# Liturgical propers in English language:

Liturgical Instruction: After the priest exclaims "Blessed is the Kingdom" and we have responded "Amen," the clergy sing the following Troparion once and the people repeat it. Then the clergy sing the first half, and we conclude it. This is done every day until the Wednesday before Ascension Thursday. Christ is risen from the dead, conquering death by death, and to those in the tombs He granted life. (3x)

Troparion (*Tone 4*): When the disciples of the Lord learned from the angel the glorious news of the resurrection and cast off the ancestral condemnation, they proudly told the apostles: "Death has been plundered! Christ our God is risen, granting to the world great mercy."

**Epistle**: A reading from the Acts of the Apostles' (Acts 11:19-26, 29-30)



In those days, those in the community who had been dispersed by the persecution that arose because of Stephen went as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus and Antioch, making the message known to none but Jews. However, some men of Cyprus and Cyrene among them who had come to Antioch began to talk even to the Greeks, announcing the good news of the Lord Jesus to them. The hand of the Lord was with them and a great number of them believed and were converted to the Lord. News of this eventually reached the ears of the church in Jerusalem, resulting in the sending of Barnabas to Antioch. On his arrival he rejoiced to see the evidence of God's favor. He encouraged them all to remain firm in their commitment to the Lord, since he himself was a good man filled with the Holy Spirit and faith. Thereby large numbers were added to the Lord. Then Barnabas went off to Tarsus to look for Saul; once he had found him, he brought him back to Antioch. For a whole year they met with the church and instructed great numbers. It was in Antioch that the disciples were called Christians for the first time.

At about that time, certain prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch. One of them named Agabus was inspired to stand up and proclaim that there was going to be a severe famine all over the world. (It did in fact occur while Claudius was emperor.) This made the disciples determined to set something aside, each according to his means, and send it to the relief of the brothers who lived in Judea. They did this, dispatching it to presbyters in the care of Barnabas and Saul.

**Alleluia** (Tone 4): Poise yourself and advance in triumph and reign in the cause of truth, and meekness, and justice (Ps 44:5). You have loved justice and hated iniquity (Ps 44:8).

### **Gospel** (John 4:5-42)

At that time Jesus came to a Samaritan town named Shechem, near the plot of land which Jacob had given to his son Joseph. This was the site of Jacob's well. Jesus, tired from his journey, sat down at the well. The jour was about noon. When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." (His disciples had gone off to town to buy provisions.) The Samaritan woman said to him, "You are a Jew. How can you ask me, a Samaritan and a woman, for a drink?" (Recall that Jews have nothing to do with Samaritans.) Jesus replied: "If only you recognized God's gift, and who it is that is asking you for a drink, you would have asked him instead, and he would have given you living water." "Sir," she challenged him, "you do not have a bucket and this well is deep. Where do you expect to get this flowing water? Surely you do not pretend to be greater than our ancestor Jacob, who gave us this well and drank from it with his sons and his flocks?" Jesus replied: "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again. But whoever drinks the water I give him will never be thirsty; no, the water I give shall become a fountain within him, leaping up to provide eternal life." The woman said to him, "Give me this water, sir, so that I shall not grow thirsty and have to keep coming here to draw water."

He said to her, "Go, call your husband, and then come back here." "I have no husband," replied the woman. "You are right in saying you have no husband!" Jesus exclaimed. "The fact is, you have had five, and the man you are living with now is not your husband. What you said is true." "Sir," answered the woman, "I can see you are a prophet. Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain, but you people claim that Jerusalem is the place where men ought to worship God." Jesus told her: "Believe me, woman, an hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You people worship what you do not understand, while we understand what we worship; after all, salvation is from the Jews. Yet an hour is coming, and is already here, when authentic worshipers will worship the Father in Spirit and truth. Indeed, it is just such worshipers the Father seeks. God is Spirit, and those who worship him must worship in Spirit and truth."

The woman said to him: "I know there is a Messiah coming. (This term means Anointed.) When he comes, he will tell us everything." Jesus replied, "I who speak to you am he."

His disciples, returning at this point, were surprised that Jesus was speaking with a woman. No one put a question, however, such as "What do you want of him?" or "Why are you talking with her?" The woman then left her water jar and went off into the town. She said to the people: "Come and see someone who told me everything I ever did! Could this not be the Messiah?" At that they set out from the town to meet him.

Meanwhile the disciples were urging him, "Rabbi, eat something." But he told them: "I have food to eat of which you do not know." At this the disciples said to one another, "Do you suppose that someone has brought him something to eat?" Jesus explained to them: "Doing the will of him who sent me and bringing his work to completion in my food. Do you not have a saying: 'Four months more and it will be harvest!'? Listen to what I say: "Open your eyes and see! The fields are shining for harvest! The reaper already collects his wages and gathers a yield for eternal life, that sower and reaper may rejoice together. Here we have the saying verified: 'One man sows; another reaps.' I sent you to reap what you had not worked for. Others have done the labor, and you have come into their gain."

Many Samaritans from that town believed in him on the strength of the woman's word of testimony: "He told me everything I ever did." The result was that, when these Samaritans came to him, they begged him to stay with them awhile. So he stayed there two more days, and through his own spoken word many more came to faith. As they told the woman: "No longer does our faith depend on your story. We have heard for ourselves, and we know that this really is the Savior of the world."

Instead of "It is truly...": **The Angel cried out to the One full of Grace: O chaste Virgin, rejoice!** And again I say, Rejoice! Your Son has risen from the tomb on the third day, and raised the dead. Let all people rejoice!

Апостол: З книги Діянь Святих Апостолів читання (Дн. 11:19-26; 29-30)

Тими днями апостоли, що були розсипалися через гоніння з приводу Стефана, досягли аж до Фінікії, Кіпру та й Антіохії, нікому не проповідуючи слова, крім юдеїв. Були ж між ними деякі мужі з Кіпру та з Кирени, які прийшли в Антіохію та промовляли й до греків, благовіствуючи їм Господа Ісуса. Рука Господня була з ними, і велике число було тих, що увірували й навернулись до Господа. Чутка про це дійшла до вух Церкви, що в Єрусалимі, і вони вислали Варнаву в Антіохію. Коли він прийшов і побачив ласку Божу, зрадів і підбадьорив усіх триматися Господа рішучим серцем, бо він був чоловік добрий, повний Святого Духа та віри. І пристало багато людей до Господа. Тоді (Варнава) вирушив у Тарс розшукати Савла і, знайшовши, привів його в Антіохію. Вони збирались цілий рік у церкві й силу людей навчали. В Антіохії вперше учнів називано християнами. Тож учні, кожний з них по спромозі, ухвалили послати братам, що жили в і Юдеї, допомогу; що й зробили, пославши її старшим через руки Варнави і Савла.

#### **Євангеліє**: (Ів. 4, 5-42)

У той час прибув Ісус до одного міста в Самарії, яке називається Сихар, неподалеку поля, наданого Яковом синові своєму Йосифові. Там і криниця Яковова була. Натомився з дороги Ісус, тож і присів біля криниці; було ж під шосту годину. Надходить же жінка з Самарії води взяти. Ісус до неї каже: «Дай мені напитися.» Учні ж його пішли були до міста харчів купити. Отож каже до нього жінка самарянка: «Юдей єси, а просиш напитися в мене, жінки самарянки?» Не мають бо зносин юдеї з самарянами. 

SPIRIT OF CHRISTIAN AWARENESS: Dear parishioners, if our brother or sister in Christ, who usually sits next to you, is not in the Church today, please phone him / her and ask how he / she is doing. Let him or her know that our parish community misses his or her at the church very much and prays for them daily! We also pray for the people of Ukraine, that with the help of the Holy Spirit, they may obtain social peace, political harmony and economic stability: Lord, hear us and have mercy.

Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion: You are a member of the Catholic Church (faithful of the Orthodox churches are very welcome to receive Holy Communion); 2) You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; 3) You attend Divine Services regularly; 4) Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; 5) You have kept the Liturgical fast – no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). 6) You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel. 7) To the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace. If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.

<u>Pastoral and Sacramental Ministry:</u> Baptisms: by appointment. Marriages: six months' notice should be given to the parish priest, and he should be contacted before any other arrangements are made. Reconciliation: by appointment. Holy Communion: for the sick, by appointment, any time. Holy Unction (Anointing of the Sick): Those anticipating surgery, hospitalization or treatments and who would like to receive anointing (by appointment, any time). Funerals and Memorials: by appointment.

SUNDAY CATECHISM SCHOOL: "And they were bringing to Him also the infants, in order that He may be touching them; but after the disciples saw it, they rebuked them. But Jesus called them to Himself and said, Let alone the little children to come to Me, and cease hindering them; for of such is the kingdom of God." (Matthew 19:14)

We welcome all children to our Dormition of the Mother of God Parish Catechism program. The children will learn about their Christian orthodox faith in the Catholic Church, sacred scripture, feast days, icons, tradition, singing, religious practices and customs of the Ukrainian Catholic Church.

Ukrainian - speaking volunteers are needed for children, ages 4 to 6. These children come with so much enthusiasm and joy' but they do need more supervision and attention. If we can have several people volunteer, they can take turns helping. Your help would be appreciated very much!! Materials will be provided for the children.

While the hall is undergoing renovations, we will have a short catechism lesson (10 to 15 minutes) in the Church and sometimes in the choir loft. # We Lament the Degradation of Church Life in Russia: Head of the UGCC in the 114 week of war

To all those who echo the clichés of Moscow's propaganda, we assert: where the Russian occupier comes, dignity and freedom, especially religious freedom, disappear. His Beatitude Sviatoslav, the Father and Head of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church, said this on the 114<sup>th</sup> week of the great war that Russia brought to our peaceful Ukrainian land.

The Primate noted that the war has been raging in Ukraine for 11 years, claiming new lives every day. This week was again marked by the tremendous crimes of Russians against humanity on Ukrainian soil.

The Head of the Church expressed gratitude to all rescuers, paramedics, and doctors who save human life: "We were deeply moved by the words of the Chernihiv paramedic who, pulling out the wounded body of the boy, prayed loudly to the Lord God, pleading for his life. Once again, we express our sincere gratitude to those who save the lives of Ukrainians and proclaim to the whole world the words that are familiar to everyone, but so important to us: Ukraine stands! Ukraine fights! Ukraine prays!"

His Beatitude Sviatoslav emphasized that religious representatives in Ukraine carefully listen to everything said by state leaders and politicians of certain countries about Ukraine.

"This week, Christians, Jews and Muslims of Ukraine," the spiritual leader noted, "were appalled by the words of some American congressmen who believe that the Russian leader is defending Christian values in the modern world. They claim that Russia is now almost the last stronghold of traditional values, the Church, particularly in Ukraine."

His Beatitude Sviatoslav stated that a return to the Soviet methods of influencing the Church, which Russia is currently exerting, would mean slavery for the Church, regardless of denomination, for any religious community.

"We, the Greek Catholics," he added, "remember well when in the Soviet Union we were deprived of legal status and existed in the catacombs, we were the largest public opposition to the Soviet regime in the twentieth century."

"Occupying Ukrainian lands," says the Head of the Church, "Russia primarily destroys religious freedom. More than 600 churches of various denominations were destroyed in the occupied territories."

According to him, the Russian Orthodox Church is ceasing to be a church, turning into a part of the state machine with peculiar religious decorations.



The Primate explained that the Russian Orthodox Church first labels the collective event as satanic and declares a metaphysical war against it. Subsequently, it attempts to justify crimes, murders, and violence against Christians, including the Ukrainian people, promising eternal life and absolution for their atrocities committed in Ukraine. We have recently learned that this war, initially termed the national liberation war of the Russian people, has now been declared sacred.

"So, the one who presents himself as the last defender of the Church and traditional Christian values becomes a blasphemer. For by calling the war sacred, he commits a crime not only against man but against the Lord God — he commits an act of sacrilege," His Beatitude Sviatoslav summarized.

The Head of the UGCC thanked those who have the courage to confront the truth, which liberates and without which there is no justice, no true freedom, neither in Ukraine nor in Europe, North America, nor any other country in the world.
