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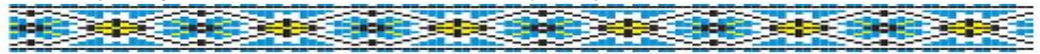

Epistle: A reading from the Acts of the Apostles' (Acts 2:1-11)

When the day of Pentecost came it found the Apostles gathered in one place. Suddenly from up in the sky there came a noise like a strong, driving wind which was heard all through the house where they were seated. Tongues as of fire appeared, which parted and came to rest on each of them. All were filled with the Holy Spirit. They began to express themselves in foreign tongues and make bold proclamation as the Spirit prompted them. Staying in Jerusalem at the time were devout Jews of every nation under heaven. These heard the sound, and assembled in a large crowd. They were much confused because each one heard these men speaking his own language. The whole occurrence astonished them. They asked in utter amazement, “Are not all of these men who are speaking Galileans? How is it that each of us hears them in his native tongue? We are Parthians, Medes, and Elamites. We live in Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus, the province of Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt, and the regions of Libya around Cyrene. There are even visitors from Rome – all Jews, or those who have come over to Judaism; Cretans and Arabs too. Yet each of us hears them speaking in his own tongue about the marvels God has accomplished.”

Alleluia (Tone 1): By the Lord's word the heavens were established, and by the Breath of His mouth all their host (Ps 32:6). The Lord has looked down from heaven and beheld the whole human race (Ps 32:13).

Gospel: (John 7:37-52; 8:12)

At that time, on the last and greatest day of the festival, Jesus stood up and cried out: “If anyone thirsts, let him come to me; let him drink who believes in me. Scripture has it: ‘From within him rivers of living water shall flow.’” (Here he was referring to the Spirit, whom those that came to believe in him were to receive. There was, of course, no Spirit as yet, since Jesus had not yet been glorified.) Some in the crowd who heard these words began to say, “This must be the Prophet.” Others were claiming, “He is the Messiah.” But an objection was raised: “Surely the Messiah is not to come from Galilee? Does not Scripture say that the Messiah, being of David's family, is to come from Bethlehem, the village where David lived?” In this fashion the crowd was sharply divided over him. Some of them even wanted to apprehend him. However, no one laid hands on him.

When the temple guards came back, the chief priests and Pharisees asked them, “Why did you not bring him in?” “No man ever spoke like that before,” the guards replied. “Do not tell us you too have been taken in!” the Pharisees retorted. “You do not see any of the Sanhedrin believing in him, do you? Or the Pharisees? Only this lot, that knows nothing about the law – and they are lost anyway!”

One of their own number, Nicodemus (the man who had come to him), spoke up to say, “Since when does our law condemn any man without first hearing him and knowing the facts?” “Do not tell us you are a Galilean too,” they taunted him. “Look it up. You will not find the Prophet coming from Galilee.”

Jesus spoke to them once again: “I am the light of the world. No follower of mine shall ever walk in darkness; no, he shall possess the light of life.”

Instead of "It is truly...": **O my soul, glorify The One Divinity in Three Persons.** Imros (Tone 4): Rejoice, O Queen, boast of virgins and mothers, for every tongue, though capable and eloquent, cannot hymn you as is your due, and every mind is confounded in seeking to comprehend the way in which you gave birth. Wherefore with one accord we magnify you.

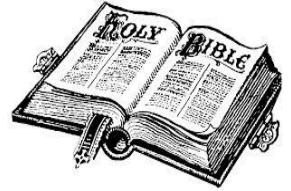

Тими днями, як настав день П'ятидесятниці, всі вони були вкупі на тім самім місці. Аж ось роздався з неба шум, неначе подув буйного вітру, і сповнив увесь дїм, де вони сиділи. Не прийшов був ще Дух Святий, бо Ісус не був ще прославлений. Численні ж з народу, вчувши ті слова, казали: «Він дійсно пророк.» Інші ж: «Він – Христос.» Ще інші: «Чи з Галилеї Христос прийде? Хіба в Писанні не сказано, що з роду Давидового Христос прийде, з села Вифлеєму, звідки був Давид?» І роздор виник ізза нього серед народу. Бажали і схопити його деякі, та ніхто не наклав рук на нього. Повернулись, отже, слуги до первосвящеників та фарисеїв, а ті питають їх: «Чому не привели його?» Слуги ж відказують: «Ніколи чоловік не говорив так, як цей чоловік говорить.» Фарисеї ж: «Чи й не ви дали себе звести? Невже хтось із старшини або фарисеїв увірував у нього? Та проклятий той народ, що закону не знає!» Але озвався до них Никодим, що приходив до нього вночі, а був же один з них: «Чи дозволяє наш закон засуджувати чоловіка, не вислухавши його спершу та й не довідавшись, що він робить?» Ті ж йому: «Чи і ти з Галилеї? Розвідайся, то й побачиш: з Галилеї пророк не приходить.» І ще промовляв до них Ісус, і так їм казав: «Я – світло світу. Хто йде за мною, не блукатиме у темряві, а матиме світло життя.»

Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.*

Pastoral and Sacramental Ministry: **Baptisms:** by appointment. **Marriages:** six months' notice should be given to the parish priest, and he should be contacted before any other arrangements are made. **Reconciliation:** by appointment. **Holy Communion:** for the sick, by appointment, any time. **Holy Unction** (Anointing of the Sick): Those anticipating surgery, hospitalization or treatments and who would like to receive anointing (by appointment, any time). **Funerals and Memorials:** by appointment.

From the Head of the UGCC on the Feast of the Ascension: Our task is to destroy the spirit of war and protect Europe from the Asian horde

We are strong in our current struggle, because today we pray more than ever for Ukraine, for the victory of our army, for the victory over the aggressor. His Beatitude Sviatoslav, the Father and Head of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church said in his homily to the faithful on the Feast of the Ascension. The Liturgy was attended by a delegation of the German Bishops' Conference, led by the Bishop of Augsburg, who co-served in the Liturgy.

The Ascension of the Lord is one of the biggest twelve Christian holidays of the year, the Feast of the Ascension of the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. According to the Primate this holiday is a fulfillment of God's plan, where by uniting the heavenly with the earthly, Christ ascends to heaven.

The preacher explained that on the feast of the Ascension of the Lord, the apostles receive an individual task from Jesus Christ. First He tells them not to leave Jerusalem until they are clothed in power from above. The power that the apostles must expect for ten days. The power which will give them the courage to witness all that they have seen and experienced: the tragedy of the crucifixion of death and the joy of the Resurrection, to witness God's love and preaching forgiveness of sins in that power, they will carry to the ends of the earth.

So today we are starting a ten-day intensive waiting time. The church is waiting for the coming of the Holy Spirit.

"This year, the Missionary Decade is about God's word of the mission and vocation of each of us we will experience in war conditions. And, perhaps more than ever, now, during these tragic moments, we ask the Lord: God, why did all this happen to us? What are you calling us to do? What mission did You prepare for Ukraine, Ukrainians and the Ukrainian Church? What is the fullness of your plan for the fate of our people? – said the Head of the Church.

The spiritual leader emphasizes that we have a very deep answer to these questions today. "First of all, you and I have witnessed the Resurrection in the recent history of our state, our Church. Since this is the Lord who ruined the Soviet Union and resurrected a free Independent Ukraine. It was the Lord who gave the Church and the people freedom. And today He instructs us to witness his Resurrection in the light of that mission, to witness the resurrection of the Church and our people", he added.

"We say," the Head of the Church said, "that the war in Ukraine is war between good and evil". Perhaps this is our historic mission to protect Europe again from the Asian horde with our bodies, as it was here in Kyiv during the reign of Batu Khan and other hordes who came to our land. To pray for victory means to pray for the fulfillment of the historical mission, the task of our people in the family of European nations. Today we pray for each of us so that each of us can fulfill our life's mission in a Christian way".

His Beatitude Sviatoslav emphasizes that the Lord gives each of us the tasks that no one will do instead of us:

"If we run away from it, have no wish to fulfill it, emptiness and desolation will remain. Each of us being in our place today prays and defends our homeland, witnesses to faith in God and His saving plan for our people. That is why we say and pray even on the graves of our fallen heroes that heroes do not die.

It is the Lord who revives them, makes them partakers of his Paschal sacrament. He is the key to their life and resurrection even after death".



The Head of the UGCC discussed with the Ukrainian World Congress the support of Ukrainian refugees in the world

On Wednesday, June 1, at the residence of the Head of the UGCC in Kyiv, the Father and Head of the UGCC His Beatitude Sviatoslav met with the administration of the Ukrainian World Congress. This meeting, initiated by the UWC, was attended by UWC members for the first time since Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine.

The main question discussed during the meeting was the support of Ukrainian refugees in the world, their spiritual and cultural ties with Ukraine and assistance in integration into Ukrainian communities around the world.

Paul Grod, President of the Ukrainian World Congress thanked His Beatitude Sviatoslav for the active role of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church in mobilizing the Ukrainian community in the world in support of Ukraine and the victims of the war. He noted the great openness and activity of the clergy and monastics of the UGCC both in the service of refugees who are already staying and continue to come from Ukraine to different countries, and in collecting donations and humanitarian aid sent to Ukraine.

The sides also discussed the possibility of cooperation between the UWC, Caritas Ukraine and the UGCC in Ukraine to provide the necessary humanitarian assistance to internally displaced persons in Ukraine.

Furthermore, the UWC noted that the UGCC is Ukraine's true voice in the world and an important source of truthful information, particularly in the information war against Ukraine.

Another important question discussed during the meeting was the establishment of close cooperation between the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church in Ukraine and the world and the World Congress of Ukrainians. The Head of the UGCC expressed hope that such cooperation, on the one hand, would help and unite Ukrainians worldwide around the support of Ukraine, the Ukrainian State and the Ukrainian Armed Forces, and on the other hand, allow them to appeal together to the world community to raise awareness of Ukraine, which is already beginning to get tired of the war in Ukraine. "The longer the war lasts, the less likely the world will talk about it. Unfortunately, the war is no longer newsworthy. The sensitivity of the world community to the tragedy in Ukraine will need to be awakened and maintained in the future. That is why cooperation between the Church and the Ukrainian World Congress in this direction will be only developing", stated the Head of the UGCC.

The parties also analyzed the challenges Ukrainian society is facing today. They talked about the victims of Russia's war against Ukraine, the immediate consequences of this war in the humanitarian and economic spheres, the sphere of international relations, as well as what awaits Ukraine and Ukrainian society in the near future, given that the war, unfortunately, is not coming to an end.

Pope Francis congratulates Queen Elizabeth II on her platinum jubilee

Pope Francis sent a congratulatory message to Queen Elizabeth II on Thursday coinciding with the United Kingdom's joyous celebration of the 70th anniversary of her reign.

"On this joyful occasion of your Majesty's birthday, and as you celebrate this Platinum Jubilee year, I send cordial greetings and good wishes, together with the renewed assurance of my prayers that Almighty God will bestow upon you, the members of the Royal Family and all the people of the nation blessings of unity, prosperity and peace," the pope said in a telegram to the queen.

Queen Elizabeth, who turned 96 on April 21, is England's longest serving monarch, having ascended to the throne in 1952 at age 25 after the death of her father, King George VI. Her coronation took place the following year, on June 2, 1953.

On Thursday the United Kingdom began four days of jubilee celebrations, starting with an event called Trooping the Color, a colorful military parade in London that featured 240 horses, a Royal Air Force flyover, and a gun salute. The queen watched the parade from a balcony at Buckingham Palace.

Elizabeth has met four popes as queen, and one (Pius XII) as princess in 1951.

Queen Elizabeth and her late husband, Prince Philip, the Duke of Edinburgh, met with Pope Francis in the Vatican in 2014.

The meeting marked the 100th anniversary of the re-establishment of diplomatic relations between the United Kingdom and the Holy See. After their meeting, Pope Francis gave the couple a facsimile of Pope Innocent XI's order extending the cult of St. Edward the Confessor, and the queen in turn presented the pope with a large basket of food from the estates surrounding her homes. The items included an assortment of honey, a dozen eggs, a haunch of venison, shortbread, juice, preserves, and Balmoral whiskey.

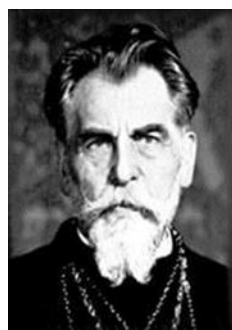
