Epistle: A reading from the First Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians: (1 Cor. 3:9-17)

Brothers and Sisters, for we are God's servants, working together; you are God's field, God's building. According to the grace of God given to me, like a skilled master builder I laid a foundation, and someone else is building on it. Each builder must choose with care how to build on it. For no one can lay any foundation other than the one that has been laid; that foundation is Jesus Christ. Now if anyone builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw—the work of each builder will become visible, for the Day will disclose it, because it will be revealed with fire, and the fire will test what sort of work each has done. If what has been built on the foundation survives, the builder will receive a reward. If the work is burned up, the builder will suffer loss; the builder will be saved, but only as through fire. Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person. For God's temple is holy, and you are that temple.

Gospel: (Mt 14:22-34)

At that time Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, but by this time the boat, battered by the waves, was far from the land, for the wind was against them. And early in the morning he came walking toward them on the sea. But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, saying, "It is a ghost!" And they cried out in fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them and said, "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid." Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." He said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat, started walking on the water, and came toward Jesus. But when he noticed the strong wind, he became frightened, and beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, "You of little faith, why did you doubt?" When they got into the boat, the wind ceased. And those in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God." When they had crossed over, they came to land at Gennesaret.

Instead of "It is truly...": O my soul, magnify the Lord transfigured on the mountain.

SPIRIT OF CHRISTIAN AWARENESS: Dear parishioners, if our brother or sister in Christ, who usually sits next to you, is not in the Church today, please phone him / her and ask how he / she is doing. Let him or her know that our parish community misses his or her at the church very much and prays for them daily! We also pray for the people of Ukraine, that with the help of the Holy Spirit, they may obtain social peace, political harmony and economic stability: Lord, hear us and have mercy.

Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion: You are a member of the Catholic Church (faithful of the Orthodox churches are very welcome to receive Holy Communion); 2) You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at



least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; 3) You attend Divine Services regularly; 4) Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; 5) You have kept the Liturgical fast – no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). 6) You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel. 7) To

the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace. If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.

<u>Pastoral and Sacramental Ministry</u>: Baptisms: by appointment. Marriages: six months' notice should be given to the parish priest, and he should be contacted before any other arrangements are made. by appointment, any time. Holy Unction (Anointing of the Sick): Those anticipating surgery, hospitalization or treatments and who would like to receive anointing (by appointment, any time). Funerals and Memorials: by appointment.





Today I want to address the Ukrainian youth and invite them to take an oath of loyalty to Christ and answer the question: "Do you believe that Christ can do for you what you ask Him?" The Father and Head of the UGCC said during a homily in the Patriarchal Cathedral of the Resurrection of Christ on the seventh Sunday after Pentecost. During the Divine Liturgy, the faithful renewed their baptismal vows, and the youth, at the call of His Beatitude Sviatoslav, took an oath of loyalty to Christ.

"The powerful word of God, which has just sounded and which the Lord spoke to us within this Divine Liturgy, reveals to us Jesus Christ, the God who comes to his people. Moreover, the one who is the long-awaited Messiah, who fulfills the expectations and aspirations of the thousand-year Old Testament history of the people of Israel," mentioned the Primate at the beginning of the homily.



According to the Head of the Church, the question "Do you believe that I can do this to you?" is the ability to communicate and see the living and present God, which is revealed to us as the sense of faith.

"The one who believes sees much deeper than the eyes of the body can see. Whoever believes can plunge his heart and mind into the depths of the reality that surrounds man. The one who believes –feels, and sees God even in places where other observers do not notice Him," The Head of the UGCC is convinced.

His Beatitude Sviatoslav drew attention to the fact that modern man is wounded in his ability to communicate and enter into a deep, real human relationship with other

people, as well as the Lord. That is why it is so important, he believes, that Christ in today's Gospel heals a person's ability to communicate.

"Today, let us ask that He will speak lifegiving words to us:

Let it be done for you according to your faith. We ask that we experience the healing of our life-giving ability to communicate with God, and then in the light of our relationship with Him we will see the truth revolving around us. Then, the dumb spirit will be driven out of our hearts, and we will no longer be afraid to hear the truth and testify to it," the Head of the Church emphasized.

The preacher noted that today a dumb spirit is taking over a person in a specific way. At most, words often lose their meaning and sense, and people are afraid to hear or see what they do not want to see or hear.



How painful it sometimes gets to hear the discussions occurring in Western Europe about the extent to which one should be tolerant of the criminal enemy attacking Ukraine. We are killed every day, and out there they debate on how many times a day it is possible to take a shower and whether it is possible for the temperature in their homes to be two degrees lower due to economic sanctions.

"But Christ is among us! He is our strength and victory. Because we believe that everything we dream about today, fight for, and die for, we owe to our faith in God, that we will be able to achieve it. We believe that owing to our faith, Christ will do for us what each of us today, particularly in this Divine Liturgy, wants to ask Him for."

During the Liturgy, the faithful renewed their baptismal vows, and the youth took an oath of loyalty to Christ. His Beatitude Sviatoslav recalled that they performed a similar one in the spring of 1933 at the request of Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky. "The strength that came from that loyalty to Christ was a pillar that no one could break, neither the Stalinist regime nor his concentration camps; not either the disaster of the Second World War or all the burdensome post-war calamities that our people and our Church experienced", the Primate said.

"May the merciful Lord hear our prayers! Let him open our eyes, loosen our tongues and give us the strength to tell the whole world what Ukraine is going through and what it is witnessing today is worth even giving one's life," summarized the Head of the UGCC.

Why do we pray and do not receive? Should I persevere in asking? Bishop Venedykt Aleksiychuk explains



Bishop Venedykt Aleksiychuk, bishop of Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy of Chicago, said in an interview for the Department for Information of the UGCC. The interview was recorded during this year's Synod of Bishops of the UGCC, which took place in Przemyśl (Poland).

The bishop emphasized that "it is important to see that the Lord is behind everything that happens." "Even when God does not give something, it is out of love for us. Because the fact that I imagine that I need something is my idea, my stereotype, and my view, which is sometimes far from being right. Thus, it is important to listen to the Lord and pay close attention. When God doesn't give something, maybe I don't need it," the bishop expressed his opinion.

At the same time, Bishop Venedykt noted that a person must be persistent. "I assume, although this is my personal and slightly heretical view: sometimes when we ask, and it is not good for us, yet we are stubborn, God can give it. He acts like a loving



father towards a child: if you already want and want it so desperately, then go for it! That is why I'm always careful about begging for something because you don't know for sure whether it's for good," explained the bishop.

According to him, an example for us is Jesus Christ: "In Garden of Gethsemane, He did not beg for the Father to remove the cup from Him, did He? He showed a human posture, saying: "Father, remove that cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what You will." It is very important to add "Thy will be done."


Bishop Venedykt explained that it is important to articulate some of your desires and beliefs to God. "I think one of the problems is that we play a role before God; we are not entirely sincere. But we have to tell Him what we want, what we need, what we feel. We should not be afraid to say: "God, I am angry with my neighbor; I cannot stand this or that person. But I entrust this situation and these feelings to You," he said.

The bishop gave an example from medicine, saying that "when we come to the doctor, we do not play a role, we do not add or silence any symptoms, but we say what is there." "And our relationship with God must also be truthful and honest.

When we want something, we say: God, I want it, but let Your will be done. Similarly, when you don't want something: God, I don't want it, but let Your will be done," emphasized Bishop Venedykt.

<u>Tackling Challenges:</u>

A challenge is a difficult problem that requires special effort. People who have a growth mindset enjoy challenges because they learn new things. The learning that happens while you work on the challenge is just as important as finishing the challenge.
