

Epistle: A reading from the Acts of the Apostles' (Acts 2:1-11)

When the day of Pentecost came it found the Apostles gathered in one place. Suddenly from up in the sky there came a noise like a strong, driving wind which was heard all through the house where they were seated. Tongues as of fire appeared, which parted and came to rest on each of them. All were filled with the Holy Spirit. They began to express themselves in foreign tongues and make bold proclamation as the Spirit prompted them. Staying in Jerusalem at the time were devout Jews of every nation under heaven. These heard the sound, and assembled in a large crowd. They were much confused because each one heard these men speaking his own language. The whole occurrence astonished them. They asked in utter amazement, "Are not all of these men who are speaking Galileans? How is it that each of us hears them in his native tongue? We are Parthians, Medes, and Elamites. We live in Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus, the province of Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt, and the regions of Libya around Cyrene. There are even visitors from Rome – all Jews, or those who have come over to Judaism; Cretans and Arabs too. Yet each of us hears them speaking in his own tongue about the marvels God has accomplished."

Alleluia (Tone 1): By the Lord's word the heavens were established, and by the Breath of His mouth all their host (*Ps* 32:6). The Lord has looked down from heaven and beheld the whole human race (*Ps* 32:13).

Gospel: (John 7:37-52; 8:12)

At that time, on the last and greatest day of the festival, Jesus stood up and cried out: "If anyone thirsts, let him come to me; let him drink who believes in me. Scripture has it: 'From within him rivers of living water shall flow." (Here he was referring to the Spirit, whom those that came to believe in him were to receive. There was, of course, no Spirit as yet, since Jesus had not yet been glorified.) Some in the crowd who heard these words began to say, "This must be the Prophet." Others were claiming, "He is the Messiah." But an objection was raised: "Surely the Messiah is not to come from Galilee? Does not Scripture say that the Messiah, being of David's family, is to come from Bethlehem, the village where David lived?" In this fashion the crowd was sharply divided over him. Some of them even wanted to apprehend him. However, no one laid hands on him.

When the temple guards came back, the chief priests and Pharisees asked them, "Why did you not bring him in?" "No man ever spoke like that before," the guards replied. "Do not tell us you too have been taken in!" the Pharisees retorted. "You do not see any of the Sanhedrin believing in him, do you? Or the Pharisees? Only this lot, that knows nothing about the law – and they are lost anyway!"



One of their own number, Nicodemus (the man who had come to him), spoke up to say, "Since when does our law condemn any man without first hearing him and knowing the facts?" "Do not tell us you are a Galilean too," they taunted him. "Look it up. You will not find the Prophet coming from Galilee."

Jesus spoke to them once again: "I am the light of the world. No follower of mine shall ever walk in darkness; no, he shall possess the light of life."

Instead of "It is truly...": **O my soul, glorify The One Divinity in Three Persons.** Irmos (Tone 4): Rejoice, O Queen, boast of virgins and mothers, for every tongue, though capable and eloquent, cannot hymn you as is your due, and every mind is confounded in seeking to comprehend the way in which you gave birth. Wherefore with one accord we magnify you.

Communion Verse: Your good Spirit will lead me to the land of righteousness (Ps 142:10). Alleluia! (3x)

<u>Апостол:</u> 3 книги Діянь Святих Апостолів читання (<u>Дн 2:1-11</u>)

Тими днями, як настав день П'ятидесятниці, всі вони були вкупі на тім самім місці. Аж ось роздався зненацька з неба шум, неначе подув буйного вітру, і сповнив увесь дім, де вони сиділи. Останнього ж великого дня свята стояв lcyc i закликав на ввесь голос: «Коли спраглий хтось, нехай прийде до мене i п'є! Хто вірує в мене, як Писання каже, то ріки води живої з нутра його потечуть!» Так він про Духа казав, що його мали прийняти ті, які увірували в нього. Не прийшов був ще Дух Святий, бо lcyc не був ще прославлений. Численні ж з народу, вчувши ті слова, казали: «Він дійсно пророк.» Інші ж: «Він – Христос.» Ще інші: «Чи з Галилеї Христос прийде? Хіба в Писанні не сказано, ще з роду Давидового Христос прийде, з села Вифлеєму, звідки був Давид?» І роздор виник ізза нього серед народу. Бажали і схопити його деякі, та ніхто не наклав рук на нього. Повернулись, отже, слуги до первосвящеників та фарисеїв, а ті питають їх: «Чому не привели його?» Слуги ж відказують: «Ніколи чоловік не говорив так, як цей чоловік говорить.» Фарисеї ж: «Чи й не ви дали себе звести? Невже хтось із старшини або фарисеїв увірував



у нього? Та проклятий той народ, що закону не знає!» Але озвавсь до них Никодим, що приходив до нього вночі, а був же один з них: «Чи дозволяє наш закон засуджувати чоловіка, не вислухавши його спершу та й не довідавшися, що він робить?» Ті ж йому: «Чи і ти з Галилеї? Розвідайся, то й побачиш: з Галилеї пророк не приходить.» І ще промовляв до них Ісус, і так їм казав: «Я – світло світу. Хто йде за мною, не блукатиме у темряві, а матиме світло життя.»

Sadly, the war is ongoing, and we are witnessing a new escalation stage. According to international organizations, about 18 million people in Ukraine today need emergency humanitarian assistance. His Beatitude Sviatoslav, Father and Head of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church, said this on the 66th week of Russia's full-scale war against Ukraine.

The Primate noted that in recent days, the number of overnight missile strikes on the homeland, particularly in Kyiv, has increased dramatically.

"We believe your voice will save hundreds of civilian lives. But let the world know that Ukraine is standing, Ukraine is fighting, Ukraine is praying!" the spiritual leader emphasized.

He noted that the 94th session of the Synod of Bishops of the UGCC was held at the Marian Center "Zarvanytsia" these days. At this synodal meeting, the members of the Synod reviewed, in particular, the humanitarian situation in Ukraine.

According to the head of the Synod, the problems will only increase in the coming months. "First, the need to help people with food is increasing. And we are putting in our efforts to feed the hungry and give water to the thirsty," said the Primate.

According to him, the second major humanitarian problem is children as the most vulnerable social group. Today, thousands of children have stopped studying and have no opportunity to continue their school education. Therefore, it can become a tremendous humanitarian problem.

The Head of the UGCC also thanked the Holy Father Francis for his willingness to support a peaceful plan to resolve the enormous Ukrainian problem during a meeting with our President Volodymyr Zelenskyy.

"The ten-point peace plan that Ukraine is offering today is, in fact, ten types of humanitarian or other crises that require an immediate response. Therefore, the peace plan of our President is ten elements necessary for the survival of the Ukrainian people, ranging from security issues to meeting the basic needs of our people," said His Beatitude Sviatoslav.

The Primate reminded that the UGCC is the Mother Church of its people. "She has always been and will be with her people, serving as their voice before the powerful of this world, feeding her people, healing their wounds, doing everything possible so that they can live — live in God, live life to the fullest," the spiritual leader said.

We are longing for light. The enemy came to our land as a thief to kill and destroy. However, Ukrainians have shown themselves to be deeply faithful people who, born in the waters of the Dnipro, are renewed in that life in Christ every day, defend Kyiv today, and shine the light of their faith to the whole world. Today we confess in the face of the godless world that the baptismal water of the Dnipro and our Ukrainian land, which we defend at the cost of our lives, is not a source of corruption and death but it carries and transmits to us the germ of eternal life through the power of God's word, which we now hear in our churches.



The Father and Head of the UGCC, His Beatitude Sviatoslav, emphasized this on the Sunday of the Blind Man during his sermon at the Liturgy celebrated in the Patriarchal House in Lviv.

In his sermon, the Head of the UGCC emphasized that today's reading and the two previous Sundays accentuate one of the biblical symbols — water. Everything we hear in the Gospel today revolves around the central event of washing, which Christ commands the blind man to do.

The preacher highlighted the significance of the great deed of God resulting in Christ's doing. By the ritual of healing the blind man, he explained, Christ accomplishes the act of re-creating man.

The new creation a person receives in the waters of baptism gives them a new life task to fulfill in the world. "The one who has emerged from the baptismal waters is sent into the world to profess faith in the One who has revived him. And thus, to shine with the light that he saw not only with his physical eyes but with the eyes of his faith," the preacher emphasized.

His Beatitude Sviatoslav reminded us that we also honor the memory of St. John the Evangelist today, who gave us the lifegiving words we hear and reflect on.

According to him, John wrote them to us so that we could understand that what Christ did to the blind man, this God's deed, has no ending in space and time. The light continues to shine. The Gospel of Christ continues to be preached in the world. The Sacrament of Baptism continues to be open to all people.

The Head of the UGCC noted that today, amid war, when Ukrainians still see death, destruction, and darkness around them, they are already thinking about revival and reconstruction. "We are longing for light," he said.

"May the Lord God renew all of us by the power of the Holy Spirit in our Christian life and vocation so that each of us may see the present Christ speaking to us on the roads of life: 'You have now seen him; in fact, he is the one speaking with you' (John 9, 37–38). You are listening to the word of Christ today. And we said in response: 'Lord, I believe!' and worshiped Him," His Beatitude Sviatoslav wished.
