

If you would like to come to Confession, meet with the parish priest individually at the church or parish office, receive spiritual care and support via telephone or internet, want him to bless your home with annual traditional and pastoral blessings visiting you, your relatives or friends at their home, hospital or care homes, call or email the pastor in advance to arrange time and a day.

Do not be afraid to be holy! Have the courage and humility to present yourselves to the world determined to be holy, since full, true freedom is born from holiness.

Liturgical propers in English language:

Troparion (tone 8): You came down from on high, O Merciful One and accepted three days of burial to free us from our sufferings. O Lord, our life and our resurrection, glory be to You.

Troparion (tone 4): Clothed as in purple and fine linen with the blood of Your martyrs throughout the world, Your Church cries out to You through them, O Christ God: send down Your loving-kindness on Your people; grant peace to Your community, and to our souls great mercy.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Kontakion (tone 8): O Lord, Maker of nature, the world offers You the godly martyrs as the first fruits of nature. By their supplications, through the Mother of God, preserve Your Church and Your people in profound peace, O most merciful One.

Prokimenon (tone 8): Pray and give praise to the Lord our God (Ps 75:12).

Verse: In Judea God is known; His name is great in Israel (Ps 75:2).

Prokimenon (tone 4): God is wonderful in His saints, the God of Israel (*Ps* 67:36).

Epistle: A reading from the Letter of St. Paul to the Hebrews: (Heb. 11:33-12:2a)

Brothers and Sisters, by faith the saints conquered kingdoms, did what was just, obtained the promises; they broke the jaws of lions, put out raging fires, escaped the devouring sword; though weak they were made powerful, became strong in battle, and turned back foreign invaders. Woman received back their dead through resurrection. Others were tortured and would not receive deliverance, in order to obtain a better resurrection. Still others endured mockery, scourging, even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, sawed in two, put to death at sword's point; they went about garbed in the skins of sheep or goats, needy, afflicted, tormented. The world was not worthy of them. They wandered about in deserts and on mountains, they dwelt in caves and in holes of the earth. Yet despite the fact that all of these were approved because of their faith, they did not obtain what had been promised. God had made a better plan, a plan which includes us. Without us, they were not to be made perfect.

Therefore, since we for our part are surrounded by this cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every encumbrance of sin which clings to us and preserve in running the race which lies ahead; let us keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, who inspires and perfects our faith.

Alleluia (tone 4): The just cried out and the Lord heard them, and delivered them from all their afflictions (*Ps.* 33:18). The afflictions of the just are many, but out of them all will the Lord deliver them (*Ps.* 33:20). The heavens shall confess Your wonders, O Lord, and Your truth in the church of the saints (*Ps.* 88:6).

Gospel: (Matthew 10:32-33; 37-38; 19:27-30)

The Lord said to his disciples, "whoever acknowledges me before people I will acknowledge before my Father in heaven. Whoever disowns me before people I will disown before my Father in heaven. Whoever loves father or mother, son or daughter, more that me is not worthy of me. Whoever will not take up his or her cross and come after me is not worthy of me."

"Then it was Peter's turn to say to him: "Here we have put everything aside to follow you. What we can expect from it?" Jesus said to them: "I give you my solemn word, in the new age when the Son of Man takes his seat upon a throne befitting his glory, you who have followed me shall likewise take your places on twelve thrones to judge the twelve tribes of Israel. Moreover, everyone who has given up home, brothers or sisters, father or mother, wife or children or property for my sake will receive many times as much and inherit everlasting life. Many who are first shall come last, and the last shall come first.

<u>SPIRIT OF CHRISTIAN AWARENESS</u>: Dear parishioners, if our brother or sister in Christ, who usually sits next to you, is not in the Church today, please phone him / her and ask how he / she is doing. Let him or her know that our parish community misses his or her at the church very much and prays for them daily! We also pray for the people of Ukraine, that with the help of the Holy Spirit, they may obtain social peace, political harmony and economic stability: Lord, hear us and have mercy.

Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion: You are a member of the Catholic Church (faithful of the Orthodox churches are very welcome to receive Holy Communion); 2) You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; 3) You attend Divine Services regularly; 4) Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; 5) You have kept the Liturgical fast – no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). 6) You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel. 7) To the best of your ability, you are in

From the Head of the UGCC on the 105th day of the war: Ukraine today is like a woman giving birth to a child in pain



Today Ukraine is in pain. Ukraine is crying and suffering, Ukraine is wounded. But we ask the Holy Spirit to transform our pain, our suffering, into suffering for hope. His Beatitude Sviatoslav, the Father and Head of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church said in his daily address on the 105th day of Russia's bloody war against Ukraine.

Although the entire front line is on fire, the Primate notes, our warriors, who we owe the sunlight this morning, show miracles of courage. The Ukrainian soul, the Ukrainian force is strengthening and victory is approaching.

The Head of the Church stressed that the situation is becoming critical for the civilian population of Kherson region. "It is almost impossible to help with delivering food and medicine there. This territory is as isolated as Ukraine was during the Holodomor. Getting out of there is also becoming

extremely difficult. Many people are doomed by the enemy to a slow death," said the spiritual leader.

Today, according to him, we are experiencing the sixth day of the Missionary Decade, that is, we are moving day by day towards the Feast of the Descent of the Holy Spirit and await the arrival of the Third Person of the Holy Trinity, the only one whom we can trust. And today the Word of God speaks to us of pain as hope. At the Last Supper, the Lord said to his disciples: A woman giving birth to a child has pain because her time has come; but when her baby is born she forgets the anguish because of her joy that a child is born into the world. "We ask the Holy Spirit to make our struggle genuinely nurture the hope of the birth of a renewed Ukraine," the Head of the Church wished.

Meeting with women who lost their loved ones in the war, the Primate noted, one can really hear from them a prayer that the sacrifice of their husbands, sons and daughters was not be in vain. When we meet our soldiers, especially the wounded, we feel that they are ready to continue to suffer, to continue to suffer in order to save lives.

"And the person who comes into the world in pain, who is renewed in these military sufferings, gives meaning to everything that we are experiencing today. It is so important, say the mothers of our fallen heroes, that their children did not sacrifice their lives in vain", he said.

"Today we ask, O Holy Spirit, give us hope, give us the joy of the encounter with a renewed person who is born in pain in the world," His Beatitude Sviatoslav asked.



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
