Tone 7, text from book "The Divine Liturgy of Saint John Chrysostom"; pages 103-105

Epistle: A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Ephesians: (Eph. 2:14-22)

Brothers and Sisters, it is Christ who is our peace, and who made the two of us one by breaking down the barrier of hostility that kept us apart. In his own flesh he abolished the law with its commands and precepts, to create in himself one new man from us who had been two and to make peace, reconciling both of us to God in one body through his cross, which put that enmity to death. He came and "announced the good news of peace to you who were far off, and to those who were near"; through Him we have access in one Spirit to the Father.







This means that you are strangers and aliens no longer. No, you are fellow citizens of the saints and members of the household of God. You form a building which rises on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the capstone. Through him the whole structure is fitted together and takes shape as a holy temple in the Lord; in him you are being built into this temple, to become a dwelling place for God in the Spirit.

Gospel: (Lk 8: 41-56)

At that time, a man named Jairus, who was chief of the synagogue, came up and fell at Jesus' feet, begging that he come to his home. Because of his only daughter, a girl of about twelve, was dying. As Jesus went, the crowds almost crushed him. A woman with hemorrhage of twelve years' duration, incurable at any doctor's hands, came up behind him and touched the tassel on his cloak. Immediately her bleeding stopped. Jesus asked, "Who touched me?" Everyone disclaimed doing it, while Peter said, "Lord, the crowds are milling and pressing around you!" Jesus insisted, "Someone touched me; I know that power has gone forth from me." When the woman saw that her act had not gone unnoticed, came forward trembling. Falling at his feet, she related before the whole assemblage why she had touched him and how she had been instantly cured. Jesus said to her, "Daughter, it is your faith that has cured you. Now go in peace."

He was still speaking when a man came from the ruler's house with the announcement, "Your daughter is dead; do not bother the Teacher further." Jesus heard this, and his response was: "Fear is useless; what is needed is trust and her life will be spared." Once he had arrived at the house, he permitted no one to enter with him except Peter, John, James, and the child's parents. While everyone wept and lamented her, he said, "Stop crying for she is not dead but asleep." They laughed at him, being certain she was dead." He took her by the hand and spoke these words: "Get up, child." The breath of life returned to her and she got up immediately; whereupon he told them to give her something to eat. Her parents were astounded, but he ordered them not to tell anyone what had happened

Апостол: До Ефесян послання Святого Апостола Павла читання: (Еф. 2, 14-22)

Браття і Сестри, Христос – наш мир, він, що зробив із двох одне, зруйнувавши стіну, яка була перегородою, тобто ворожнечу, – своїм тілом скасував закон заповідей у своїх рішеннях, на те, щоб із двох зробити в собі одну нову людину, вчинивши мир між нами, і щоб примирити їх обох в однім тілі з Богом через хрест, убивши ворожнечу в ньому. Він прийшов звістувати мир вам, що були далеко, і мир тим, що були близько; бо через Нього, ми маємо доступ до Отця в Однім Дусі. Отже, ви більше не чужинці і не приходні, а співгромадяни святих і домашні Божі, побудовані на підвалині апостолів і пророків, де наріжним каменем – сам Ісус Христос. На ньому вся будівля, міцно споєна, росте святим храмом у Господі; на ньому ви теж будуєтеся разом на житло Бога в Дусі.

Євангеліє: (Лк. 8, 41-56)

У той час один чоловік приступив до Ісуса, Яір на ім'я, який був головою синагоги. Припавши до ніг Ісуса, він почав його просити зайти до нього в хату, бо була в нього дочка одиначка, яких дванадцять років, і вона вмирала. І як він ішов туди, люди тиснулися до нього. Аж тут жінка якась, що була хвора дванадцять років на кровотечу й витратила на лікарів увесь свій прожиток, і ніхто з них не міг її оздоровити, підійшовши ззаду, доторкнулась краю його одежі й умить стала здоровою –

спинилась її кровотеча. Ісус спитав: "Хто доторкнувся мене?" А що всі відпекувались, Петро мовив: "Наставниче, то люди коло тебе юрмляться і тиснуться." Ісус же сказав: "Хтось доторкнувся до мене, бо я чув, як сила вийшла з мене." Побачивши жінка, що не втаїлася, тремтячи підійшла й упавши йому до ніг, призналася перед усіма людьми, чому до нього доторкнулась і як негайно одужала. Сказав їй Ісус: "Дочко, віра твоя спасла тебе, йди в мирі!"



Він говорив ще, як приходить хтось від голови синагоги і каже: "Твоя дочка померла, не турбуй більш Учителя." Ісус почувши це, озвався до нього: "Не бійся, тільки віруй, і вона спасеться." Прийшовши до хати, він не пустив нікого з собою всередину, крім Петра, Йоана та Якова з батьком та матір'ю дитини. Всі плакали за нею і голосили. Він же мовив: "Не плачте, вона не вмерла, вона тільки спить." І ті сміялися з нього, бо знали, що вмерла. А він узяв її за руку й голосно промовив: "Дівчино, пробудися!" І дух її повернувсь до неї, і вона миттю встала. Тоді він звелів дати їй їсти. Батьки ж її були здивовані вельми, та він наказав їм нікому не говорити, що сталося.

If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.

HOLODOMOR AWARENESS WEEK: NOVEMBER 14rd – 20th, 2022 A.D. Commemoration of the 89th Anniversary of the Holodomor Famine- Genocide of 1932-1933 A.D. International Holodomor Memorial Day is on Saturday, November 19th at 7:32 p.m. (19:32) local time we are invited to pause for a moment of silence and honour the memory of the victims by lighting a candle of remembrance in our homes. In our parish on after the Divine Liturgies on Sunday, November 20th we will celebrate the Panakhyda for the victims of this genocide. INFO: Ukrainians were starved to death by the Soviet government and regime led by USSR comrade Joseph Stalin. All grain and food were forcibly seized, and the boarders were shut. In little more that a year, a quarter of the population pesished. This crime of genocide by starvation is a historical fact and known as the Holodomor. In 2008, the Government of

Canada recognized the Holodomor as an act of Genocide against the Ukrainian people and established the fourth Saturday of November as the National Ukrainian Famine and Genocide (Holodomor) Memorial Day. The provinces of Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Ontario and Quebec have adopted similar legislation. British Columbia officially has recognized the annual day of remembrance for Ukraine's Holodomor on Thursday, October 31, 2019 A.D.

Archbishop Borys Gudziak says Russian war against Ukrainian nation is genocide

A Ukrainian Catholic archbishop asked his fellow U.S. bishops Nov. 16 to pray for Ukraine, and, if possible, to go to Ukraine and pray there for its people, inviting them on a trip he is embarking on in February. What Ukrainians are facing amounts to genocide, he said.

In Baltimore, on the second and last public day of the fall general assembly of the U.S. Catholic Conference of Bishops, Archbishop Borys Gudziak of the Ukrainian Catholic Archeparchy of Philadelphia thanked the bishops and their leadership for spearheading U.S. Catholic support for a nation under attack by Russia since February.

He spoke of the hospital, schools, cities and lives snuffed out or destroyed in Ukraine since Russia began attacking it.

"Ukraine was like a lamb," he said, having reduced its army because it was not interested in fighting with anyone. "It was not interested in aggression. It wants nothing from Russia." But under attack, it has come to embody the best of Catholic social doctrine, he said, organizing, mobilizing and being part of a worldwide movement of solidarity that seeks to help David triumph over Goliath. "Russia is the last of the European empires, and scandalously it is the last to use the Gospel, the church, to justify colonialism," he said. Russia is 28 times bigger





than Ukraine, the archbishop said, yet it seeks to dehumanize the smaller nation, calling its citizens Nazis to justify killing them, he added.

"This is the profound pathology of imperialism," he added. "We're not going to become compromised. We're not going to be subjects. It's over. It's liberty or death." Even as Russia attacks, Ukrainians still laugh and sing, he said, because "they trust in life, they trust in truth, they trust in dignity, in solidarity and subsidiarity, and the common good."

He thanked the U.S. Catholic Church for its financial and spiritual support for Ukraine. It has helped buoy the Ukrainian spirit that will fight for its independence, he said.

After Archbishop Gudziak's update, Cardinal Robert W. McElroy of San Diego urged the body of U.S. bishops to "make it a very high priority" to urge continuing U.S. aid in its policy work, continuing help to the nation since there are "rumblings of cutting the support to Ukraine from the United States."

Though he did not elaborate, he mentioned "the dawn of a new house," likely referring to the House of Representatives, which will likely be controlled by the Republican Party and whose members have started expressing discontent with aiding the country.

"That could be very ominous in terms of the continuity of weapons and support," the cardinal said, adding that keeping aid to Ukraine coming "is essential in convincing the Russians that they cannot succeed."

Archbishop Gudziak also asked that all the bishops consider hosting one Ukrainian family in their respective dioceses.

He said the Catholic Church in particular has been generous, receiving refugees, not in camps, but in homes, schools, convents and monasteries. "I want to thank you for praying, for staying informed, advocating and for helping," he said. "Catholics in Ukraine have been explaining Catholic Social Doctrine: unalienable God-given human dignity, solidarity, subsidiary, the common good."

And they have done so with help from "American Catholics who have supported Ukraine through thick and thin" in the past and in the present. "I venture to say that you have helped Ukrainian people be who they are," he said. "Those efforts have helped them understand what Catholic social doctrine is ... no act of good is lost, no gesture of solidarity is without fruit."

As a result, many Ukrainians are offering their lives in service and sacrifice for others, he said.

He invited them to join him on a humanitarian trip in early February, adding that New York Cardinal Timothy M. Dolan had visited.

"We will see some things. You'll be inspired and you'll see how much you have contributed to this fortitude, to this virtue, to this belief in eternity, that, in the end, is what is in the hearts of people who give their lives," Archbishop Gudziak said.

"They give their lives because they know there's something more than just little me and my little chronology. There's eternal life. It's Christ-like. There's no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends," he said.

The archbishop offered his comments a day after Russia once again attacked civilian dwellings in the capital of Kyiv and widely hit infrastructure around the country, including in Lviv in western Ukraine, close to the border with Poland.

The same day, a Russian-made missile hit Poland, killing two, but details of who fired it were under investigation with some U.S. intelligence pointing to an accidental interception by Ukraine possibly leading to the incident.

Earlier, Ukrainian president Volodymyr Zelenskyy had called for peace, via video, during a meeting of the G20, an international forum representing the world's largest economies gathering this year in Bali, Indonesia.

Jake Sullivan, U.S. national security adviser, said in a Nov. 15 statement that as world leaders gathered to talk about important issues affecting the "lives and livelihoods of people around the world, Russia again threatens those lives and destroys Ukraine's critical infrastructure." Russian President Vladimir Putin did not attend the gathering, sending instead Russia's foreign minister, Sergey Lavrov, to the summit.
