Tone 3, text from book "The Divine Liturgy of Saint John Chrysostom"; pages 93-95

Epistle: A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Galatians: (Gal. 1:11-19)

Brothers and Sisters, I assure you, the gospel I proclaimed to you is no mere human invention. I did not receive it from any man, nor was schooled in it. It came by revelation from Jesus Christ. You have heard, I know, the story of my former way of life in Judaism. You know that I went to extremes in persecuting the Church of God and tried to destroy it; I made progress in Jewish observance far beyond most of my contemporaries, in my excess of zeal to live out all the traditions of my ancestors.



But the time came when he who had set me apart before I was born and called me by his favor chose to reveal his Son to me, that I might spread among the Gentiles the good tidings concerning him. Immediately, without seeking human advisers or even going to Jerusalem to see those who were apostles before me, I went off to Arabia later I returned to Damascus. Three years after that I went up to Jerusalem to get up to know Cephas, with whom I stayed fifteen days. I did not meet any other apostles except James, the brother of the Lord. **Gospe**l: (Luke 7: 11:16)

At that time, Jesus went to a town called Nain, and his disciples and a large crowd accompanied him. As he approached the gate of the town a dead man was being carried out, the only son of a widowed mother. A considerable crowd of townsfolk were with her. The Lord was moved with pity upon seeing her and said to her, "Do not cry." Then he stepped forward and touched the litter; at this, the bearers halted. He said, "Young man, I bid you get up." The dead man sat up and began to speak. Then Jesus gave him back to his mother. Fear seized them all and they began to praise God. "A great prophet has risen among us," they said; and, "God has visited his people."

Ви чули про мою поведінку колись у юдействі, про те, як я несамовито гонив Божу Церкву та руйнував її. Я перевищував у юдействі багатьох ровесників з мого роду, бувши запеклим прихильником передань моїх предків. Та коли той, хто вибрав мене вже від утроби матері моєї і покликав своєю благодаттю, зволив об'явити в мені Сина свого, щоб я проповідував його між поганами, то я негайно, ні з ким не радившись, ані не подавшися в Єрусалим до



тих, що були апостолами передо мною, пішов в Арабію, а потім знову повернувся в Дамаск. По трьох роках по тому пішов я у Ерусалим відвідати Кифу і перебув у нього п'ятнадцять днів. А іншого з апостолів я не бачив, крім Якова, брата Господнього. **Євангеліє**: (Лк. 7,11-16)

В той час пішов Ісус у місто, що зветься Наїн, а з ним ішли його учні й сила народу. Коли ж вони наблизились до міської брами, якраз виносили мертвого сина, єдиного в матері своєї, що була вдовою; і було з нею досить людей з міста. Побачивши її, Господь зглянувся над нею і сказав до неї: "Не плач." І приступивши, доторкнувсь до мар, і що несли, зупинились. Тоді Ісус сказав: "Юначе, кажу тобі, встань!" І мертвий підвівся і почав говорити. І він віддав його матері. Страх огорнув усіх, і вони прославляли Бога та й говорили: "Великий пророк устав між нами", і: "Бог навідався до народу свого."

<u>SPIRIT OF CHRISTIAN AWARENESS</u>: Dear parishioners, if our brother or sister in Christ, who usually sits next to you, is not in the Church today, please phone him / her and ask how he / she is doing. Let him or her know that our parish community misses his or her at the church very much and prays for them daily! We also pray for the people of Ukraine, that with the help of the Holy Spirit, they may obtain social peace, political harmony and economic stability: Lord, hear us and have mercy.

Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion: You are a member of the Catholic Church (faithful of the Orthodox churches are very welcome to receive Holy Communion); 2) You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; 3) You attend Divine Services regularly; 4) Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; 5) You have kept the Liturgical fast – no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). 6) You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel. 7) To the best

of your ability, you are in the state of Grace. If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.

<u>Pastoral and Sacramental Ministry</u>: Baptisms: by appointment. Marriages: six months' notice should be given to the parish priest, and he should be contacted before any other arrangements are made. Reconciliation: by appointment. Holy Communion: for the sick, by appointment, any time. Holy Unction (Anointing of the Sick): Those anticipating surgery, hospitalization or treatments and who would like to receive anointing (by appointment, any time). Funerals and Memorials: by appointment.

# The Head of the UGCC calls on the academia of the Catholic Church to give a legal assessment of the modern neoimperial geopolitics of Russia

"I urge you not to be silent," His Beatitude Sviatoslav, head of the UGCC, said online on October 19 in his report on the occasion of the start of the new academic year at the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome. Patriarch Sviatoslav spoke about the ideology of the Russian World and called on the academia of the Catholic Church to study in-depth and scientifically evaluate the modern neo-imperial geopolitics of Russia.

His Beatitude Sviatoslav spoke about his personal experience of what he saw in the Ukrainian territories previously occupied by Russian soldiers. "Today, it is obvious to all of us that the evil that has come to our land has a clear ideological component and a specific name — the Russian World."

The Head of the UGCC cited statistics from international organizations on the current humanitarian situation in Ukraine. Since the Russian invasion of Ukraine began, 422 children have been killed, and 805 children have been injured. According to the UN Human Rights Monitoring Mission, 6,221 civilians were killed, and 9,371 civilians were injured. According to UNICEF in Ukraine, out of

3.2 million children who have been displaced by the war, about 1.6 million children are at risk of living on the brink of hunger and face the risk of food insecurity. Attacks on water infrastructure and power outages have left about 1.4 million people in Ukraine without access to water. Another 4.6 million only have limited access.

"These data, but first of all the personal experience of the war that we are experiencing, show that we are not talking about an ordinary war of one country against another, much less a military operation, but about the real genocide of the Ukrainian people and the terrible crimes against humanity committed by Russian soldiers."

His Beatitude Sviatoslav drew the audience's attention to the manual on the genocide of Ukrainians, which the Russian authorities published on the page of the RIA Novosti Press Agency at the beginning of their invasion of Ukraine.

"This is a blatant program of the complete elimination of the Ukrainian nation as such, which the famous historian Timothy Snyder described as one of the most open genocidal documents. This document clearly calls for the elimination of the Ukrainian state and the Ukrainian people."

His Beatitude Sviatoslav stressed that "Russian soldiers adhere to every letter of this manual for the destruction of Ukrainians."

"But it is a real shock for us to see the Christian justification of this murderous ideology, to witness complete syntonia between the Kremlin authorities and the Russian Orthodox Church. From Patriarch Kirill to the priests who methodically justify these crimes, we see how the Christian faith becomes an ideological tool for promoting Russian Nazism. The justification and call for war on the part of the Russian Orthodox Church are increasingly reminiscent of the doctrine of the Islamic State ISIS. Moreover, the leaders of this church quote it verbatim, although they put it in Christian vestments. Recently, we even see their clergy in liturgical vestments with a grenade launcher in their hands shooting on the battlefield."

The head of the UGCC stressed the importance of serious scientific research on the ideology of the Russian World: "If the modern world does not condemn and stop the genocide of the Ukrainian people, tomorrow we will have even more victims, as happened in the past with Nazism and communism."

His Beatitude Sviatoslav appealed to the scientific world of the Catholic Church to carry out new research on the topics of war, violence, and the search for peace and justice in the context of modern challenges to the ideology of the Russian World, which destroys the foundations not only of international law and peaceful coexistence between peoples but also of trust in the Christian faith in a secularized world. # In occupied Lysychansk, women rescued Bibles that Russians threw out of a church library

The ministers of the city's six Protestant churches were forced to flee when the Russians captured Lysychansk in early July. The remaining members of the churches were driven underground. The invaders occupied the building of the Lysychansk Christian Center, a large Protestant church, and threw the library into the courtyard.

As the pastor of the church, Eduard Nosachov, told the human rights organization "Voice of Martyrs-Korea", the courtyard next to the church attracted the attention of the few remaining members of the church.


"The authorities threw the contents of the church library, including Bibles for adults and children, into a pile in the next Yard," says Dr. Hyun Suk Foley, a spokesman for the voice of Martyrs – Korea organization.

According to Foley, several women who remained in the city initiated a rescue operation. "Their goal was to collect Bibles, books, and transport them to a safe place for storage and future use," she says.

Dr. Foley noted that the work was slow and dangerous. "The occupation authorities installed flags of Russia and the Luhansk People's Republic (LPR) on the facade of the church building and began its reconstruction for use by the military-civil authorities. In particular, it is planned to remove the cross from the spire of the building, " she said. "Collecting and transferring literature was risky. Believers could be recognized as Christians. As reported, the occupation authorities detained and interrogated Christians."
