

For the Sundays of Great Fast-Lent the Typicon prescribes the Divine Liturgy of Saint Basil the Great

Epistle: A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Hebrews (Hebrews 1:10-2:3)

Brothers and Sisters, Scripture says: "Lord, of old you established the earth, and the heavens are the work of your hands. They will perish, but you remain; all of them will grow old like a garment. You will roll them up like a cloak, like a garment they will be changed. But you are the same, and your years will have no end." To which of the angels has God ever said, "Sit at my right hand till I make your enemies your footstool?" Are they not all ministering



spirits, sent to serve those who are to inherit salvation? In view of this, we must attend all the more to what we have heard, lest we drift away. For if the word spoken through angels stood unchanged, and all transgression and disobedience received its due punishment, how shall we escape if we ignore a salvation as great as ours? Announced first by the Lord, it was confirmed to us by those who had heard him.

Gospel: (Mark 2:1-12)

At that time, Jesus came back to Capernaum after a lapse of several days and word got around that he was at home. At that they began to gather in great numbers. There was no longer any room for them, even around the door.

While he was delivering God's word to them, some people arrived bringing a paralyzed man to him. The four who carried him were unable to bring him to Jesus because of the crowd, so they began to open up the roof over the spot where Jesus was. When they had made a hole, they let down the mat on which the paralytic was lying. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralyzed man, "My son, your sins are forgiven." Now some of the scribes were sitting there asking themselves: "Why does the man talk in that way? He commits blasphemy! Who can forgive sins except God alone?

Jesus was immediately aware of their reasoning, though they kept it to themselves, and he said to them: "Why do you harbour these thoughts? Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Stand up, pick up your mat, and walk again?' That you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins" (he said to the paralyzed man), "I command you: Stand up!

Pick up your mat and go home." The man stood and picked up his mat and went outside in the sight of everyone. They were awestruck; all gave praise to God, saying, "We have never seen anything like this!"

Instead of "It is truly…": In you, O Full of Grace, all creation rejoices: the angelic ranks and all the human race. Sanctified temple and spiritual paradise, virgins' pride and boast, from whom God is made flesh and became a little Child; and He who is our God before the ages, He made your womb a throne, and He made it wider than all the heavens. In you, O Full of Grace, all creation rejoices. Glory be to you

At the conclusion of every Divine Liturgy, we say an additional prayer for peace in Ukraine until the end of the war and for peace in the World: Our Father ... Hail Mary ... Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.

https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/covid-19/info/restrictions#worship-services Starting March 11, 2022 at 12:01 am, because of B.C.'s lowered hospitalization and transmission rates, these activities can return to normal:

Masks no longer required in public indoor settings under a public health order Masks are encouraged on public transit and BC Ferries, but not required

Individual businesses and event organizers can choose to continue requiring masks on their premises

Masks are still required for federally regulated travel, like air travel

No restrictions on worship service capacity

Overnight camps for children and youth allowed

By March 18, there will be no visitor limits at long-term care and seniors' assisted living facilities.

When K to 12 schools return from spring break, masks will no longer be required for students, staff and visitors.

On April 8, 2022 at 12:01 am, further restrictions will be lifted:

traveling, working or studying, nursing and senior homes, seeking God's answer to their prayers or those rejoicing with God's answer; your spiritual fathers, those celebrating birthdays and anniversaries; those called to their eternal reward and for the family they leave behind; widows and widowers, orphans, homeless, those who love us and those who hate, use & hurt us; and all people who have asked us pray for them. Please, also in your kindness keep praying those daily for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Remember to ask for special blessings to all Christian families and yourselves! **REMINDER** for families of individuals, who are admitted to hospital - If you or a family member is admitted to hospital and you wish to have a priest visit, please be sure to have someone call our parish rectory office to make this request. Your pastor may have no other way of knowing that you are in hospital, as privacy legislation.

<u>SPIRIT OF CHRISTIAN AWARENESS</u>: Dear parishioners, if our brother or sister in Christ, who usually sits next to you, is not in the Church today, please phone him / her and ask how he / she is doing. Let him or her know that our parish community misses his or her at the church very much and prays for them daily! We also pray for the people of Ukraine, that with the help of the Holy Spirit, they may obtain social peace, political harmony and economic stability: Lord, hear us and have mercy.

Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion: You are a member of the Catholic Church (faithful of the Orthodox churches are very welcome to receive Holy Communion); 2) You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; 3) You attend Divine Services regularly; 4) Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; 5) You have kept the Liturgical fast – no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). 6) You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel. 7) To the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace. If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.

<u>Pastoral and Sacramental Ministry</u>: Baptisms: by appointment. Marriages: six months' notice should be given to the parish priest, and he should be contacted before any other arrangements are made. Reconciliation: by appointment. Holy Communion: for the sick, by appointment, any time. Holy Unction (Anointing of the Sick): Those anticipating surgery, hospitalization or treatments and who would like to receive anointing (by appointment, any time). Funerals and Memorials: by appointment.

YOUR PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY AND RESPECT OF OTHERS: After each Divine Liturgy and every church service, please, keep silence in the House of the Lord as some of the faithful are still praying at the church as well. In consideration of other Christians at the church house of prayer to the Lord Our Almighty and Omnipresent God, please do not leave any items! in the pews. Always love, pray and be respectful toward other people! Let each of us do our part to be true stewards of our parish church by helping to keep the church building safe and cleant. Thank you very much for your understanding, help and care! Please always remember that we come together to the church to glorify Lord Our God and spiritually grow as a Christian community and church as house of prayer helps us during our temporal life journey.

BE A STEWARD: Have you ever wondered what more can you do to help our parish-church? Here are some suggestions: Steward of property security; Steward of grounds cleaning; Steward of cleaning church; Steward of church linen; Steward of outreach; Steward of caring; Steward of prayer; Steward of service. Quite often, our homebound or senior members, once active in their younger years, want to find purpose in their senior years. It's not only about doing but about "BEING" present to others! Vice-Chairperson is elected at the Annual General Meeting. He/She is presiding at the all Parish Council Meetings in the absence of the Chairperson; carrying out such duties as are assigned by the Parish Council, the Chairperson or Pastor.

Recording Secretary is elected at the Annual General Meeting. He/She is keeping the minutes of all Parish Council Meetings; together with the Pastor and the Chairperson signs the adopted minutes of the Council.

Financial Secretary is elected at the Annual General Meeting. He/She is monitoring all funds received by the parish and ensure that all such funds are doposited in the parish bank account; keeping accurate records of all income and expenditures; keeps in in order and preserves documents, records and books of parish finances. He/She is a signing officer, together with the pastor, for property approved financial transactions. He/She presents at the AGM the statements of income and expences, as well as the balance sheet, for the calendar year as prepared by him or her or, where necessary, by an independent accounting firm.

Treasurer is elected at the Annual General Meeting. He/She is greatly helping the financial secretary to monitor all funds received by the parish and ensure that all such funds are doposited in the parish bank account; keeping accurate records of all income and expenditures (paying all invoices-bills and reimbursements); keeps in in order and preserves documents, records and books of parish finances. He/She is a signing officer, together with the pastor, for property approved financial transactions.

It is also very important, vibrant and vital for our Christian community-family to have active and carrying representatives (a leader and helpers) at different Parish Committees such as: Liturgical, Spiritual Care, Educational, Children Ministry, Youth Ministry, Senior Ministry, Decoration / Beautification, Maintenance, Kitchen, Social / Public Relations.

How will I Make this Lent (Great Fast) Really Great?

Great Lent is upon us. We use the terms Lent, Great Lent, and Great Fast interchangeably. This year it begins on Feb 15 (Mar 15 Julian Calendar). During this time we are encouraged to take forty days to prepare ourselves, and our families, so as to be spiritually ready, and worthy to celebrate and worship the Resurrection – April 17 according to Gregorian Calendar (April 24 according to Julian Calendar). We are encouraged to fast, pray more, and to practice intentional charity(almsgiving). Here are some resources and suggestions which can help guide us in our journey.

- Increase Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving:
- Almsgiving, along with prayer and fasting make up the three-legged stool, which holds us up in our Lenten journey. These three when practiced together help to open our hearts to the Lord, so we may be touched by divine grace.
- If you have a family, speak with your spouse, and children about your expectations for Great Lent and decide as a family what you will do to increase your prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.
- It is a beautiful and encouraged practice to set aside the money we save from fasting during Great Lent. The money saved by not going out for lunch or supper, eating simpler and less each day can be donated to those in need.
- Consider sacrificing by increasing your donations at your parish, either in general or for a special project.
- Be purposeful about making the extra time to pray and to listen to God. Give yourself a few minutes to read the Holy Scriptures
 and contemplate the coming day before setting off to work and school. You can sign up to get short daily readings and
 reflections from Royal doors at https://royaldoors.net/
- Read the lives of the saints, the Psalter (psalms), or a book on prayer. There is some suggested Lenten reading material down below.
- Get the calendar of your parish or check out live-streamed services and plan to attend as a family. Consider attending the Canon of St. Andrew (this is good for both the body and soul!), the Liturgy of Presanctified Gifts, Sorokousty, or Vespers.
- Start your Lenten journey on the right foot with forgiveness. Some parishes will offer Forgiveness Vespers, on the evening of Cheesefare Sunday, or will attach the forgiveness service to the end of the Sunday Divine Liturgy. You could also call family, friends and those who we may have offended and ask forgiveness.

Make a Good Confession:

- Take time to thoroughly examine your heart and soul. Here is a helpful guide as we face our conscience:

Other Suggestions:

- Turn off the television for all of Great Lent. If you can't do that, pick only certain times or days you will watch.

- Watch Christian Videos with your children. You can borrow DVDs from the Eparchial Catechetical Resource centre (Give us a call (780) 424-5496)
- Get to know some of the saints by watching these short informative videos here: https://eeparchy.com/saints/
- Set a limit on the amount of time you will spend in front of a screen and the internet each day outside of work—this includes cell phones.
- Take a break from Facebook Twitter or Instagram or at least take them off your phone so that they are not readily available.
- Turn off the radio in the car and enjoy the quiet or download Christian Podcasts or prayers. Find some here: <u>Between the Pews, Bible in a Year, https://eeparchy.com/catholic-prayer/</u>
- Renew or start a new hobby. Hobbies or crafts can help us feel inspired, keep our hands busy and give us an opportunity for a break. You can listen to your Christian Podcasts while you do! The <u>Jesus Prayer</u> would be great for this.
- Set aside family time:
 - Eat dinner together.

- Attend church services together.
- Play board games together.
- Read together: Holy Scripture and other Christ centered books. Many are available to borrow or buy from the Edmonton Eparchy Pastoral centre. (Give us a call (780) 424-5496)
- Check out "The Zaccheaus Tree" by Lynne Drozdich Wardach. It is a great family resource available through <u>Macrina bookstore</u>. This contains daily Scripture readings, prayers, and crafts that bring the season of the Great Fast home for kids (and parents).
- Suggested Adult Readings for Great Lent:

Agency works to coordinate Ukraine relief efforts by Catholic groups

ROME – When it comes to helping migrants and refugees fleeing conflicts, few have the experience of the Geneva-based International Catholic Migration Commission (ICMC).

Through a coordinated response in collaboration with the bishops' conferences around the world, ICMC provides assistance and protection to vulnerable people on the move and advocates for sustainable solutions for refugees and migrants.



Founded in 1951 by Pope Pius XII, it is currently headed by Monsignor Robert Vitillo, who told *Crux* that the current exodus from Ukraine is arguably the fastest growing migration crisis in the world since World War II.

"I think that we can very safely say this is the largest situation of refugees and displaced people in Europe since World War II," he said. "And it's an interesting thing because as soon as we were founded, we became involved in helping the many refugees of the war who couldn't go back to their own countries, so we helped them get resettled in the Americas, Australia and other parts of the world."


"We're trying to share information with the bishops' conferences and be of help to them," he said. "Our office has launched a fundraising appeal among our private donors to ask them to support the work of the church in Ukraine and in the neighboring countries that are receiving the refugees."

They have also been working closely with Catholic organizations such as the Jesuit Refugee Service and Caritas to try to make sure the response is coordinated and carried out in a collaborative way, which ensures that resources are not wasted.

Vitillo also said that the ICMC is doing "global advocacy" at the United Nations and the European Union to try to guarantee ceasefires for humanitarian corridors so that people can escape to safety, but also for "fair" policies in receiving and welcoming refugees. "We were very pleased that the European Parliament has established temporary protection directives, so that persons coming from Ukraine could be received in those countries and be allowed to stay there for even up to three years if necessary," he said, pointing out that the United States took a similar path.

Ever since Russia invaded Ukraine Feb. 24, the ICMC has been gathering information from the Ukrainian bishops conference and those of neighboring countries, and working with the section for migrants and refugees at the Vatican's Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development, in an attempt to "get information directly from the first responders, who often are the local churches."

This exchange of information with international agencies is aimed at guaranteeing collaboration, and more importantly, that they

Some of the children's institutions moved to a safe zone, but now they are trying to see what's the best way to keep those children and their families safe. Many needs are "surfacing" every day, hence the importance of Catholic organizations working in coordination, he said.

Vitillo also pointed out that there "has been a tremendous destruction in a very short time, not only the infrastructure, but especially the trauma and the suffering of the people," and praised the outpouring of solidarity. The fact that this is a war that is happening in Europe leads to many being moved because "it is close to home," but it is important that this solidarity continues because "we don't know how long this crisis will last."

On that note, he voiced concern over a single focus mentality, with the international community and the media focusing only on the ongoing war in Ukraine: "We shouldn't forget all of those other long-term situations of conflict, and

the terrible suffering of people throughout the world. It might be easier for the world's media to focus on Ukraine, but let's not forget all those others who are still suffering in Coming in Comi those others who are still suffering in Syria, in Yemen, and a long list of humanitarian emergencies."

Reflecting on Pope Francis' decision to send two cardinals to Ukraine, he argued that this "is a very significant step, especially because they are not simply going there to have diplomatic contacts, but, as the pope said, to listen to the refugees and their needs."

Quoting the pontiff's remarks after announcing that he would be sending Cardinals Konrad Krajewsky and Michael Czerny to the conflict zone, Vitillo pointed out that they are there not only to express the pope's closeness but "that of the entire Christian community." This means that all of us are called to do whatever we can to respond to this situation. It's very important that we pray for peace in this area and God could bring about that peace. But then we need to act, perhaps by making charitable donations to help those who are the first responders in those countries." Follow Inés San Martín on Twitter: @inesanma



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
