

Liturgical propers in English language:

Troparion (tone 1): Though the stone was sealed by the Judeans,* and soldiers guarded Your most pure body,* You arose, O Saviour, on the third day,* and gave life to the world.* And so the heavenly powers cried out to You, O Giver of Life:* Glory to Your resurrection, O Christ!* Glory to Your kingdom!* Glory to Your saving plan,* O only Lover of mankind.

Troparion (tone 1): As we know you to be Christ's relative* and a steadfast martyr,* O Jude, we praise you with sacred hymns.* You trampled on error and kept the faith.* And so on this day as we feast your memory* through your prayers, O apostle,* we receive release from our sins.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.

Kontakion (tone 1): You arose in glory from the tomb* and with Yourself You raised the world.* All humanity acclaims You as God,* and death has vanished.* Adam exults, O Master,* and Eve, redeemed now from bondage, cries out for joy:* "You are the One, O Christ, Who offer resurrection to all."

Now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Kontakion (tone 2): O Jude, because of your solid mind* you were shown to be a chosen disciple and firm pillar of the Church of Christ.* You proclaimed to the nations His holy word* teaching them to believe in the one God* from Whom you received glory and the gift of healing* to cure the ills of those who flee to you.* O apostle, worthy of all praise.

Prokeimenon (tone 1): Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us, as we have hoped in You.

Verse: Rejoice in the Lord, O you just; praise befits the righteous. (Psalm 32:22,1)

Prokeimenon (tone 8): Their utterance has gone forth into all the earth, and their word unto the ends of the world. (Psalm 18:5)

Epistle: Romans 2:10-16 (NRSV)\

Brothers and Sisters, glory and honor and peace for everyone who does good, the Jew first and also the Greek. For God shows no partiality. All who have sinned apart from the law will also perish apart from the law, and all who have sinned under the law will be judged by the law. For it is not the hearers of the law who are righteous in God's sight, but the doers of the law who will be justified. When Gentiles, who do not possess the law, do instinctively what the law requires, these, though not having the law, are a law to themselves. They show that what



the law requires is written on their hearts, to which their own conscience also bears witness; and their conflicting thoughts will accuse or perhaps excuse them on the day when, according to my gospel, God, through Jesus Christ, will judge the secret thoughts of all.

Jude 1:1-10 (NRSV)

Jude, a servant of Jesus Christ and brother of James, to those who are called, who are beloved in God the Father and kept safe for Jesus Christ: May mercy, peace, and love be yours in abundance. Beloved, while eagerly preparing to write to you about the salvation we share, I find it necessary to write and appeal to you to contend for the faith that was once for all entrusted to the saints. For certain intruders have stolen in among you, people who long ago were designated for this condemnation as ungodly, who pervert the grace of our God into licentiousness and deny our only Master and Lord, Jesus Christ.

Now I desire to remind you, though you are fully informed, that the Lord, who once for all saved a people out of the land of Egypt, afterward destroyed those who did not believe. And the angels who did not keep their own position, but left their proper dwelling, he has kept in eternal chains in deepest darkness for the judgment of the great day. Likewise, Sodom and Gomorrah and the surrounding cities, which, in the same manner as they, indulged in sexual immorality and pursued unnatural lust, serve as an example by undergoing a punishment of eternal fire.

Yet in the same way these dreamers also defile the flesh, reject authority, and slander the glorious ones. But when the archangel Michael contended with the devil and disputed about the body of Moses, he did not dare to bring a condemnation of slander against him, but said, "The Lord rebuke you!" But these people slander whatever they do not understand, and they are destroyed by those things that, like irrational animals, they know by instinct.

Alleluia (tone 1): God gives me vindication, and has subdued people under me. (*Ps. 17:48*) Making great the salvation of the king, and showing mercy to His anointed, to David, and to His posterity forever. (*Ps. 17:51*) The heavens shall confess our wonders, O Lord, and Your truth in the church of the saints. (*Ps. 88:6*)

Gospel: Matthew 4:18-23 (NRSV)

At that time, when Jesus walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea—for they were fishermen. And he said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fish for people." Immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John, in the boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. Immediately they left the boat and their father, and followed him. Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.

John 14:21-24 (NRSV)

The Lord said to his disciples, they who have my commandments and keep them are those who love me; and those who love me will be loved by my Father, and I will love them and reveal myself to them." Judas (not Iscariot) said to him, "Lord, how is it that you will reveal yourself to us, and not to the world?" Jesus answered him, "Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; and the word that you hear is not mine, but is from the Father who sent me.

Апостол: (Рм 2,10-16):

Браття і Сестри, слава ж і честь, і мир усякому, хто чинить добро: юдеєві перше, а потім грекові, бо Бог не вважає на особу. Бо ті, що згрішили поза законом, поза законом і згинуть; а ті, що згрішили під законом, будуть суджені законом. Бо не слухачі закону справедливі перед Богом, а виконавці закону оправдаються. Бо коли погани, що не мають закону, з природи виконують те, що законне, вони, не мавши закону, самі собі закон; вони виявляють діло закону, написане в їхніх серцях, як свідчить їм їхнє сумління і думки, то засуджуючи їх, то оправдуючи, — в день, коли Бог, згідно з моєю Євангелією, судитиме тайні вчинки людей через Ісуса Христа.

Юд. 1, 1-10

Юда, слуга Ісуса Христа, брат Якова, покликаний, любим у Бозі Отці і збереженим для Ісуса Христа: хай милосердя, мир і любов будуть у вас повні. Мої любі, я пильно старався писати вам про наше спільне спасіння і вважаю за конечне написати вам, щоб заохотити вас боротися за віру, раз назавжди передану святим. Бо до вас крадькома вдерлися деякі людці, що були здавна призначені на засуд: безбожні, які з благодаті Бога нашого роблять розпусту і відрікаються від нашого єдиного Владики й Господа Ісуса Христа. Хочу нагадати вам, хоч знаєте все, що Господь, визволивши людей з Єгипетського краю, згодом видав на погибіль тих, які не вірували. І ангелів, що не зберегли свого достоїнства й покинули житло, зберіг у кайданах вічних, під темрявою, на суд великого дня. Так само Содома й Гомора з сусідніми містами, які, подібно до них, були запродалися розпусті і протиприродній похоті, лежать як приклад, скарані вічним огнем. Отак і ці, також у маячінні, бруднять тіло, відкидають владицтво і зневажають світлості. І тоді, як сам архангел Михаїл, змагаючись із дияволом і сперечаючись із ним про тіло Мойсея, не наважився винести зневажливого суду, але сказав: нехай тебе Господь судить, ції зневажають те, чого не знають; а те, що, немов та нерозумна звірина, з природи знають, те їх губить.

Алилуя (глас 1): Бог, що дає відплату мені, і покорив народи мені (Пс 18,48). Ти, що звеличуєш спасіння царя, і даєш милість помазаннику Своєму Давидові і родові його повіки (Пс 18,51). Ісповідять небеса чуда Твої, Господи, і істину Твою в церкві святих (Пс. 88,6).

Євангеліє: (Мт 4,18-23)

Ідучи попри Галилейське море, Ісус побачив двох братів: Симона, що звався Петром, і Андрія, його брата, що закидали сіті у море, бо були рибалки. І до них мовив: "Ідіть за мною, я вас зроблю рибалками людей." І ті негайно кинули сіті й пішли за ним. Пройшовши звідтіль далі, побачив інших двох братів: Якова, сина Заведея, та Йоана, його брата, що в човні з батьком Заведеєм лагодили свої сіті, і їх покликав. Вони зараз же, кинувши човна і свого батька, пішли слідом за ним. І ходив Ісус по всій Галилеї, навчаючи по їхніх синагогах, звіщаючи Добру Новину про Царство й вигоюючи всяку хворобу й всяку недугу в народі

Йоан 14, 21-24.

Хто має мої заповіді й береже їх, той мене любить. Хто ж мене любить, того мій Отець любитиме, і я його любитиму, і об'явлюся йому. Юда ж, не Іскаріот, каже йому: Господи, як воно, що ти не світові, а нам об'явишся? Saint Jude Thaddeus: Patron Saint of the Impossible

When I was a young girl, my grandmother kept a statue of St. Jude on her dresser. Since few things adorned her room, St. Jude was prominent there. She had a special love for him, and lived out her devotion in such a way that her family learned it, too. It was many years ago, but I can still see her statue in my mind's eye.

St. Jude has always been a special saint for my family, and for families around the world. But who exactly is this miraculous intercessor known as the "Patron Saint of the Impossible?"

St. Jude and His Cousin...Jesus. Opinions vary as to St. Jude's relationship to Christ, but he is generally thought to have been a cousin of Our Lord and the brother of St. James the Less. Regardless of their exact relationship, we know that St. Jude was a close relative and trusted friend of our Redeemer.

Jude walked with Jesus and the other Apostles as a companion and friend. He learned the truths of the Gospel on the dusty roads of Galilee. His formation by Our Lord prepared him to take the Gospel to Mesopotamia (now known as Iraq), Libya, Persia and Turkey.

Around 37 A.D. Jude became the leader of the Eastern Church established in Mesopotamia by St. Thomas the Apostle. He is believed to have assisted in founding the Church in Armenia; he also travelled extensively beyond the borders of the Roman Empire in his lifetime.

The Book of Jude in the New Testament is attributed to him. In it, we see his leadership role among the early Christians. He calls the faithful to a true Christian life of great devotion, one in which they hold fast to their faith no matter the consequences. He exhorts them to pray in the Spirit, that they might deepen their faith, hope, and love, and come to know God and His will. St. Jude had a tender love for Christ and desired to make Him known and loved.

Another instance that witnesses to Jude's powerful intercession is the story of a miraculous healing. According to one account, the King of Edessa sent an envoy to the Christian community, hoping that Jesus would heal him from an illness. Jude visited the King, bringing with him a cloth imprinted with the image of Christ's face. It is believed that this cloth healed the King of his illness. This is why St. Jude is often pictured holding an image of Christ's face.

The Patron of Desperate Causes. Jesus instructed both St. Bridget of Sweden and St. Bernard, in visions, to pray to St. Jude and honour him as "the Patron Saint of the Impossible."

In a vision recorded by St. Bridget, Christ told her: "In accordance with his surname, Thaddeus, the amiable or loving, he will show himself most willing to give you help."

After the Ascension of Jesus, St. Jude travelled, preached, instructed, and encouraged the persecuted Christians. Until he was martyred in Persia, around 65 A.D., he exhorted believers to stand strong in their faith. The loss of his presence was such a cause for despair in Christian communities that some historians think it might be another explanation for his patronage of desperate causes.

It could also be explained by a misplaced fear the early Christians had of praying to Jude, who shared a name with Judas Iscariot: "So why is St. Jude Thaddaeus the patron saint of desperate causes? The traditional reason is rather simple: When one hears the name Judas (Latin and Greek) or even Jude (English), one immediately thinks of Judas Iscariot who betrayed our Lord. Therefore, a person had to be desperate to invoke his name. Being so seldom invoked and reverenced, St. Jude is ready and waiting to hear the prayers of those who call upon him. Ironically, he is probably the Apostle who is invoked the most in prayer, and the most memorialized in churches with statues or other artwork." —Father William P. Saunders

This also explains why the Gospel writers would have been anxious to distinguish him from the Iscariot by affirming that he was "Judas Thaddeus."

Regardless of the precise historical details, many began praying at his tomb and experiencing the gift of his intercession and healing. This further confirmed his presence and power before the throne of God. His body was eventually brought back to Rome and placed in a crypt below St. Peter's Basilica, where it resides today.

An Intercessor in Financial Hardship. St. Jude has shown his gentle and loving presence in my life throughout many trials and struggles. From the time I was a little girl—looking up at him as he stood faithfully on my grandmother's dresser—until now, almost fifty years later, he remains especially beloved. I have called on him many times when in need of great hope and support.

Here is one example of how he helped me: about ten years ago, my husband lost his job. He was unemployed for several years. It was a difficult time in our family in almost every way imaginable. We had two young children and were expecting our third. The longer he went without employment the more challenging it became, and the more bleak it seemed. I tucked one of my grandmother's St. Jude holy cards into my prayer book, and laid my petitions in his hands.

One day during this difficult time, I received a small box in the mail. The return address was unfamiliar. The box contained an exquisite, hand-made St. Jude Chaplet, accompanied by a card printed with roses and scalloped lace.

The card read: "This Saint Jude Chaplet was requested as a gift for you by a dear friend of yours who wishes to remain anonymous. It has been a pleasure to craft this Chaplet for you. St. Jude grant every blessing to your family and you, now and always."

I was so touched by the beautiful gift and its timing that writing about it now, almost ten years later, moves me to tears. At that time, my husband had been without a job for nearly three painful years. I didn't know the St. Jude Chaplet, but I read about it and prayed it. Within three weeks my husband found a job. Thank you, St. Jude!

A Consoler in Illness and Suffering. About four years after St. Jude helped my husband, one of my teenagers was diagnosed with a life-threatening illness. She could no longer attend school and we decided to try home-schooling between treatments and surgeries. Doctors told us that her illness was incurable. I told them, "The diagnosis belongs to you, but the prognosis belongs to God alone." I began to pray again to our faithful spiritual companion, St. Jude.

While completing the paperwork to register our home school, I asked my daughter what we should name it. She answered sweetly, "St. Jude Homeschool, because he is the patron saint of desperate causes."

As we opened the doors to St. Jude Homeschool, we also opened our hearts to God's will, and tried to focus on His love. I knew he would be interceding for my daughter.

After our local hospital declined to treat our daughter because of the severity of her condition, we took her to Baltimore, Maryland, where another hospital agreed to treat her. There her wonderful doctor told me, "We will bring all of our creativity to bear, and we will tell you when we cannot help you any longer." At least it was something. It was hope. It was something to entrust to Our Lord, Our Lady, and our many friends among the saints. Especially St. Jude.

We spent almost seventeen months in Baltimore. Our daughter underwent thirteen rounds of treatment and four surgeries. It was exhausting beyond anything I could have imagined.

One day, my husband stumbled upon the St. Jude Shrine in Baltimore. It was within walking distance of our room at the Ronald McDonald House. We were only a few blocks away! Again, St. Jude had made himself known. He seems to take special delight in aiding desperate souls. What were the chances that, in finding a hospital that would agree to treat our daughter despite her advanced diagnosis, we would be in the city of his Shrine? And within walking distance of it? There are no coincidences.

St. Jude Shrine in Baltimore, MD: The Shrine is a remarkable place. Masses and perpetual novenas take place daily. Catholics and non-Catholics alike visit to sit in quiet prayer. People come to the prayer room to light vigil candles and leave prayer petitions, notes of thanksgiving, and testimonials. Despite the desperation and seeming impossibilities, you can feel the hope.

My daughter has endured her illness heroically these last four and a half years. She has not received a physical healing, but healing can come to us in many forms, and is not always physical. The many prayers of faithful family and friends have strengthened her with courage and perseverance. Jesus and Our Lady have sustained her as she carries her heavy cross. The special protection of St. Jude has brought many graces to her situation. I continue to call on him as a special patron for this intention as well as others.

A Companion for My Journey and for Yours. This gentle Saint of Hope lived and died for Christ, enduring trials faithfully, giving his life for God and for his fellow Christians. When we are weighed down with trials and difficulties, devotion to St. Jude can give us the perseverance we need to embrace God's will. He can attain for us the strength, peace, and wisdom to move forward. We can go to him in prayer, knowing that no need is entirely desperate.

He is no ordinary advocate; he was the earthly companion of Jesus Himself. He spread hope and encouragement in the early Church during times of great trial, and he continues to do so today. St. Jude is the beloved friend of our Redeemer, eager to bring us into closer friendship with the Lord, especially during our sufferings.

Do not be afraid to go to him. Do not fear the "impossible," for nothing is impossible with God. Ask St. Jude to accompany you faithfully, as he did Christ, and see where he takes you.

St. Jude, patron saint of the Impossible, the Desperate, and the Hopeless, pray for us! Do you have an intention for St. Jude, or a story about his intercession? Share!

In today's world of half-truth and lies that pretend to be truth, reason, as a gift of the Holy Spirit, makes it possible not to succumb to this delusion and see the cause and consequences of events. It is especially important when it comes to the causes, motives and roots of Russia's open military aggression in Ukraine: the reason is the antidote to the propaganda and lies that Russia is flooding the world with, continuing to kill Ukrainians and threatening the world.

On June 15, the 112th day of the war, His Beatitude Sviatoslav, the Father and Head of the UGCC speaks about the need for the gift of understanding and seeing reality for all, and particularly for those who influences decision-making with further consequences for all mankind.

This day the Head of the UGCC again began with gratitude to the Lord and defenders of Ukraine, and recent updates about the events at the front, in particular, about the defense of Severodonetsk in Luhansk region:

Again, this morning we thank the Lord and the Armed Forces of Ukraine for seeing the light of day, for being able to survive until this day and through this last

night. Unfortunately, many people died in Ukraine. Again, according to reports we receive from various state authorities, about 100 servicemen die every day. And no one still knows how many civilians die every day, but their number is probably higher.

The legendary city of Severodonetsk in the Luhansk region is withstanding heroically, and it is becoming a city of heroes, a city of martyrs. Once an administrative center of Luhansk region with a population of one hundred thousands, today it is the epicenter of a huge confrontation. Russian troops are ten times more numerous than the Ukrainian military presence there. But our soldiers are bravely defending the city, defending this piece of Ukrainian Luhansk region.

Active hostilities are taking place along the entire front line, from the Kharkiv region to the Kherson region in the south. Ukraine stands! Ukraine is fighting! The enemy is persistently trying to intimidate us. Yesterday missile strikes wounded the western regions of Ukraine: Lviv, Ternopil and Khmelnytsky. However, Ukraine is successfully defending itself, which astonishes the world."

This week after Pentecost we go through a time when the liturgical tradition of the Church addresses the person of the Holy Spirit, His presence among us and His gifts to a person. His Beatitude Sviatoslav continues his reflection on the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, which he began yesterday. Today's reflections are on the gift of understanding:

This week, according to our tradition, we are experiencing a special week of Pentecost. Every day we praise the Holy Spirit, who once descended on the apostles in the form of tongues of fire, is present and alive today in the body of our Church.

Yesterday we began to reflect on the gifts of the Holy Ghost, including wisdom. Today I suggest contemplating another gift called understanding.

In the Ukrainian language, the word "understanding" has many meanings. The mind as a gift of the Holy Spirit is a special ability of a person to penetrate into the depths of reality, to distinguish the causes and consequences of various events, phenomena, and through them to contemplate the root cause of all that exists, lives and moves – God and Savior."

What is the understanding as a gift of the Holy Spirit for a modern man, in, so to speak, practical, not abstract or theological plane? That allows you not to be led astray, to distinguish between truth and lies, not to be deceived:

"This gift of the Holy Spirit is necessary in order not to allow oneself to be deceived by the devil's deceit. After all, we live in a world of fakes, world of wishful thinking; when untruth and falsehood pretends to be the only truth. It is important that today, with the help of this special gift of the Holy Spirit, we do not succumb to this discernible fog that the tempter wants to impose on us, but we can delve into reality and understand and know it correctly."


Sound mind and clear vision are necessary today for those who have a special responsibility for making decisions that have and will have very significant consequences, in particular, the world's comprehension of the causes of Russian aggression in Ukraine, according to the Head of UGCC:

"This gift is extremely necessary for those who have a special responsibility, perform important ministry in the Church, the state and society. In my opinion, understanding as a gift of the Holy Spirit is very much needed by those who are trying to understand the causes and consequences of this full-scale Russian aggression. Because we see that today they try to deceive the whole world, chasing wishful thinking. We see and know, experiencing the war on our own, that Russia's aggression against Ukraine is not provoked by anything.

Anyone who thinks that some external force has caused military aggression in Russia is either a prisoner of Russian propaganda or is simply deliberately deceiving the world."

The reasons for Russia's military aggression are in itself, in its nature, says the Head of the UGCC. Ukraine was the first to accept this blow, but it is obvious that it keeps it for the whole civilized world and its values:

"Unfortunately, that part of the post-Soviet space that is now in the territory of the Russian Federation has its deep flaws and diseases



since Soviet times. This post-Soviet revanchism, which today has emerged in the new face of extreme Russian nationalism, in the form of the ideology of the Russian world ("russkiy mir") has clearly acquired genocidal features. And Ukraine is his first victim.

That is why it is so important to understand the causes and consequences of this war. Unfortunately, the causes of this war lie in Russia itself, inside it. The Russian aggressor is trying to solve its internal problems with the help of external aggression. He projects his illnesses on others and blames the whole world for it."

"Today we pray for the gift of the Holy Spirit for politicians, diplomats, church and religious figures, that the Lord will give them the ability to see the causes and consequences of things, the depth of reality and the ability to distinguish truth from lies and falsehood," completed His Beatitude Sviatoslav, the Head of the UGCC.

усвідомити свої проблеми, свої падіння, свої немочі, але побачимо за тим Бога, як я вже казав, нас неминуче сповнить мир, радість і спокій. Тому ми маємо з любов'ю приймати і виконувати наші обов'язки. Бо коли ми з любов'ю їх приймаємо, як від Бога, то приймаємо самого Бога з Його волею. Коли не приймаємо то, не приймаємо Бога, ми віддаляємося від Бога, бо бачимо лише те, що нас гнітить. Ви розумієте, чому багато речей нас проймають, дратують, осуджуємо, не сприймаємо, критикуємо... Бо ми бачимо речі самі в собі, обов'язки самі в собі, обставини самі в собі, не бачимо за ними Бога. Але знову ж скажу, нічого не стається саме по собі, у всьому приходить до нас Господь.
