

Liturgical Propers in English language:

For the Sundays of Great Fast-Lent the Typicon prescribes the Divine Liturgy of Saint Basil the Great

Adoration of the Precious and Life-Giving Cross (before the Divine Liturgy begins)

People: Lord, have mercy (24 times.)

Priest: We also pray for our Most Reverend Metropolitan Lawrence, for our Godloving Bishop David, for our spiritual fathers and mothers, and for all our brothers and sisters in Christ; for their health and salvation, and for the remission of their sins, let us say. **†** *People:* Lord, have mercy (24 times.)

Priest: We also pray for every Christian soul that is afflicted and maltreated; for their health and salvation, and for the remission of their sins, let us say. **†**

People: Lord, have mercy (24 times.)

Priest: We also pray for all those who serve and have served in this holy church; for their health and salvation, and for the remission of their sins, let us pray. **†**

Epistle: A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Hebrews (Hebrews 4:14-5:6)

Brethren, Since, then, we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast to our profession of faith. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weakness, but

one who was tempted in everyway that we are, yet never sinned. So let us confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and favor and to find help in time of need.

Every high priest is taken from among men and made their representative before God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal patiently with erring sinners, for he himself is beset by weakness and so must make sin offerings for himself as well as for the people. One does not make this honor on his own initiative,

but only when called by God as Aaron was. Even Christ did not glorify himself with the office of high priest; he received it from the One who said to him, "You are my son; today I have begotten you"; just as he says in another place, "You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek."

Gospel: (Mark 8:34-9:1)

The Lord said, "If a man wishes to come after me, he must deny his very self, take up his cross, and follow in my steps. Whoever would preserve his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will preserve it.

What profit does a man show who gains the whole world and destroys himself in the process? What can a man offer in exchange for his life?

If anyone in this faithless and corrupt age is ashamed of me and my doctrine, the Son of Man will be ashamed of him when he comes with the holy angels in his Father's glory." He also said to them: "I assure you, among those standing here there are some who will not taste death until they see the reign of God established in power."

Let him or her know that our parish community misses his or her at the church very much and prays for them daily! We also pray for the people of Ukraine, that with the help of the Holy Spirit, they may obtain social peace, political harmony and economic stability: Lord, hear us and have mercy.*

Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion: You are a member of the Catholic Church (faithful of the Orthodox churches are very welcome to receive Holy Communion); 2) You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; 3) You attend Divine Services regularly; 4) Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; 5) You have kept the Liturgical fast – no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). 6) You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel. 7) To the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace. If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.

Pastoral and Sacramental Ministry:

Baptisms: by appointment. Marriages: six months' notice should be given to the parish priest, and he should be contacted before any other arrangements are made. Reconciliation: on Sundays and Holy Days: before Liturgies and other days, by appointment. Holy Communion: for the sick, by appointment, any time, Holy Unction (Anointing of the Sick): Those anticipating surgery, hospitalization or treatments and who would like to receive anointing (by appointment, any time), Funerals and Memorials: by appointment.

To the Clergy and the Faithful of the Eparchy of New Westminster,

CIX!

Many of our parishioners are understandably concerned about the spread of the Coronavirus. We want to assure them of steps we are taking in our parishes to provide a sense of health and well-being so that their spiritual needs continue to be met, and that they may grow in their relationship with God, especially during Great Lent.

All liturgical services will continue to be celebrated publicly. However, we will follow closely the advice and directives from medical experts and government officials in Canada should they prescribe otherwise.

By way of responding to the Coronavirus Disease, the following liturgical norms can be helpful in protecting ourselves and family from COVID-19:

- · Wash your hands often and well.
- · Avoid touching your face, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands.
- · Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- · Clean and disinfect surfaces that are frequently touched.
- · Stay at home and away from others (particularly the elderly as they are most vulnerable) if you are feeling ill.
- · When sick, cover your cough and sneezes with a sleeve or tissue and then wash your hands.
- · Upon entering and exiting the Church, wash your hands with provided antibacterial hand sanitizers.
- · Holy Water fonts (where they exist) at the entrance of the Church have been removed.
- Refrain from kissing icons and hand crosses.
- · Offer the Kiss of Peace at the Divine Liturgy by simply bowing to each other.
- At this time, the Divine Eucharist will be distributed as usual. When you approach, open your mouth as wide as
 possible, and do not allow your lips or tongue to touch the spoon.

For up to date information on the Corona virus, visit reliable sources, for example, Ministry of Health – British Columbia and Public Health Agency of Canada.



Pope Francis: Do not forget the poor during the coronavirus pandemic



The suffering of the poor cannot be ignored during the coronavirus pandemic, Pope Francis said Thursday in his televised morning homily. "Worried about my things, we forget the hungry children," Pope Francis said March 12 in Casa Santa Marta.

After the World Health Organization declared the global COVID-19 outbreak a pandemic on March 11, the Italian Prime Minister Giuseppe Conte introduced further restrictions forcing all nonessential businesses, restaurants, and cafes in the country to close.

Pope Francis in his morning homily March 12 put these limitations in perspective: "Maybe we today, here in Rome, are worried because 'it seems that the shops are closed, I have to go buy that, and it seems that I cannot go for a walk every day, and it

seems this ...'" "We forget those poor people who are on the borders of countries, looking for freedom, these forced migrants who flee from hunger and war to only find a wall, a wall made of iron, a wall of barbed wire, but a wall that does not let them pass," Pope Francis said in Casa Santa Marta.

The Pope said that there is an abundance of information in our newspapers about the suffering of children who are hungry and who do not have necessary medical or educational resources, yet people remain indifferent. He called it "the drama of information that does not go to the heart" in which "the heart is detached from the mind."

Pope Francis compared this indifference to the Gospel parable of Lazarus and the rich man. He said the rich man knew Lazarus' name, but ignored his needs creating an "abyss" between them both in life and in death.

He noted that Christ calls the poor man in the parable by name, but describes the rich man only with adjectives. "This is what selfishness does in us: it makes us lose our real identity," he said. "We have fallen into the culture of adjectives where your value is what you have, what you can do." "Today we ask the Lord for the grace not to fall into indifference, the grace that all the information about human suffering we have, will go down into the heart and move us to do something for others," Pope Francis said.

More than 10,000 people in Italy are currently being treated for COVID-19, the Italian Ministry of Health reported March 11. In less than three weeks, 827 Italians who contracted the coronavirus have died. The growing rate of infection led the Italian government to implement strict quarantine measures throughout the country.

The nationwide quarantine in Italy restricts movement around the country and between regions, and group gatherings outside of the family are forbidden. People are encouraged to stay home, but may move around the city for work, to go to the grocery store or pharmacy, or for medical care. In public, people are asked to keep one meter of distance from each other.

Pope Francis announced that he would livestream his daily morning Masses after the Italian government decree suspended all public religious ceremonies in the country until April 3. "We continue to pray together, in this moment of pandemic, for the sick, for family members, for parents with children at home," Pope Francis said at the beginning of Mass on March 12. "But above all, I would like to ask you to pray for the authorities: they must decide ... on measures that people do not like. But it is for our sake ... We pray for our rulers who must make the decision on these measures that they feel accompanied by the prayers of the people," the pope said.
