовним стадом, щоб бути вашим пастирем. Ласкаво прошу про молитву за мене і за всіх тих, хто допомагає мені в цей час підготовки.

Всіх вас віддаю під покров Пресвятої Родини, нашого Господа і Спаса Ісуса Христа, Пресвятої Богородиці і Приснодіви Марії, та святого і праведного Йосифа Обручника.

PASTORAL LETTER FOR THE BEGINNING OF GREAT LENT To the Reverend Clergy, Religious and Lay Faithful of the Eparchy of the Holy Family of London

Glory to Jesus Christ!

Beloved Brothers and Sisters in Christ

From the moment my appointment to the Eparchy of the Holy Family of London was announced on 15 January, I have been preparing myself to become your bishop and shepherd. My enthronement at our cathedral is set for April 7, the Feast of the Annunciation. And in London quite a few people are assisting me in the planning and preparations that go into such an event. There is much to coordinate, with guests attending from near and far. Of course, I am sure that all of us have prepared for something important in our lives, packing suitcases for a long trip, studying for exams, planning for some celebration. However, I have also been in situations where I did not have enough time to prepare. And when things did not work out as well as they could have, I realized that I should have made time.

My dear friends, we are entering into the time of Great Lent, the forty-day period during which the Church invites us to prepare ourselves properly for Easter, the greatest of Feasts, the celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ! In this busy world of ours what are some things that we can do to prepare ourselves for Holy Pascha?

First of all, we can intensify our prayer life, which means that if we have the possibility to attend the various liturgical services that will be celebrated in our parishes during Lent, we should do so. If for some reason we are unable to attend our Lenten services, each day we can make a special effort to spend some time in prayer, either alone, or with family members, or even with friends.

Lent is traditionally a time for fasting and abstinence, in other words, a time to willfully deprive ourselves of some pleasure, of some activity we enjoy, and even a time to experience hunger. We exercise self-denial to practice control over ourselves and our sinful pride. We certainly don't fast so that we can look devout before others. Most of all, we fast as a sign of spiritual hunger for the Lord. We recognize that Christ can't fill our hearts if we are full of ourselves. Certainly, we should try to look deeply into our own hearts to set things right with God and with our neighbor, and receive the sacrament of reconciliation (holy confession). We have been invited to a wedding feast. We need to make sure that our wedding garment is ready (see Mat 22:1-14)!

Great Lent is also a time to be more sensitive to those who are perhaps in more need than we are. We can do that by supporting parish charitable initiatives, by volunteering at one of the many community social service providers in our neighbourhood, or by making a donation to some needy cause or person according to our ability. We also could resolve to visit someone who may be lonely, in a hospital or nursing home. In short, by purposely preparing ourselves for Easter we want to focus our attention on the Beatitudes that Jesus has given us as a guide to live by (see Mat.5:3-12; Lk 6:20-23), on the blessings that come with sacrifice, and the joy that awaits us.

Let us make this Lenten journey together by praying for each other and encouraging one another. During these days, while I am still in Canada packing my things, taking care of all work permit and visa requirements, I continue to keep all of you in my prayers. I look forward to celebrating Easter with you, to the joy of meeting you, my spiritual flock, and being your shepherd. Kindly pray for me and for all of those who are helping me in this time of preparation.

I continue to place each of you under the protection of the Holy Family, our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, the Most Holy Mother of God and ever-virgin Mary, and the holy and righteous St. Joseph the Betrothed.
