Gospel (John 12:1-18)

At that time, six days before Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, the village of Lazarus whom Jesus had raised from the dead. There they gave him a banquet, at which Martha served. Lazarus was one of those at table with him. Mary brought a pound of costly perfume made from genuine aromatic nard, with which she anointed Jesus' feet. Then she dried his feet with her hair, and the house was filled with the ointment's fragrance. Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one about to hand him over), protested: "Why was not this perfume sold? It could have brought three hundred silver pieces, and the money have been given to the poor." (He did not say this out of concern for the poor, but because he was a thief. He held the purse, and used to help himself to what was deposited there.) To this Jesus replied: "Leave her alone. Let her keep it against the day they prepare me for burial. The poor you always have with you, but me you will not always have." The great crowd of Jews discovered he was there and came out, not only because of Jesus but also to see Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. The fact was, the chief priests planned to kill Lazarus too. Because many Jews were going over to Jesus and believing in him on account of Lazarus.

The next day the great crowd that had come for the feast heard that Jesus was to enter Jerusalem, so they got palm branches and came out to meet him. They kept shouting: "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the King of Israel!" Jesus found a donkey and mounted it, in accord with Scripture: "Fear not, O daughter of Zion! Your king approaches you on a donkey's colt." (At first, the disciples did not understand all this, but after Jesus was glorified they recalled that the people had done to him precisely what had been written about him.) The crowd that was present when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead kept testifying to it. The crowd came out to meet him because they heard he had performed this sign.

Instead of "It is truly...": O my soul, magnify Christ who is seated on a foal.

Наступного дня сила людей, що прийшли на свято, зачувши, що Ісус іде в Єрусалим, узяли пальмове гілля й вийшли йому назустріч з окликами: «Осанна! Благословен той, хто йде в ім'я Господне, ізраїльський цар!» І знайшовши осля, Ісус сів на нього, — як ото написано: Не страхайся, дочко Сіону, ось іде твій цар верхи на жереб'яті ослициному. Не збагнули того спершу його учні, але коли Ісус прославився, згадали вони, що то було написано про нього й що то з ним таке вчинено. Але й народ, що був при ньому, коли то він був викликав Лазаря з гробу та його з мертвих воскресив, — про те свідчив. Тим то, власне, народ і вийшов йому назустріч: довідався бо, що він учинив те чудо.

If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.

<u>Pastoral and Sacramental Ministry:</u> Baptisms: by appointment. Marriages: six months' notice should be given to the parish priest, and he should be contacted before any other arrangements are made. Reconciliation: by appointment. Holy Communion: for the sick, by appointment, any time. Holy Unction (Anointing of the Sick): Those anticipating surgery, hospitalization or treatments and who would like to receive anointing (by appointment, any time). Funerals and Memorials: by appointment.



Ukrainian Catholic Easter Traditions

For many Ukrainians, Easter would not be Easter without the traditional Easter Basket. Going back in time we discover that in our tradition, Lent used to be a time of strict fasting and abstaining from meat, eggs and dairy products for the whole season. To show joy and thanksgiving at the end of Lent, the faithful took foods to be blessed at the Easter Morning Divine Liturgy and, bringing it home, the entire family shared it to "Break-the-Fast". The first food to "Break-the-Fast" was the blessed egg.

Eggs are a sign of hope and resurrection. Jesus comes from the tomb as the chick breaks the shell at birth. Because of the special meaning, it is fitting that the eggs should be decorated with symbols of Easter, and blessed.

Meats and Sausage represent the animals used for sacrifices in the Old Testament. They remind us of Christ who, in the New Testament, as a Lamb, sacrificed him- self on the cross for our salvation. The sausage represents the links of the chains of death, which Christ broke by His Resurrection.

Paska (Easter Bread) is symbolic of Jesus who said: "I am the Bread of Life". He gives Himself as food in the Eucharist saying: "Whoever eats of this Bread will have life everlasting".

Horseradish represents the bitter herbs prescribed in the original Passover Meal as a reminder of the bitterness of life in the captivity of Egypt. Today it reminds us of the bitterness of Christ's Passion, the pains of crucifixion by which He entered into the glory of Resurrection.

Salt is the symbol of perseverance of faith, according to the words of Christ: "You are the salt of the earth" (Mt. 5:13) **Cheese and Butter** are related to prosperity, abundance and peace in the Promised Land. They remind us of the abundance of graces and peace granted to us by the Risen Christ.

All the foods were traditionally blessed in church early Easter Morning following the Divine Liturgy... Each basket should have a lighted candle as a symbol of the radiance of the Resurrected Christ, who said: "I am the Light of the World" (Jn. 8:12).

2023 PASTORAL LETTER OF THE UKRAINIAN CATHOLIC BISHOPS OF CANADA ON THE OCCASION OF THE FEAST OF

THE RESURRECTION OF OUR LORD

To the Reverend Fathers, Religious Sisters, Venerable Monastics, Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

"Were not our hearts burning inside...

It is true. Our Lord is risen!"

(Luke 24:32&34)

Christ is Risen!

Dearly Beloved in Christ!

Following the ancient tradition, our Church invited us to more intense prayer, penance and charity during the forty days of the Great Fast. This was not a forced imposition to make us sad or irritable. Rather, it was an invitation to transformation. It was a challenge to change our hearts, purify our souls and improve ourselves in order that we would be truly worthy to meet and enjoy the glorious Feast of our Lord's Holy Resurrection.

Just prior to that first glorious Easter morning, there was betrayal, loneliness, suffering, passion and death. Faith was displaced by fear and sadness in the apostles and disciples of Christ. Their hope was buried in the tomb. The seemingly last act of love was the weeping women going to the tomb to anoint the body of Jesus.

Let us recall the event at Emmaus. Two disheartened disciples, Cleopas and Luke, talk sadly along the way about Jesus' passion and death. Unknown to them, our Lord joins them on the road and explains all those things that had to happen. Later, at the "breaking of bread", the two disciples recognized the Risen Jesus, and as the Gospel tells us, "They said to one another, 'Were not our hearts burning inside us as He talked to us on the road and explained the Scriptures to us?'" They rush back to meet the other disciples and are greeted with the joyous news, "It is true. The Lord is risen." (Lk. 24: 32 & 34)

During this whole period of Great Fast preparation, our Church led us gradually to these astonishing Gospel passages announcing the Resurrection of our Lord, God and Savior Jesus Christ. And every time we hear this "good news" our hearts should burn inside us as we marvel at all these things that were done for our salvation. We cannot remain silent. We cannot just whisper it. We have to shout it out! Not just you and I, but everyone, the whole Church: Christ is risen! Truly He is risen!

The Resurrection of Christ is the greatest proof of God's love for us. Just like the disciples, we too realize that there is no Resurrection without suffering and the cross. Jesus wanted to suffer, die and rise from the dead for our sakes. Christ's victory over death is also our victory because we have been baptized into His death and shall rise with Him in glory. We live according to Christ's Gospel anticipating His blessings and eternal life.

The Resurrection of Christ validates everything He taught and did during His early mission. Faith in the Resurrection leads to life. Our faith in Easter goes beyond the tomb. Yes, we kiss the burial shroud with tears in our eyes. These tears of sadness are transformed into tears of gladness because of our faith in the Risen Christ. Our Lord lives.

We do not just read about the Resurrection once a year or celebrate Easter merely as a historical event. In times of uncertainty, confusion, helplessness and need of protection, we rush to the empty tomb and witness the love that conquered death. This faith has meaning for us today and every day of our lives. Christ's Resurrection is reflected in our lives every time we choose life over death; when we prefer light to darkness; when we choose a life of grace rather than a life of sin; when we put love where there is hatred and indifference and when we choose peace over discord and war.

Particularly today we need to demonstrate this faith to everyone - together, in churches, at our Easter meals, and say, "It is true, Christ is risen!" Just like the two disciples at Emmaus, Mary Magdalene and the myrrh-bearing women, Peter and John and the unbelieving Thomas, we proclaim: "Are not our hearts burning inside us ... It is true! Our Lord is risen!" (Lk. 24: 32 & 34).

There is no doubt that Christ's resurrection constitutes the greatest and most important feast in our Church's calendar. It is the Feast of Feasts, the Holy Day of Holy Days. However, it is possible that not everyone in our congregations will be able to

go to their parish church or be home for Easter because they were destroyed or had to flee from it because of the war. Not everyone may be able to share with their loved ones the traditional Easter dinner and the joy of Easter. If you know someone who has no family or relatives close by, please invite them to come to church for Easter worship and then to your home for a meal of paska and other blessed foods. No one should be home alone this Easter! The ongoing war is not an excuse for self-isolation, self-pity and fear. We are people who believe in the Resurrection of Christ, a people of hope and light even in times of darkness. Faith gives strength, perseverance and endurance. Christ has conquered our greatest enemy - death, and we prevail over the powers of evil, all visible and invisible enemies with His help.

On this joyous, solemn and glorious Feast of Easter, we want to assure you of our prayers for great joy, abundant grace, good health and success in your daily struggles for the good of our families, beloved nations of Canada and Ukraine, and Christ's Church. Let us be grateful for Almighty God's great love for us and all His generous gifts.

May the abundant blessings of the Risen Christ and His promise of peace and eternal life be yours today and always!

Христос Воскрес!

Дорогі у Христі!

За давньою традицією наша Церква знову закликала нас до більш ревної молитви, покаяння та милосердя протягом сорока днів Великого посту. Це не було примусовим нав'язуванням, щоб зробити нас сумними чи дратівливими. Швидше, це було запрошення до перетворення. Це потрібно сприйняти як виклик до зміни нашого серця, очистити наші душі та самовдосконалення, щоб ми справді стали готовими та гідними зустріти світле і величне свято Святого Воскресіння нашого Господа Ісуса Христа.

Напередодні того першого великоднього ранку були зрада, самотність, страждання, пристрасть і смерть. Віра була витіснена страхом і сумом в апостолів та учнів Христа. Їхня надія була похована в гробниці. Здавалося б, останнім актом любові був прихід заплаканих жінок, які йшли до гробу, щоб помазати тіло Ісуса.

Згадаймо подію, яка сталася в Емаусі. Двоє засмучених учнів, Клеопа та Лука, дорогою сумно розповідають про страждання та смерть Ісуса. Невідомо їм, наш Господь приєднується до них у дорозі та пояснює все те, що мало статися. Пізніше, під час «ламання хліба», два учні впізнали Воскреслого Ісуса, і, як розповідає нам Євангеліє, «вони сказали один одному: «Чи не горіло в нас серце, коли Він розмовляв з нами в дорозі і пояснював Писання для нас?» Вони поспішають назад, щоб зустріти інших учнів, і їх вітають радісною новиною: «Чи не палало наше серце в нас у грудях... Христос справді воскрес!» (Лк. 24: 32 і 34).

Протягом приготування у часі Великого посту наша Церква поступово вела нас до цих дивовижних євангельських уривків, які сповіщають про Воскресіння нашого Господа, Бога і Спасителя Ісуса Христа. І кожного разу, коли ми чуємо цю «добру новину», наші серця повинні горіти всередині нас, і дивуємося всьому тому, що було зроблено для нашого спасіння. Ми не можемо мовчати. Ми не можемо просто прошепотіти це. Ми повинні чим дужче голосити! Не тільки ми з вами, але всі, уся Церква: Христос Воскрес! Воістину воскрес!

Воскресіння Христове є найбільшим доказом Божої любові до нас. Подібно до учнів, ми теж усвідомлюємо, що немає Воскресіння без страждань і хреста. Ісус хотів постраждати, померти і воскреснути з мертвих заради нас. Перемога Христа над смертю є також нашою перемогою, тому що ми охристилися в Його смерть і воскреснемо з Ним у славі. Ми живемо Христовим Євангелієм, очікуючи Його благословень і вічного життя.

Воскресіння Христа підтверджує все, чого Він навчав і робив, перебуваючи з нами. Віра у Воскресіння веде до життя. Наша віра у воскресіння виходить за межі гробу. Так, ми зі сльозами на очах цілуємо плащаницю. Але сьогодні ці сльози смутку перетворюються на сльози радості через нашу віру у Воскреслого Христа. Наш Господь живий.

Ми читаємо про Воскресіння не тільки раз на рік або святкуємо Великдень просто як історичну подію. У часи невизначеності, розгубленості, безпорадності та потреби захисту ми поспішаємо до порожньої гробниці й стаємо свідками Любові, яка перемогла смерть. Ця віра має значення для нас сьогодні і кожного дня нашого життя. Воскресіння Христове відображається в нашому житті кожного разу, коли ми обираємо життя, а не смерть; коли ми віддаємо перевагу світлу перед темрявою; коли ми обираємо життя в благодаті, а не життя в гріху; коли ми ставимо любов там, де є ненависть і байдужість, і коли ми обираємо мир замість розбрату та війни.

Особливо сьогодні ми маємо демонструвати цю віру всім і разом - в товаристві, у церквах, під час пасхальних трапез і говорити: «Воістину Христос воскрес!» Подібно до двох учнів в Еммаусі, Марії Магдалини та жінок-мироносиць, Петра та Івана та невіруючого Фоми, ми проголошуємо: «Чи не палало наше серце в нас у грудях... Христос справді воскрес!» (Лк. 24: 32 і 34).

Без сумніву, Воскресіння Христове є найбільшим і найважливішим святом у календарі нашої Церкви. Це торжество всіх торжеств та свято всіх свят. Однак можливо, що не всі в наших парафіях зможуть піти до своєї парафіяльної церкви або бути в рідній хаті на Великдень, тому що вони були зруйновані або змушені були втекти через війну. Можливо, не кожен зможе розділити зі своїми близькими традиційний великодній обід та радість Великодня. Якщо ви знаєте когось, у кого немає родини чи родичів, запросіть їх прийти до церкви на пасхальне богослужіння, а потім до свого дому поділитися смачною паскою та іншою освяченою їжею. На Великдень ніхто не повинен бути вдома сам! Війна, яка триває, не є приводом для самоізоляції, жалю себе та страху. Ми є людьми, які вірять у Воскресіння Христове, людьми надії та світла навіть у темряві. Віра надає силу, наполегливість і витривалість. Христос переміг нашого найбільшого ворога — смерть, і ми з Його допомогою переможемо сили зла, усіх видимих і невидимих ворогів.

У цей радісний, урочистий та світлий празник Воскресіння Христового ми хочемо запевнити вас у своїх молитвах, просячи Всемилостивого Господа великої радості, рясних ласк і благодаті, міцного здоров'я та успіху у щоденних змаганнях для добра ваших сімей, улюблених народів Канади та України, і Христової Церкви. Будьмо вдячні за велику любов Всемогутнього Бога до нас і всі Його щедрі дари.

Нехай Воскреслий Господь Ісус Христос благословить вас усіх і Його обітниця миру та вічного життя будуть вашими сьогодні і завжди!


