First Antiphon (of Ascension):

Verse 1: Clap your hands, all you nations; shout to God with the voice of joy (Ps 46:2).

Refrain: Through the prayers of the Mother of God, O Saviour, save us.

Verse 2: For the Lord most high is awesome, a great king over all the earth (Ps 46:3).

Refrain: Through the prayers of the Mother of God O Saviour, save us.

Verse 3: He has subdued peoples to us, and nations under our feet (Ps 46:4).

Refrain: Through the prayers of the Mother of God O Saviour, save us.

Verse 4: God ascended amid shouts of joy; the Lord, at the sound of the trumpet (Ps 46:6).

Third Antiphon:

We sing the usual Third Antiphon, but with the festal refrain:

Troparion (*Tone 4*): You ascended in glory, O Christ our God, giving joy to Your disciples by the promise of the Holy Spirit, and assuring them through your blessing that You are the Son of God, the Redeemer of the world.

Troparion (*Tone 8*): Christ our God, You are glorified above all, You established our fathers as beacons on earth and through them guided all of us to the true faith. Glory to You, most compassionate Lord.

Kontakion (*Tone 8*): The apostles' preaching and the Fathers' doctrine confirmed the Church's one faith, and wearing the garment of truth woven from theology that descends on high, she rightly imparts the mystery of godliness* and sings its glory. *Now and for ever and ever. Amen.*

Epistle: A reading from the Acts of the Apostles' (Acts 20:16-18a, 28-38)

In those days, Paul had decided to sail past Ephesus, so as not to lose time in Asia, for he was eager to get to Jerusalem by the feast of Pentecost if at all possible. Paul sent word from Miletus to Ephesus, summoning the presbyters of that church. When they came to him he delivered this address: "keep watch over yourselves, and over the whole flock the Holy Spirit has given you to guard. Shepherd the church of God, which he has acquired at the price of his own blood. I know that when I am gone, savage wolves will come among you who will not spare the flock. From your own number, men will present themselves distorting the truth and leading astray any who follow them. Be on guard, therefore. Do not forget that for three years, night and day, I never ceased warning you individually even to the point of tears. I commend you now to the Lord, and to that gracious word of his which can enlarge you, and give you a share among all who are consecrated to him. Never did I set my heart on anyone's silver or gold or envy the way he dressed. You yourselves know that these hands of mine have served both my needs and those of my companions. I have always pointed out to you that it is by such hard work that you must help the weak. You need to recall the words of the Lord Jesus himself, who said 'There is more happiness in giving that receiving."

After this discourse, Paul knelt down with them all and prayed. They began to weep without restrain, throwing their arms around him and kissing him, for they were deeply distressed to hear that they would never see his face again. Then they escorted him to the ship.

Alleluia (Tone 1): The God of gods, the Lord, spoke and summoned the earth from the rising of the sun to its setting (Ps 49:1). Gather to Him His devout ones, who with sacrifice make covenant with Him (Ps 49:5).

Gospel: (John 17:1-13)

At that time, Jesus looked up to heaven and said: "Father, the hour has come! Give glory to your Son that your Son may give glory to you, inasmuch as you have given him authority over all people, that he may bestow eternal life on those you gave him. (Eternal life is this: to know you, the only true God, and him you have sent, Jesus Christ.) I have given you glory on earth by finishing the work you gave me to do. Do you now, Father, give me glory at your side, a glory I had with you before the world existed. I have made your name known to those you gave me out of the world. These men you gave me were yours; they have kept your word. Now they realize that all that you gave me comes from you.

I entrusted to them the message you entrusted to me, and they received it. They have known that in truth I came from you, they have believed it was you who sent me. For these I pray – not for the world but for these you have given me, for they are really yours. (Just as all that belongs to me is yours, so all that belongs to you is mine.) It is in them that I have been glorified.

I am in the world no more, but these are in the world as I come to you. O Father most holy, protect them with your name which you have given me (that they may be one, even as we are one). As long as I with them, I guarded them with your name which you gave me. I kept careful watch, and none one of them was lost, none but him who was destined to be lost – in fulfillment of Scripture. Now, however, I come to you: I say all this while I am still in the world that they may share my joy completely.

Instead of "It is truly...": O my soul, magnify the Lord who in glory ascended bodily into the heavens.

Irmos (Tone 5): O Mother of God, you transcended both mind and word, and in time, ineffably bore the Timeless One: it is you who, with one accord, we, the faithful magnify.

Communion Verses: Praise the Lord from the heavens; praise Him in the highest (*Ps 148:1*). Rejoice in the Lord, O you just; praise befits the righteous (*Ps 32:1*). Alleluia! (*3x*)

Instead of "We have seen the true light..." Be exalted, O God, above the heavens; above all the earth be Your glory (Ps 56:6). "May our mouths be filled..." Be exalted, O God, above the heavens; above all the earth be Your glory (3x)

"Blessed be the Name of the Lord..." Be exalted, O God, above the heavens; above all the earth be Your glory (3x).

At the conclusion of every Divine Liturgy, we say an additional prayer for peace in Ukraine, and healing of the World let us pray: Our Father ... Hail Mary ... Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Коли ж вони прийшли до нього, він до них промовив: «Ви знаєте, як з першого дня, коли я вступив у Азію, увесь час поводився я з вами. Зважайте на самих себе й на все стадо, над яким Дух Святий поставив вас єпископами, щоб пасли Церкву Божу, що її він придбав кров'ю власною. Я знаю, що по моїм відході ввійдуть поміж вас вовки хижі, які не щадитимуть стада. Та й з-поміж вас самих повстануть люди, що говоритимуть погубні речі, щоб потягнути за собою учнів. У всьому я показав вам, що, так працюючи, треба допомагати слабосильним і пам'ятати слова Господа Ісуса, що сам сказав: «Більше щастя — давати, ніж брати.» Промовивши це, він упав на коліна і з усіма ними почав молитися.

Молю ж за них: не за світ молю, лише за тих, яких ти передав мені, бо вони — твої. І все моє — твоє, твоє ж — моє, і в них я прославився. Я вже більш не у світі, а вони у світі, і я до тебе йду. Отче Святий! Заради імени твого бережи їх, тих, що їх ти мені



передав, щоб були одно, як ми! Бувши з ними у світі, я беріг їх у твоє ім'я; тих, яких ти передав мені, я їх стеріг, і ніхто з них не пропав, лише син загибелі, щоб збулося Писання. Тепер же іду до тебе, і кажу те, у світі бувши, щоб вони могли ділитися моєю радістю вповні»



If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.

Pastoral and Sacramental Ministry:

Baptisms: by appointment. **Marriages**: six months' notice should be given to the parish priest, and he should be contacted before any other arrangements are made. **Reconciliation**: by appointment.

Holy Communion: for the sick, by appointment, any time, **Holy Unction** (Anointing of the Sick): Those anticipating surgery, hospitalization or treatments and who would like to receive anointing (by appointment, any time), **Funerals and Memorials**: by appointment.



Fight against hunger is both human and divine, Vatican webinars insist

ROME – As part of its own "Laudato si' Week" being celebrated May 16-24, but also with the hope of influencing an upcoming UN Food Systems Pre-Summit in Rome in July, the Vatican is presenting a series of webinars on food for all.

Given that, according to the UN's World Food Program, some 957 million people across 93 countries don't have enough to eat, Father Augusto Zampini from the Vatican office organizing the webinars is convinced that raising awareness of the problem, trying

to mobilize those who can help, is part of the Church's mission.

"Some might ask, 'Why are you working on this?' and it's both because of the crisis and the opportunity of the crisis," he told *Crux* over the phone Friday evening. "It's also a question of spirituality: If you think about it, the center of our faith, the Eucharist, was instituted in a supper. Every single religion has a rite or something that comprises food or a meal, more so for Christians, who believe that Christ is the bread of life."

"Because of the crisis, because of the opportunity of the crisis, and because it's intrinsically linked to our faith," said Zampini, adjunct secretary of the Vatican's Dicastery for Integral Human Development and a member of the COVID-19 commission. "This is why we're so invested on this issue, more so than in previous years."

The three webinars- May 17, 26 and 31- are being organized in conjunction by the Holy See's Secretary of State and its permanent mission to the UN's Food and Agriculture Organization, International Fund for Agricultural Development and World Food Program, as well as the Vatican's COVID-19 Commission and the Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development.

The webinar series, called "Food for life, food justice, food for all," is inspired by Pope Francis' 2015 encyclical letter *Laudato si'*, and organizers hope it will showcase how an integral ecology – considering the interconnections, among other things, between social systems and ecosystems – can inspire a regeneration of food systems in the post-COVID future.

The COVID-19 pandemic has "exacerbated all of our social problems, including inequality, and comprising food insecurity," Zampini said, noting that estimate warn that more people will die due to food-caused issues this year than due to COVID, malaria, dengue, and other diseases.

"The food chain has been disrupted," he said. This means that millions globally are affected, and an "immense wave of famine" is expected. This is particularly problematic because famine has long-lasting impact in societies, particularly when it comes to the development of children aged 0-5.

"When famine strikes, there's no going back," Zampini said. "We have to prevent famine."

Though the United Nations organizes a world summit every year – the next is scheduled for New York in September, following the pre-summit in Rome – this year the disruption of access to food is such that even countries "that are 'fighting' against one another for different reasons have agreed to form a food coalition, including the United States, Russia, China," he said.

The priest is hopeful when it comes to preventing a "disaster," and also at the opportunity that the crisis presents to "reimagine the agricultural system that we have, which is unfair, unequal and environmentally unsustainable."

According to a statement released this week, the hope is that the three conversations, that will privilege the voices of women, indigenous communities, people living in crisis settings and small-scale farmers, will "highlight how Church and other actors can contribute to this transformation of food systems towards the care for our common home, the eradication of hunger, the respect of human dignity and the service of the common good, so that no one is left behind."

The first webinar, titled "Food for Life: The role of women in the promotion of integral human development," will feature a dialogue about the unique role of women in development, with emphasis on how to support their leadership in shaping resilient food systems across the globe.

The second webinar, "Food Justice: Jobs, innovation, and finance at the service of food justice," will emphasize the importance of dignified work, finance and innovation in rebuilding sustainable food systems, particularly in the post-COVID future. The final webinar, titled "Food for All: Food conflicts and the future of food systems," will explore different responses to food conflicts, and how the Church can best contribute and collaborate to address hunger and food inequality around the world.

The various Vatican dicasteries, academies and offices putting together the webinars are aware that "we're not the saviors, nor do we have the political and technical solutions to address the crisis," Zampini said. "But the situation is so critical when it comes to food security, linked to the health security of COVID and the climate crisis, that international organizations and countries are too wondering how to cope."

"They're looking for religions to help, particularly the Church, because we're truly Catholic, meaning, we're present all over the world, and we're present on the ground," he said. "More than ever before, international organizations and countries have asked for our help, arguing that as things stand now, the world won't be able to reach the second Sustainable Development Goal, defeating global hunger."
