Epistle: A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Romans (Rm. 5:1-10)

Brethren, now that we have been justified by faith, we are at peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through Him we have gained access by faith to the grace in which we now stand, and we boast of our hope for the glory of God. But not only that – we even boast of our afflictions! We know that affliction makes for endurance, and endurance for tested virtue, and tested virtue for hope. And this hope will not leave us disappointed, because the love of God has been poured out in our hearts



through the Holy Spirit Who has been given to us. At the appointed time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for us, godless men. It is rare that anyone should lay down his life for a just man, though it is barely possible that for a good man someone may have the courage to die. It is precisely in this that God proves His love for us: that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

Gospel: (Matthew 6:22-33)

The Lord said: 'The eye is the body's lamp. If your eyes are good, your body will be filled with light; if your eyes are bad, your body will be in darkness. And if your light is darkness, how deep will the darkness be!

No man can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other or be attentive to one and despise the other. You cannot give yourself to God and money.

I warn you, then; do not worry about your livelihood, what you are to eat or drink or use for clothing. Is not life more than food? Is not the body valuable than clothes? Look at the birds in the sky. They do not sow or reap, they gather nothing into barns; yet your Heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not more important that they? Which of you by worrying can add a moment to his life-span? As for clothes, why be concerned? Learn a lesson from the way the wild flowers grow. They do not work; they do not spin. Yet I assure you, not even Solomon in all his splendour was arrayed like one of these. If God can clothe in such splendour the grass of the field, which blooms today and is thrown on the fire tomorrow, will He not provide much more for you, o weak in faith!

Stop worrying, then, over questions like, 'What are we to eat, or what are we to drink, or what are we to wear?' The unbelievers are always running after these things. Your Heavenly Father knows all that you need. Seek first His Kingship over you, His way of holiness, and all these things will be given you besides.

<u>SPIRIT OF CHRISTIAN AWARENESS</u>: Dear parishioners, if our brother or sister in Christ, who usually sits next to you, is not in the Church today, please phone him / her and ask how he / she is doing. Let him or her know that our parish community misses his or her at the church very much and prays for them daily! We also pray for the people of Ukraine, that with the help of the Holy Spirit, they may obtain social peace, political harmony and economic stability: Lord, hear us and have mercy.

Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion: You are a member of the Catholic Church (faithful of the Orthodox churches are very welcome to receive Holy Communion); 2) You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; 3) You attend Divine Services regularly; 4) Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; 5) You have kept the Liturgical fast – no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). 6) You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel. 7) To the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace. *If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.*

Pastoral and Sacramental Ministry: Baptisms: by appointment. Marriages: six months' notice should be given to the parish priest, and he should be contacted before any other arrangements are made. Reconciliation: by appointment. Holy Communion: for the sick, by appointment, any time. Holy Unction (Anointing of the Sick): Those anticipating surgery, hospitalization or treatments and who would like to receive anointing (by appointment, any time). Funerals and Memorials: by appointment.

We are sometimes like leaky bags into which the Lord pours out His grace, and we lose it. But when a person receives the gifts of the Holy Spirit, when she cooperates with divine grace, then she grows and matures. His Beatitude Sviatoslav, the Father and Head of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church said in his daily address on the 118th day of the war.

The Primate thanked the Lord and the Armed Forces of Ukraine that we have lived to this morning and seen the light of this day.

He noted that despite intense fighting and daily missile strikes on peaceful cities of our country, Ukraine is struggling. "Ukraine defends its dignity and independence, as it once did in the days of ancient Kyivan Rus. Ukraine, by the power of its spirit and its weapons, shields Europe, European values from contempt, from destruction by the invasion, which brings death and destruction to our land," said the spiritual leader of Ukrainians.

On this day, the Head of the Church began a series of reflections on the fruits of the Holy Spirit. For seven days after Pentecost, the Primate reflected on the gifts of the Holy Spirit that He brings to a man.

The spiritual leader reminds us that the Lord does not want to throw anything at us. God's gift, he argues, must be accepted and cooperated with so that it becomes a reality in our soul, person, and in our lives. Because this gift is like a

seed that must take root, grow and bear fruit. If a person does not pay attention to it, it can be easily lost.

His Beatitude Sviatoslav reflected on the fruit of the Holy Spirit, which is love.

What is the meaning of love as the fruit of the Holy Spirit? "Here is another aspect of true and genuine love. Love in its fullness leads to unity with the one you love. Love as the fruit of the Holy Spirit gives us the opportunity to live in God and with God, to be united with Him whom we love and who has loved us," said the spiritual leader.

The Head of the UGCC called on us to pray together that even in the midst of war, which is a time and space of lethality of hatred, we may be able to stand together with God in love, so that in fulfilling His will and commandments, we may invite him to our lives.

"Thus when we feel that we are united with God, then here we get a taste of eternal happiness, and then no external circumstances can change, steal from us what we have in our hearts," the Primate assumes.

Pope: 'Ask yourselves what you are doing for the people of Ukraine?'



Pope Francis is suggesting to each and every one of us to ask ourselves how are we manifesting solidarity towards the suffering people of Ukraine, nearly four months from the beginning of the war.

The post-Angelus address on Sunday provided Pope Francis with yet another occasion to remind all men and women of goodwill of the suffering of the people of Ukraine and to invite us to put solidarity into action.

Almost four months since the Russian invasion and the start of the war in Ukraine that continues to kill, injure, destroy and displace, concern is being expressed about a possible onset of "Ukraine fatigue" that may cause people to lose interest in the unfolding tragedy.

Pope Francis asks us not to forget. "Let's not forget the battered Ukrainian people at this time, a people that is suffering. I would like to invite you all to ask yourselves a question: what am I doing today for the Ukrainian people?"

Alluding to a collective human responsibility the Pope added: "Do I pray? Do I act? Do I try to understand? What do I do today for Ukrainians? Answer that question within your hearts."

Pope at WMOF Mass: 'God bless and keep all the families of the world'

The X World Meeting of Families in Rome concludes with the celebration of the Holy Mass presided by Cardinal Kevin Farrell in the presence of Pope Francis. During the homily, the Pope notes that "the family is the first place where we learn to love."

In a world poisoned by the toxins of selfishness, individualism, by a culture of indifference and waste, Pope Francis praised the beauty of the family and said "today more than ever," we feel compelled to defend it.

The Pope was speaking during the homily at a Mass of thanksgiving on Saturday at the end of the X World Meeting of Families that has been unfolding in the Vatican on the theme *"Family Love: a Vocation and a Path to Holiness"*.

The five-day event organized by the Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life, concludes on Sunday when Pope Francis is scheduled to address families during the Angelus and entrust them with a Mandate.

He described the moments of reflection and sharing, with their rich variety of experiences, plans and dreams, concerns and uncertainties, that have taken place during the World Meeting of Families describing it as "a kind of vast constellation," and said to all those present: "fathers, mothers and children, grandparents, uncles and aunts, adults and children, young and old," each bringing a different experience of family, but with one hope and prayer: *"May God bless and keep your families and all the families of the world."* Pope Francis then reflected on the liturgical readings of the day that all shine light on different aspects of marital and family love.

The family is the place where we learn to love

In Saint Paul's Letter to the Galatians, he said the Apostle tells us that the freedom given to us by God is completely directed to love, so that "through love you may become slaves of one another" (Gal. 5:13).

Turning to married couples, he praised their courageous decision to build a family and "to use your freedom not for yourselves, but to love the persons that God has put at your side.

Instead of living like little islands, he said, you became "slaves of one another".

That is how freedom is exercised in the family, Pope Francis explained, there are no "planets" or "satellites", each travelling on its own orbit. The family is the place of encounter, of sharing, of going forth from ourselves in order to welcome others and stand beside them. "The family is the first place where we learn to love."

Even as we reaffirm this with profound conviction, he said, we know full well "that it is not always the case, for any number of reasons and a variety of situations."

"And so, in praising the beauty of the family, we also feel compelled, today more than ever, to *defend the family*. Let us not allow the family to be poisoned by the toxins of selfishness, individualism, today's culture of indifference and waste, and as a result lose its very DNA, which is the spirit of acceptance and service."

The relationship between generations

The Second Book of Kings tells of the relationship between the prophets Elijah and Elisha. It reminds us, the Pope said, of the *relationship between generations*, the "passing on of witness" from parents to children.

He said in a world in which everything seems chaotic and precarious, some parents fear "that children will not be able to find their way amid the complexity and confusion of our societies." This fear, he said, makes some parents anxious and others overprotective. "At times, it even ends up thwarting the desire to bring new lives into the world."

But reflecting on the relationship between Elijah and Elisha in which God shows us that he has confidence in the new generation, Pope Francis said: "How important it is for parents to reflect on God's way of acting!"



"God loves young people, but that does not mean that he preserves them from all risk, from every challenge and from all suffering." "God is not anxious and overprotective; on the contrary, he trusts young people and he calls each of them to scale the heights of life and of mission," he said.

And he encouraged parents not to shield their children "from the slightest hardship and suffering, but to try to communicate to them a passion for life, to arouse in them the desire to discover their vocation and embrace the great mission that God has in mind for them."

Dear parents, if you help your children to discover and to accept their vocation, you will see that they too will be "gripped" by this mission; and they will find the strength they need to confront and overcome the difficulties of life

A never-ending trip

Finally, the Gospel of Luke tells us that "To follow Jesus means to set out on a never-ending "trip" with him through the events of life. "How true this is for you married couples!"

The Pope said that our Christian vocation calls us to experience "marriage and family life as a mission, demonstrating fidelity and patience despite difficulties, moments of sadness and times of trial."


Inevitably, he said, there will be moments of "resistance, opposition, rejection and misunderstanding born of human hearts," but with the grace of Christ, we are called to "transform these into acceptance of others and gratuitous love."

By accepting the call to marriage and family, couples set out on a trip, "without knowing beforehand where exactly it would lead, and what new situations, unexpected events and surprises would eventually lie in store," he said.

"That is what it means to journey with the Lord. It is a lively, unpredictable and marvellous voyage of discovery."


The Church was born of a family. Pope Francis concluded inviting families to keep looking ahead "as Jesus always precedes us on the way in love and service; he encouraged them to share the joy of family love that must always be "open, directed outwards, capable of 'touching' the weak and wounded, the frail in body and the frail in spirit, and all whom you meet along the way"; and by assuring them that the Church is *with* them and *in* them!

"For the Church was born of a family, the Holy Family of Nazareth, and is made up mostly of families.
